

THE WHITLOCKS OF EALING, MIDDLESEX

I have received a copy (R1817) of a wonderful book called *The Whitlocks of Middlesex* from Howard P. Whitlock of New Zealand. The book was compiled by Alison Honeyfield of Evagean Publishing of behalf of Mrs. Carol Whitlock of Wanganui, New Zealand.

The book traces the descent from Mark Whitlock & Elizabeth Living who were married at Harefield, Middlesex, England October 26, 1772. This family is detailed in our chart WHITLOCK.43 **The Whitlocks of Ealing, London, England #2.** Of Mark & Elizabeth (Living) Whitlocks eight children we have only been able to trace descendants of two. We have the family of Mark & Frances (Otley) Whitlock who were married at Paddington in 1834. This Mark was a son of Mark & Elizabeth (Living) Whitlock's third child, John Whitlock b. 1778. The 1851 census shows Mark is a Mason living in St. Marylebone, London with his wife Frances and their four children. They are all born in St. Marylebone. Also living with this family is Mark's father John Whitlock age 72 born in Ealing.

All other ones we have traced descend from the eight child James Whitlock born April 19, 1793 in Ealing. James married Ann Worrall December 26, 1818 at St. George, Hanover Square, London. James and Ann lived in Ealing had their nine children were born there.

Several of the children emigrated to Australia and New Zealand. James Whitlock born 1824, a carpenter, is shown in Cape of Good Hope in 1848. February 7, 1853 James arrives in Australia on the "Maria Charlotte" from Port Elizabeth. November 12, 1853 James Whitlock and Margaret Davis are married at Collingwood, Victoria, Australia. James apparently spent time at the Victoria gold fields from 1858-1862 and was in Auckland, New Zealand from 1865-1873. James Whitlock died in Malvern, Victoria July 7, 1910. James & Margaret (Davis) Whitlock had ten children.

Frederick Whitlock born 1833 emigrated to New Zealand about 1863. He lived in Dunedin prior to settling in Wanganui. Frederick Whitlock was the founder of F. Whitlock & Sons Ltd. which every New Zealander will know as the manufacturer of pickles and sauces. Begun in 1877 several generations of this family ran the company until it closed in 1990.

The Whitlocks of Middlesex book is 74 pages with many pictures and detailed charts. The charts also include many portraits of the members of the family. Howard Whitlock's articles on the Whitlocks of Ealing and history of F. Whitlock & Sons Ltd. round out a very interesting family history.
