

WHITLOCK FAMILY NEWSLETTER

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Over the past few years I have been using some of the Whitlock Family Association funds to collect Whitlock items that add to our understanding of the family as a whole. Most of these items have been books written by Whitlocks or items manufactured by Whitlock companies. The majority have been acquired through eBay but in some cases the author's themselves have donated copies.

A couple of months ago I asked Patrick to keep an eye out for census material on eBay that might be of interest to us and Voila! The 1880 Census of the USA arrived. Louise Birchfield of Texas was in the process of extracting the Whitlock entries from the 1880 census and I appreciated the work she went to. We now have computer access to the whole collection. Over time I will cut and paste all the Whitlock entries into our census files for each of the US states and post the results on the website. This will make all this information available to anyone researching this time period. As there are 56 disks with 4,492 Whitlocks and 303 Whitlocks, this is not going to be a small job so will take time. In the meantime if you are looking for a particular entry, email me and I can do a look-up for you and email back the result. I have noticed already that there are Whitlock entries under other names eg Whittock. There are also Wittlocks and Whytocks. Separating the Whitlocks out of these out is not going to be easy.

The British 1881 census on disk already in our files. The addition of the US 1880 census augments the extracts from the 1900 US census that Chuck Rockett funded some years ago. Our ultimate goal is to eventually have all the Whit(e)lock census extracts for each county in Britain, province in Canada and state in the US. Each county, province or state will have its own file. Patrick has advised he is on the outlook for the 1851 census of Britain. All great additions to our collection.

Other recent additions to our files include an interesting collection of wills, probates and divorce documents relating to the family of William Amos Whitlock of Chicago, Illinois (R2439-40, R2447-50, R2458-61, X5532 & X5565) sent in by James E. Wilson.

Those researching in Connecticut will be interested in the website (www.colonialct.uconn.edu). This website allows you to bring up the publication *Colonial Connecticut* and search this multi volume publication for families you are interested in. The pages containing Whitlocks are shown in R2441.

Another book available on the Internet is *Glimpses of the Past 1894-1994* which details the Whitlock families of the Ennerdale, Olds area of Alberta (R2445).

Joan Mercer sent in some interesting land documents from Dereham, Oxford Co., Ontario that relate to the Whitlock and Pickering families (R2452).

Wilma Whitlock's article from *Macleans* (R2454) regarding Ed Whitlock the marathon runner from Milton, Ontario enabled me to figure out which London, England family Ed belongs to. The clue was his mention of his uncle Arthur Whitlock who lived to be 108. I talked to Ed on the phone and hopefully will be able to put an article together on him for a future issue of the Newsletter.

I have been interested to follow the research by Dean Whitlock into the family of Ambrose Whitlock of Kentucky. The information Dean sent in (R2457) makes it fairly certain that Ambrose was the son of Robert Whitlock who shows in Simpson Co., Kentucky in 1820. This research also connects several of the Kentucky families to Robert. This makes me wonder if Robert Whitlock is therefore related to the Ambrose Whitlock of Virginia who settles in Vincennes and who was the founder of Crawfordville in 1823? Ambrose is not a common Whitlock name. (There is deposition by Ambrose Whitlock of Vincennes in this issue.)

The information sent in by Ian Mason on Frederick Bulstrode Lawson Whitlock of Australia (R2462) will be the subject of an article in the September 2005 issue.

Chuck Rockett sent in an item on American Silversmiths (X5468). This item suggests that Hannah Whitlock who married Joseph Baldwin 1636 in High Wycombe, Buckinghamshire and John Whitlock who heads the Whitlocks of Connecticut family were both born in Cholesbury, Buckinghamshire. Hannah in 1613 and John in 1611. Also that both were children of John Whitlock who was born at Cholesbury, Buckinghamshire about 1585 and died in Connecticut in 1658. This was the first time I had seen this information and unfortunately there is no source detail. I did a little research on the Internet regarding Cholesbury but could not determine if the parish registers for this time period exist. We have felt for sometime that Hannah and John Whitlock were likely connected. It is also more likely that the John Whitlock who died in 1658 was the one born in 1611 as his children were very young at his death. This clue certainly needs checking out and if anyone can track down the Cholesbury parish registers I would be interested to know what information on Whitlocks they contain.

Eric Whitlock's information on the Whitlocks of Devizes, Wiltshire (X5475) added useful new detail, including taking the WHITLOCK69 chart back another generation.

Information from Jim Barrett and Tanya Salazar (X5501) connected the Powell and Whitlock families of South Carolina. The *Powell Migration to Texas 1854-56* (R2451) details these families' trek to Texas from South Carolina. We suspect the Alexander Whitlock mentioned in these documents is likely the son of John & Jemima (Cain) Whitlock of Union Co., South Carolina.

I was very interested to hear from Richard Edmonston (X5511) whose grandfather was the silent screen actor Lloyd Whitlock. Richard had seen a Newsletter article about his grandfather on our website and contacted me. I am hoping we will be able to add more detail to our files about Lloyd's career from Richard's records. Useful to know people actually do find items of interest on the website.

In the last issue I speculated that Thomas Jefferson Whitlock of Missouri was the one who founded the Whitlock mine in Mariposa Co., California. In this issue there is more information about Thomas Jefferson Whitlock. Information from Dorothy (X5527) tells us that Thomas' second wife Mary Appleby was actually Mary McCain the daughter of Thomas Graham McKoin & Susannah Barham. She had first married William Appleby and had five children. They were divorced in 1855.

The collection of obituaries from Chuck Rockett (X5533-X5553) add both new information and additional detail to many of these families. Obituaries are very useful to connect generations together, particularly when few other records exist.

I came across a family group descent recent while on the Internet (X5561) but unfortunately the website link given is no longer valid. The chart traced the descent from Robert Heriot Whitelocke who was Professor Royal of Wurtemberg and published the *Memoirs of Bulstrode Whitelocke* in 1860 (R942). This chart connected several Whitelocke families to the WHITLOCK02H chart and clarified how they fit into the family. One of them was Madeleine Whitelocke who assisted Ruth Spalding when she was writing *The Improbable Puritan* and editing *The Dairy of Bulstrode Whitelocke (1605-1675)*.

I was searching for information on the British reporter, Monica Whitlock when I came across the above item. This search also yielded information on another Monica Whitlock, Professor Monica Whitlock of Arizona State University. This Monica turned out to be the daughter-in-law of Carl T. Whitlock whose research into the Whitlock families of Alabama added such great detail on these families to our files (R1235).

I have not yet determined how the reporter Monica Whitlock fits in but it was certainly interesting to hear her on the radio for several days reporting on the troubles in Kazakhstan and Uzbekistan. One of our recent book additions is *Land Beyond The River, The Untold Story of Central Asia* by Monica Whitlock. The flyleaf says "Monica Whitlock has worked for the BBC World Service since 1991. She first went to Afghanistan in 1992 and was the BBC Central Asia correspondent from 1995-1998, with offices in Tashkent, Dushanbe, and Almaty. Since then she has reported from Iran and Syria and returned to Central Asia several times, reporting from Dushanbe and Tashkent in the immediate aftermath of the attacks on America on September 11, 2001. She now lives in London (2003)." Hopefully we will be able to determine Monica Whitlock's connection to one of the charts in our files as more information is received.

Other additions to our Whitlock book collection include *The Life of Lazarillo De Tormes* (La Vida de Lazarillo de Tormes y de Sus Fortunas y Adversidades) translated into English by David Rowland with an Introduction and Notes by Keith Whitlock. The back cover states " Keith Whitlock is an Arts Staff Tutor in the London Region of the Open University for which he has edited Readers on the Enlightenment (1993) and the Renaissance (2000), and has published material on Beckett, Johnson, Lorca, Teresa of Avila, Luis de León, Ignatius of Loyola and *Lazarillo de Tormes*. He has also written the Introduction to Smollett's translation of *Don Quixote* (Wordsworth, 1998), and articles on the Spanish influence on Shakespeare and the early Stuart stage." Keith lives in East Grinstead, is a long-time subscriber to our Newsletter and a distant cousin of mine. Our thanks to Keith for a copy of this publication.

We have also acquired copies of *Race Walking* by Harold H. Whitlock (Olympic Gold Medalist 1936). This was published by Amateur Athletic Association in 1957 and *Joshua Edmund Webb & Laura Amanda Gilbert, Ancestors & Progeny* by Nancy A. Webb McLaughlin & LaVerne Webb Cross, 2005. This book gives us a birth year for Susanna Webb who married Thomas Whitlock in Campbell, Virginia in 1788. I am also still working my way through the huge volume *The Jones Family & descendants of William and Mary (Whitlock) Jones (1735-2003)* by Doris Greene Bramlett. All great additions to our Whitlock collection.

Included in this issue will be a reprint of the Main Line (310) for Louis Smith as the one that appeared in the December 2004 issue was incorrect.

I have managed to make it to 1856 in the Birth Register with coding complete to 1833. A slow progress but steady.

This issue is chock full of additions as the mail has been pretty heavy lately. I did not print any of the photograph collection in the last issue and there does not appear to be any room in this issue as well. Will try to make room in the September issue. I hope you find this issue of interest.

STURGES SELLECK WHITLOCK (1844-1914)

The publication *Representative Citizens of Connecticut* by Samuel Hart, 1916 provides an interesting portrait of the industrialist, Sturges S. Whitlock. It is interesting to note the first full page (not reproduced) of this portrait is the author attempting to portray the Whitlock factories and mills as landscape poetry and art!!

"Born January 28, 1844, at Ridgefield, Connecticut, Mr. Whitlock was a member of a very old Connecticut family which had made its home in that region for many generations. There is a tradition concerning the actual founding of the Whitlock family in this country that three brothers of the name came from England to the "New World" during the early period of its colonization, one them settling in Connecticut, one in New York and one in New Jersey, and that it is from these that all the various Whitlock families in the United States are descended. However this may be, it is certain that the ancestors of the Mr. Whitlock with whose life and career this sketch is concerned were living in Ridgefield during pre-Revolutionary days, the line being clearly traceable for five generations back.

Thaddeus Whitlock, who was the representative of the family during the Revolution, took a credible part in that historic struggle, and his son, the grandfather of Sturges S. Whitlock, fought in the War of 1812. Mr. Whitlock's father, John Whitlock, was a very prominent man in the community in his day, with extensive manufacturing interests in Derby, Connecticut, where he founded the business afterwards developed to great proportions by his son. His wife, before her marriage to him in 1842 was Mary Ann Selleck, a daughter of Sturges Selleck, of Danbury, Connecticut, and Sturges S. Whitlock was one of the two children born to this union, the other being Charles Whitlock, who died as early as 1860.

Sturges S. Whitlock passed the years of his youth in the region of the State where he was born, but not all of it in his native town, receiving his education at Jackson's Academy in the neighbouring town of Danbury. He proved an apt and industrious scholar and left school at the age of eighteen the possessor of a liberal education. Upon completing his schooling he entered the machine shop of his father at Derby and there learned to become a practical machinist, as well as the business side of the enterprise. Though still a young man of twenty-four, he stepped into his father's place on the retirement of the elder man in 1868 and from that time for twenty years had complete control of the business, which he conducted on the most progressive principles and with the highest degree of success. During the first ten years of his management he carried on the industry in the same manner that his father before him had done, at least in so far as the actual product of the mills was concerned. Mr. Whitlock was, however, a man of great inventive genius and about 1877 designed a printing press which had many features that greatly improved on the type then in use. This design he patented and in 1878 began the manufacture of his invention in his mills. The invention was a notable one and the new form of press rapidly displaced the older forms throughout the country so that the capacity of the plant was strained to the uttermost. This capacity of the plant was about one hundred presses a year and the manufacture of them at a rate was continued by Mr. Whitlock for about ten years longer. Finally, in 1887, it became impossible to supply the growing demand for the mechanism as practically every printing concern of any importance found it necessary to install one, and Mr. Whitlock formed the corporation known as the Whitlock Machine Company, which removed the following year to Shelton, Connecticut, where much more adequate quarters were provided for the carrying on the great business. It is here that the industry is still continued to-day under the same name, forming now as it has from the outset one of the most important manufacturing interests in the district. Mr. Whitlock, himself, up to the time of his death was a very prominent figure in the industrial circles of the State and a man whose reputation for probity and sound practical business methods was surpassed by none.



The great interests connected with his industrial operations made it impossible for Mr. Whitlock to devote as much time or attention to many other aspects of the community's life as both inclination and talent impelled him to. This was particularly true in the case of politics in which he was always keenly interested and in which he would unquestionably have risen high had it been possible for him to take part in public affairs to a great extent. Even as it was he became a prominent factor therein in the county, a recognized leader and held a number of important offices. He was a staunch supporter of the principles of the Republican party with which he was identified from attaining his manhood until his death, and it was as its candidate that he was elected to the several offices that he held. For a year he was assessor for the town of Derby and later served a term as member of the board of burgesses for the borough of Birmingham. In the fall of 1896 he was elected to the State Assembly from the township of Huntington, and upon the completion of his term in that body in 1898 was sent to the State Senate from the Fifteenth Electoral District.

In the fall of 1868 Mr. Whitlock was united in marriage with Mary Olive Singer, a daughter of Isaac M. Singer, of New York City. To Mr. & Mrs. Whitlock were born two children: Olive Voulette, now wife of Walter Randall, of Shelton, Connecticut, and Mary Lillian, now the wife of Alton P. Terrell, of Ansonia, Connecticut. Mrs. Whitlock died in August 1898, and on June 2, 1902, Mr. Whitlock was united in marriage with Inez M. Wakefield, a daughter of Charles Everett and Louise D. (Wentworth) Wakefield, of Maine. Of this union one son was born, Sturges Selleck Whitlock, Jr., born Feb. 24, 1904, died March 5, 1904. Mrs. Whitlock survives her husband and is now the wife of Yale D. Bishop, of No. 271 Crown street, New Haven, Connecticut.



Mr. Whitlock was a man of strong social instincts who enjoyed greatly the society of his fellows. He was prominent in Masonic circles and a member of Hiram Lodge, No.12, Free and Accepted Masons, and of King Solomon Chapter, No.3, Royal Arch Masons, of Derby. He was keenly interested in all matters pertaining to the public welfare and was active in many movements undertaken with this objective. He did invaluable service in aiding the developing of the town of Shelton as a member of its Board of Trade, of which he was a director for a number of years. In the matter of religion Mr. Whitlock was an Episcopalian and a very liberal supporter of the church's work. Mr. Whitlock possessed a rather unusual union of characteristics which, when taken together, almost invariably spell success. The capable business man and the inventor are rarely found together in one person, the qualities which make for ability in each line somewhat negating the others. In his case, however, this was not so and he was equally capable of inventing his splendid press and successfully putting it upon the market. Nor was invention one effort merely, but he followed it up by much valuable work, making great improvements from year to year in his own device, and had eventually about twenty patents on these various supplementary inventions. A man of strong personality, he was everywhere and in all relations a sort of leader among his fellows who readily deferred to views which he could at once urge with so much enthusiasm and back with argument so convincing. His relations with other members of his own family and household and with his personal friends were of a most delightful kind, and his death left an unusually large circle of those who mourned him as a personal loss."

Sturges Selleck Whitlock's family is detailed on the WHITLOCK09 chart, The Whitlocks of Connecticut. The author's assertion that he could trace his ancestors back in Connecticut for five generations was true, in fact we have been able to trace them back from Sturges S. Whitlock for seven generations. The story about the three brothers coming to America is not likely true as further research has shown the New Jersey Whitlocks came from Wiltshire where as the Virginia families came from Berkshire. It is not yet clear where in England the Connecticut family originates but Buckinghamshire or Hertfordshire seem likely.

Sturges' wife Mary Olive Singer was the daughter of Isaac Merritt Singer the owner of the Singer Sewing Machine Company. The marriage was therefore a very influential connection for Sturges and his family. I have not been able to find any descendants of this family through his two daughters. Olive Vouletti was the wife of Walter Randall and Mary Lillian was the wife of Alton Truman Terrell. The latter had a son Sturges Terrell born in 1900 but that is as far as we have been able to trace this line so far.

NEWTOWN CONNECTICUT, 1708

In *Colonial Connecticut Records 1636-1776* pages 55,56 detail the beginnings of Newtown, Connecticut:

“This Assembly grants to the petitioners hereafter named, that all that tract of land lying on the west side of Stratford and part of Fairfield, westerly upon Danbury and a line running from the southeast corner of Danbury, paralell to the east line of said town, to Fairfield bounds, northerly upon Newmilford purchase and Potatuck River, shall be one intire town, called by the name of Newtowne; and do appoint and impower Joseph Curtis of Stratford, Esqr, Capt. Joseph Wakeman of Fairfield, Mr. John Sherman of Woodbury, and Mr. Thomas Taylor of Danbury, a committee to survey the said tract of land, and consider what number of inhabitants the said tract of land will conveniently accommodate, and accordingly determine where the town plot shall be, and lay out a suitable number of homelots, and order all the prudentials of the said town until such time as the General Court shall order otherwise. All the charge of the said committee shall be at, to be paid by the said petitioners or such of them as shall take up the said land according to the conditions hereinafter exprest. This Court do also grant to the said petitioners that each one of them shall have for himself, his heirs and assigns forever, an equal part and proportion of all the common land within the said tract not already taken up according to former grant from this government, the proportion to be made according to the number the said shall appoint and determine the whole tract will accommodate; alwayes provided the said petitioners shall and do by themselves or their assignes enter upon the said land within four years after this sessions, and continue to dwell as inhabitants there at least four years; and if any of the said petitioners shall not so enter and continue upon the said land, it shall be in the power of the General Court to admit others in their stead, and so many more as the said tract of land will suitably accommodate. This Court do also grant to the said petitioners free libertie to purchase for the use of the said town any part or parcel of the said tract of land that may be claimed by the Indians; and the several persons that have already taken up any quantitie of land within the said tract of land according to former grant from this government, shall have a right and priviledge as the rest of the inhabitants of the said town, in proportion according to the quantitie of land they have so taken up.

The names of the petitioners for the land before granted fol[38]lowes,| viz: Joseph Curtis, James Judson, Samll Hawly, John Read, John Burr, Theophilus Hull, John Minor, Benjamin Sherman, Josiah Curtis, Daniel Burr, Junr, Daniel Curtis, Richard Hubbel, Junr, John Judson, John Sely, junr, Daniel Beardsly, Joseph Fairchild, Benjamin Hurd, Benjamin Nichols, Peleg Burrit, John Griffin, Thomas Sharp, Dunning of Stratford, Daniel Beardsly, Senr, Zechariah Ferris, Will. Malerie, Samll Hubbel, Junr, Jonathan Booth, John Hawly, David Whitlock, junr, John Glover, Daniel Foot, junr, Abraham Kimberly, Benjamin Peat, Danll Burr, senr, Mr. Richard Brians heirs, Samll Eels.”

The David Whitlock, junr listed in the document setting up Newtown, Connecticut in 1708 was born in 1681, likely in Connecticut. He died at Greenfield, Fairfield Co., Connecticut May 30, 1761. He was the son of David Whitlock and Mary Sherwood. This family is detailed on our WHITLOCK09 chart The Whitlocks of Connecticut.

Many of the family names of the above petitioners also appear on the WHITLOCK09 chart. Hull, numerous members of the Hull family marry Whitlock or Whitlock descendants; Ferris, Seth Whitlock married Mary daughter of the Zachary Ferris of Newtown mentioned in the petition; Burrit; Abigail Whitlock married Tolcott Burritt; Burr, there are many Burrs on the WHITLOCK 09 chart; Curtis, Elizabeth-Deborah Whitlock married Eliphalet Curtiss; plus Minor, Griffin, Beardsly, Judson, Glover, Foot etc they all have Whitlock connections.

Disposition of Ambrose Whitlock publication made by order of Court Novr 12th 1834

The following deposition of Ambrose Whitlock before me & M. Currey a Justice of the Peace in & for County of Montgomery and State of Indiana at my office In Crawfordsville in said county On this 18th day of October 1834. between the hours of 9 A.M. & 6 P.M. of said day, to be read in evidence in a suit pending and undetermined In Chancery in the Knox Probate Court, county of Knox & State of Indiana wherein Lewis Sublett is complainant and Joshua Baird and Elihu Stout dependents taken in pursuance of the attached notice and dedimus. The said Ambrose Whitlock, of lawful age sworn deposeth and saith.

Question by Complt. Were you acquainted with John T. Sublett now deceased?

Answer by Deponant. Partially His name was on the Roll of capt Moderells company of Rangers.

Question by same. Was he a Ranger during the late war? & if so in whose company?

Answer by Deponant. There was such man on the Roll Of Capt. Moderelis company of Rangers.

Question by same. Did he sd. John T. Sublett draw pay and who drew the pay of sd. Sublett after his death and what amount was drawn and for what time & by whom - and who receipted for his pay & where is the Receipt. and was you the pay master who paid the amounts of money due sd. Sublett to his administrator, and if so how much & when. & did you give the annexed statement in writing marked A. dated Nov.6, 1815, and when, & is said statement correct?

Answer by Deponant. A person by the name of Coleman drew of witnefs as paymaster \$113. The pay of said Sublett from 1st augt to 21. Nov. 1812, as appears from said annexed Statement marked A. which Statement is in the hand writing of witnefs & given at the time of its date. but don't now recollect to whom he gave said Statement.
