

HEREDITARY DISEASE

Ken Whitlock has detailed the incidence of cerebellar/ataxia in his family history. The disease has its onset about age 60 and results in the slow loss of muscle coordination. Ken's cousin Jim is a physician and geneticist at Vanderbilt University Hospital is working on isolating the defective gene involved.
