

# THE WHITLOCKS OF GREASY CREEK

A new book on the Whitlock family has recently been published.

This book is the story of the Whitlocks who lived in Richmond, Virginia in Henrico County during the 1700's. Thomas Whitlock, was born in Henrico County and owned land in Buckingham County, Virginia where his children were born. He moved his large family to Green County, Kentucky about 1816 when he was about forty years old and subsequently owned over two thousand acres on Greasy Creek. He was very ambitious and as Uncle Claude Whitlock wrote in a letter "he got a start somehow to making money." (page 216 in the book) His descendants are too numerous to count and have literally spread all over the world!

Our thanks to Patricia Hunter and Marian Warren for the above item. This family is detailed on the WHITLOCK23 chart. Thomas Whitlock was born in Buckingham Co., Virginia February 5, 1769. He was the son of James Whitlock and his second wife, Mary Smith. While we have not been able to prove it, it is believed that this James is the one shown on the WHITLOCK25 chart as the son of James and Agness Christmas. The Whitlock DNA project shows the two families share the same DNA and in turn also share the same DNA as the males in the WHITLOCK02H chart, the Whitlocks of Wokingham, Berkshire, England. This supports our theory that both these Virginia families descend from the same family in England.
