

# WHITLOCKS OF WINCHESTER, HANTS

Winchester, Hampshire appears to hold some of the clues to Whitlocks of Wokingham family. I assume it is the military connection that draws the family to this area as several of the references have military references.

These are the references to Winchester:

1. There are several marriages at St.Peter, Cheesehill, Winchester: Dec.3,1721 Peter Whitlok & Elizabeth Wilton; Aug.22,1727 John Whitlock & Elizabeth Martin; Jan.1845 Charles Gregory & Elizabeth Witlock; Sep.3,1749 Peter Whitelock & Mary Fry
2. George Frederick Whitelocke was baptized at St.Thomas, Winchester Dec.28,1804. He was the son of James Whitelocke b.1762, a Surgeon in the Dragoons. In 1803 James Whitelocke was made inspector of hospitals.
3. In her letter of May 25, 1994 Danielle James mentions that Robert Heriot Whitelocke was baptized in Winchester in 1809. Danielle also notes that two of Robert Heriot Whitelocke's children were baptized at Winchester 1828-1830. This is the R.H. Whitelocke, Professor Royal of Wurtemberg who wrote *Memoirs, Biographical and Historical, of Bulstrode Whitelocke* published in 1860 by Routledge, Warne, and Routledge.
4. 1812 Harriott the daughter of George & Sarah Whitelocke is baptized at St. Maurice, Winchester
5. Oct.12,1822 there is a marriage at St.Thomas, Winchester of Bulstrode Whitelock to Frances Parsons (by licence)
6. There is also James and Mary Whitlock having children in Winchester in the 1820's baptized in the Wesleyan chapel

While not overly revealing it is clear there is a connection to Winchester. Hopefully as additional information is uncovered we will better understand the role Winchester has played in this part of the family.
