

Dear Family and Friends,

Another year almost gone and what a year! 1982 will not be forgotten easily - inflation, depression, high interest rates, unemployment, bankruptcy coming at us from all sides. It was a good year to have a hobby to get away into every once in a while!

Unfortunately the economy forced long hours at work with plenty of weekends thrown in to make a go at business this year, so once again the research has had to take a back seat. My goals had to be trimmed to keeping up with the indexing of miscellaneous material received from day to day with Pearl Olsen's material at a halt at page 435. Any extra time has been taken up with the 1981 updates of the International Genealogical Index, another 108 pages of which were donated to the files by Richard Price for Pearl Olsen. There also two packages of material from Richard Price that I have not even been able to get to yet. I should point out that the 1981 updates of the I.G.I are really terrific as they include a lot of the Non-conformist registers and have filled a lot of missing information, particularly on the Devon families and those of Nottingham where the Non-conformist registers go back to the 1600's. I have made it to Yorkshire so will soon have all the updates completed as I felt they had top priority. Anyone who hasn't looked through the I.G.I. for a couple of years is well advised to as nearly 75% of all English Parish Registers have now been included. The L.D.S. section of our files now has 204 pages of notes.

My goals for the coming year are to attempt our first set of computer records, namely the conversion to computer of the marriage records. We have had a very kind donation of funds to help in the purchase of computer equipment, from Mrs. Joan Whitlock De Angeli of New Jersey but unfortunately I have not yet been able to find a program that will suit our needs that I can use on the Apple II computer. I have started a computer club at the B.C.G.S. as I have now had two meetings and hopefully great things will come of it. In fact I now have the program I want to start with and hope to begin once I can convert it to Apple II language. Anyway our thanks Mrs. De Angeli as I am sure the results of her donation will be far reaching.

You will see in my 1982 Additions a letter listed announcing the passing of May McSweeney and her brother Rex Whitlock. A very sad addition to the files indeed as May was one of the people I wrote to in 1969 when I first started this research and we visited several times while Susan and I lived in England. A very remarkable person for and impressionable twenty year old to meet on first going to live in England. One of the few "European" I ever met, she will be sadly missed by both family and friends. Sad also as I have just recently come across quite a bit about May's ancestor Henry Whitlock, Coachbuilder, son of Robert & Charlotte Whitlock, son of John Whitlock and Dorothy Jackson. (m 1748).

Actually 1982 has been a good year for additions, witness the fact it took me over one and one-half pages just to list them. One of the reasons I like to send out the additions lists each

year is so any of you who notice something that might be of interest to you can request a copy. Please do not hesitate to do so as I am more than willing to provide copies for anyone.

One of my regrets this year is that I have been unable to take the time to write a few things for Thomas Roach's Whitlock Gleanings as I really think Tom is doing us a great service and I wish I could support it by more than just a subscription. I should write to more of the people to enter queries but time seems to preclude it for the time being. I do have the fear that my records have only touched the tip of a possible great iceberg of American information and too much looking will unearth a flood of information that I will be unable to handle at the moment. Anyway hopefully I will be able to be more supportive in the future. One comment I would like to make to subscribers of Tom's Newsletter relates to his offer to publish a collection of miscellaneous Whitlock material. I do feel that because everyone's research is so defined in area that most would be better served by the publication of my indexes rather than a lot of miscellaneous information but both are formidable undertakings and one is better than nothing. Myself I would rather pay a little more and see more of the material being drawn upon for the Newsletter. It sounds like Tom has built up a store of material to draw upon the next few years, something most Editors would envy. One of the ideas I had but had not approached Tom with was to do a couple of pages of the Marriage index as a pull out for each issue, building up to a book of Whitlock marriages, indexed chronologically. Any takers for a two year typing job? Maybe the computer will provide the answer? Food for thought anyway.

Well I can better close off for this year. Again thanks to all those of you who have kindly shared your findings with us. And to everyone hunting for that elusive Whit(e)lock(e) ancestor take heart - you never know what will turn up next year. Good luck.
