THOMAS WHITLOCK OF PITTON, WILTS 1575

In the 1980's the late Pearl Olson of Salt Lake City donated copies of her 30 years of Whitlock research to our collection. Included in this package of over 800 pages was a reference to a will of a Thomas Whitlock of Pitton, Wiltshire dated 1575. As the parish registers in Pitton start in the 1670's and this item was more that 100 years earlier than we had been able to trace, it was never investigated. With the Wiltshire record office starting to make their will collection available online this was one of the first batch of wills that are now available to download to anyone interested.

In the intervening years since Pearl sent us her material much information has come to light including the fact that the huge New Jersey family descends from a Thomas Whitlock from Salisbury, Wiltshire born about 1618 who came to America in 1641. While we do not know that this Thomas came from Pitton, we know Pitton is the source of most of the Whitlocks in Wiltshire and Hampshire and there is a very good chance he was connected to the families in Pitton.

1575 is less that 50 years before Thomas' birth in 1618 and it would not be inconceivable that Thomas who died in 1575 could be the younger Thomas' grandfather or great grandfather. This is made even more plausible because we know at least two of Thomas' children were less than 21 in 1575.

It appears from the Thomas' extensive inventory that is attached to the will that Thomas was a fairly wealthy man. In particular he lived in a "Hall" which is the equivalent of a Manor House. I assume the families fortunes declined in the next hundred years as the Whitlocks do not have such a prominent place in Pitton life in the 1670's. They are certainly the most dominant family in the the village with the majority of families having the name Whitlock by the 1800's.

The one thing this will demonstrates is that there are still important documents out there that we have not seen yet. Hopefully as more come to light we will be able to fill in the missing years and connect some of these families together.

The will and inventory shown below are transcribed just the way they were written. Hopefully there are not too many errors as many of the words were not familiar to me. My latin is pretty minimal so not sure about that part at all. Amounts are all in roman numerials and pounds (\mathfrak{L}) shillings (s) and pence (d).

I hope you find the will and inventory of interest and I look forward to comments on my speculation.

WILL OF THOMAS WHITLOCK 1575

In the name of god Amen the first daye of June in the yere of our Lord god 1575 I Thomas Whitlocke of Pytton in the countie of Wiltes husbandman beinge sick of bodye but p'fitt of

remembrance (thanks be to god) do make my last will and testament in manner and forme followinge First I bequeath my sowle to almightie god my maker and to Jesus Christ his sonne my redeamer and to the holy gost my sanctyfier and my bodie to the Earthe to be buried in the church yard of Pitton Item I geve unto the churche of the blessed virgin Mary in same a vid Item I geve to the church of Pitton a ewe shepe Item I geve to evry one of my godchildren a iiijd apice Item I geve to my daughter Sybell fyve pounds and a fether bedd Item to my daughter Elizabeth I do geve fyve pounds Item I geve to my daughter Johan fyve pounds Item I geve to my daughter Edithe fyve pounds an aker of wheate and an other of barley not of the best nor worste all the w'ch my legacies geven and bequeathed to my daughters I will itt to be delyvred to eyther of them att the day of their mariages.
