

WILL OF JOHN PAUL WHITELOCKE, 1844

This is the last Will and Testament of me *John Paul Whitelocke* of Prospect House Mile End in the Parish of St.Dunstan's Stepney I leave to my beloved wife Sarah all the property of wherever description I may be possessed of and I appoint her the said Sarah Whitelocke as my sole *Executrix* In witness whereof I have this day March the third sett my hand and seal one thousand eight hundred and thirty five
Jno P Whitelocke John Paul Whitelocke (l/s) In the presence and the request of the said John Paul Whitelocke sett our hands as witnesses in his presence and in the presence of reach other March the third one thousand eight hundred and thirty-five *Mary Eleanor Haines Margaret Maddock.*

In the Goods of John Paul Whitelocke deceased.

Appeared Personally *Mary Eleanor Haines* of No.9 Hebbon Terrace, London Hospital in the County of Middlesex, spinster, and made oath that she is the writer and preparer and one of the subscribed witnesses to the last will and testament of of John Paul Whitelocke late of Prospect House Mile End Road in the parish of Saint Dunstan's Stepney in the said County of Middlesex Gentleman deceased the said will beginning ... is the last will and testament of me John Paul Whitelocke of Prospect House Mile End ending thus "I have this day March the third sett my hand and seal one thousand eight hundred and thirty five" and this subscribed John Paul Whitelocke And she further made oath that the said deceased duly executed the said will on the third day of March one thousand eight hundred and thirty five the day of the date thereof in the presence of the deponent and her fellow subscribed witness thereto And she further made oath that at the time of the execution of the said will the said testator in the first instance wrote and signed his name "Jno P. Whitelocke" and upon this deponent observing to the said deceased that he had not written his name at full length the deceased immediately thereupon signed his name at full length "John Paul Whitelocke" as it now appears at the foot of the said will in the presence of this deponent and of all fellow subscribed witness thereto *Mary Eleanor Haines* on the eighth day of April 1844 the said Mary Eleanor Haines was duly sworn to the truth of this Affidavit before me *J.E.P. Robertson Surr Pt H.H. Deacon Notary Public*

Proved at London the 10th April 1844 before the Worshipful John Elliot Pasley Robertson Doctor of Laws and Surrogate by the oath of Sarah Whitelocke widow the Relict the sole Executrix to whom Administration was granted having been first sworn duly to administer.
