

WILLIAM WHITLOCK

THIS IS THE LAST WILL & Testament of me William Whitlock of Aldergate Street in the City of London & County of Middlesex a Liveryman I direct all my just debts funeral & testamentary expenses to be paid as soon after my decease as possible I do give & bequeath to my dearly beloved daughter Catherine Kay Whitlock the sum of one thousand pounds I also give & bequeath to my good friend Mr. John Kay the sum of one thousand pounds to dispose of as he may think fit & proper I do also appoint my dear wife Peggy Hills Whitlock to be my cosiduary legatee & bequeath to her the residue of my personal property whatsoever or wheresoever and lastly I do appoint my good friend Mr. John Kay to the Guardianship of my daughter Catherine Kay Whitlock & make ordain & appoint him the full & sole Executor to this my last will & Testament IN WITNESS whereof I have hereunto set my hand & seal this fifteenth day of August one thousand eight hundred & thirty two William Whitlock (LS) Signed sealed published & declared by the said William Whitlock the testator as & for his last will & testament in our presence who in his presence & the presence of each other subscribe our names as Witnesses hereto Willm Town 26 Convent Street Bond Street London Francis Sewell Webb 26 East Terrace Milton Gravesend

PROVED at London 30th Sept'r 1833 before the worshipful John Danbury Down(?) & was granted having been first sworn only to administer

Note: William Whitlock married Peggy Hills Town at St.Botolph Without Aldersgate, London June 27,1829. Their daughter Catherine Ann Whitlock was baptized at the same parish May 4, 1831.
