

WHITLOCK FAMILY NEWSLETTER

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This issue of the Newsletter should be an interesting one. It is not often I have so much material that I have five articles for the June issue!! Several articles in this issue result from some great research done by Jennifer Hart into the Yorkshire-London-Jamaica line of the family detailed on our WHITLOCK21 chart.

But first we have interesting YDNA results that I want to share with you. Edith Carlson of Oregon got a male Whitlock member of her WHITLOCK09 family The Whitlock of Connecticut to take the YDNA test and she brought the results with her when she and Chuck came for lunch in Chilliwack on their way to a conference in Vancouver. Needless to say the first thing we did was get on the computer and do a comparison. The WHITLOCK09 YDNA results matched 36 of 37 markers to the WHITLOCK16 YDNA!! While it would be useful for a few other members of the family to confirm this result, it would indicate the WHITLOCK09 family has a closer relationship to the New Jersey and Wiltshire, England families than to those in Buckinghamshire where we had speculated their origins might be.

Bjorn Witlox has been doing some interesting research into the YDNA testing and he and others are speculating that the test results show connections much further back than the 500 years the literature indicates. It may be as far as 1000 years. This was sparked by Bjorn's shared YDNA between the WHITLOCK02H and WHITLOCK90 families being pre 1300. It is therefore possible that the person these tests indicate as a common ancestor could be an Anglo Saxon prior to invasion of Britain in the 800's. It is still a good way to group different branches of the family and as more tests are done, grouping those with the same variances from the base of 37 of 37 markers may give us a more detailed picture of our more recent ancestors.

Very interesting research and I encourage anyone curious about their part of the Whitlock family to have one of the male Whitlocks in their part of the family tested and to grow our knowledge base.

Of interest in this issue is the Will of Christopher Potley (1590's?-1661) (R3078). See article in this issue for the multitude of connections finding this Will revealed. The information regarding Holt House in Wokingham, Berkshire (R3097-R3098) from Jan Witlox and Steve Thomas is also the subject of an article in this issue. Holt House was part of the Manor of Beches, the Berkshire home of the Whitlocks of Wokingham in the 1500's and 1600's.

I have managed to expand our census collection with Delaware (1800-1870) and Maryland (1800-1850) (R3100-R3110) (R3119-R3121), Dorset, England (1841-1851) (R3122-R3123), Kansas (1860-1870) (R3128-R3129) etc. I concentrate on one area each time I visit the library.

I was very interested to find one of the descendants included with the WHITLOCK21 family was Harriet (Crosley) Ventum. Mrs. Ventum wrote numerous books for children from 1800-1814 and is mentioned by Jane Austen in her prologue to *Northanger Abbey*. See article in this issue.

Bjorn Witlox directed me to a Dutch site which yielded 108 pages of Witloc land records (1400-1800) (X7145). Unfortunately they are in Dutch and Latin! I used Google Translate and while the translation is not great it does give you an idea what they are talking about and which Witloc was the related to which other. Very useful when you are back to the 1400's!!

Our Newspaper clip section has some interesting additions in this issue. NP1340-NP1361 are from old British Newspapers I had access to while in Salt Lake City. I only had time to look at the name Whitlocke 1800-1838. NP1362-NP1380 all relate to the WHITLOCK21 family and are part of the huge collection of documents from Jennifer Hart. NP1382-NP1386 are part of on-going research by Martha Endres into the WHITLOCK35 family of Augusta Co., Virginia.

The Certificate Register continues to grow faster than I can print it. We now have over 3500 certificates. Huge additions recently include those on the disks from Lawrence Otis for Delaware, USA and Dorset England. Also the wonderful collection of London and Jamaican certificates from Jennifer Hart. Martha Endres continues work in Augusta Co., Virginia and I look forward to more documents from her as well.

Subscription renewals and donations continue to come in either by mail or the donate button on the website - all very much appreciated. These fund our research and keep the website up and running. I hope those who have not renewed yet for 2012 will wish to do so for another year. (Renewal forms are included for you.)

I am continually amazed when researching in our files how much of the information collected in the 1960-1980 time frame now means so much more when I review it today. WILL OF CHRISTOPHER POTLEY 1658

In the name of God Amen I Christopher Potley of the Fish St.James Clarkenwell in the county of Midds Esq being in perfect memory thanks be given to God doe make and ordaine this my last will & testament this twentieth day of May in the year of our Lord Christ one thousand six hundred Fifty and eight and First I committ my Soule to God that gave it and my Body to the earth to be decently interred at Beaconsfield by my deare and lately deceased Wife Cicelia and appoynt Five pounds to be given to minister M Sparkes if he will preach my funerall sermon or it he refuse then to such other person as shall performe the same And... for my worldly Estate and Goods committ the dispoitions of them to my beloved sonne in law Robert Tompkins of Limehouse ... in the county of Midds the only Sonne of my said ... Wife And I do hereby make and constitute him the said Robert my sole heire & Executor of all my Goods Chattrells Tennements and hereditance whatso ever that I have on hand my right unto or interest in with in Law or ... To my Dearly beloved Daughter in Law Anne Hide I give Fifty pounds to buy her a ... To my Servant Thomas Gummett I

give Ten pounds and to Jane ... Five pounds of lawfully money Also To my Seavant Joane a To the poore of Clarckenwell p ishpenies to be distributed at the discretion of my Executor above named to such of them as are poore housekeepers and goe not about for Almes or ... otherwise ...able to help themselves And I do hereby revoke all former Wills made by my In witness whereof I have hereunto set my ... Sealed and published in presence of John Browne Elizabeth Bacon.

(Will proved Feb.16,1661)

Discovery of this will has led to a very interesting collection of connections to the Whitlock family in the time of first Civil War (1642-1646) and the Interregnum (1649-1660) in England. It explained why many of these persons appear in Sir Bulstrode Whitelocke's Diaries and are called kinsmen by him.

Colonel Christopher Potley was first married to a daughter of Richard Whitlock (1564-1624) of Prussia but we have not yet determined her name. Richard Whitlock was Bulstrode Whitelocke's uncle so Christopher Potley's wife was one of Bulstrode's Prussian first cousins.

Col. Potley married secondly Cecilia (Waller) Tomkins at St Clement Danes, London, Oct.8,1655. She was the widow of Nathaniel Tomkins whom she had married in Beaconsfield, Buckinghamshire Mar.10,1624. Nathaniel Tomkins was a clerk of the Queen's Council and his wife Cecilia was a sister to Edmund Waller the poet. Nathaniel was hanged for high treason in 1643 for his involvement in a royalist plot to seize the City of London. He was betrayed by his brother in law Edmund Waller who was the instigator of the plot. Edmund paid a £10,000 fine but his life was spared. He was exiled and returned to England in 1651 and lived until 1687. A wealthy man all his life, he became a noted poet and was elected to Parliament after the restoration.

Col. Potley spent a lot of time on the continent serving various governments in a military capacity.

In Portugal, "the hired David Caley arrived in the United in mid-1641, accompanied by another officer, Christopher Potley English. Both had a long career, having served 30 years in the armies of the kings of Sweden and Denmark. Potley reached the rank of colonel, while Caley, who had the same route, was a lieutenant colonel. In Portugal, John IV constitutes each of his infantry regiments, and in return received the rank of colonel and their pay, which was, as a rule, twice that enjoyed by a Portuguese field master. For these subjects of King Charles I of England, the soldier was given far more generous: 64,000 reis per month (a teacher of Portuguese camp received 23,200 reis)." "On 28 October 1641, Caley and Potley were present at the assault and sacking of Valverde, in the first offensive operation of the Portuguese army triggered the Spanish province of Extremadura. A messy operation, directed by the master field D. John Costa (future Earl of Soure), lost his life in which the Commissioner General Francisco Rebelo de Almada, who commanded the cavalry operationally then existing in the Alentejo." "In early 1642, Caley and Potley were back in Lisbon. Like many other foreign officials in the service of the Portuguese Crown, abandoned their posts at the border, exasperated by the lack of compliance in the payment of wages. "Maybe that's why Christopher Potley have decided to return to England between April and June 1643 (would participate in the English Civil War, the forces loyal to Parliament). However, on April 14, 1643, received new patent, the master field, and a command of two thirds of the new ordinance that Lisbon would be trained and sent to the Alentejo." (While in English, this document appears to be a translation, likely from Portuguese)

Col. Potley returned to England again in 1651 after spending 18 months spying on Royalist activities at the court of Queen Christina of Sweden for which parliament paid him £300 per annum. He was ideally suited for the role as he was well known and liked in several strategic countries and spoke several languages fluently. Bulstrode Whitelocke therefore, took both him and his son Andrew Potley with him to Sweden in 1653 when he was appointed Ambassador there by Oliver Cromwell.

In *An apprenticeship in arms: the origins of the British Army 1585-1702* by Roger Burrow Manning he says: "Col. Christopher Potley, Sir William Waller's major-general, was a veteran of the Swedish Army: he was highly regarded by Chancellor Axel Oxenstierna and the Swedish Senate, who conferred upon him a gold medal with the effigy of Gustavus Adolphus and a substantial pension for life."

I have not found when Col Potley was born but it was likely in the 1590's as by the 1640's he already had 30 years of service as a soldier. This makes him close to 70 when he died. It is strange he does not mention his son Andrew in his will as Andrew was writing from Hamburg to Bulstrode Whitelocke after the will was written indicating he was still alive at that time. Bulstrode describes Andrew Potley as "a Young Gent[leman]. Kinsman of Wh[itelocke], of very good parts, and Stout [ie. courageous], he spoke High Du[t]ch [i.e. German] perfectly; & had the French Tongue. Gent[leman] of the 1st degree". Likely in his 20's or early 30's in 1653.

An interesting addition to our files, all resulting from the chance find of the above will. These persons are all part of the WHITLOCK02H family.

THOMAS G. WHITELOCK (1788-) OF VIRGINIA

On the 1860 census for Iola, Allen Co., Kansas there is an entry for the family of Thomas G. Whitlock and his wife Celia. Thomas is shown age 72 or born in 1788 in Virginia. Celia is 56 born in Kentucky. Living in the same house is Aja M. Whitlock age 16 born in Kentucky, Lafayette Whitlock age 12 born in Kentucky and Garnett Whitlock age 74 born in Virginia. I would assume Thomas G. Whitlock and Garnett Whitlock are likely brothers. They are a similar age and both born in Virginia.

Also shown in the Ohio records is a Thomas G. Whitlock or Thomas Campbell Whitlock who shows in the 1820 and 1830 census for Richland Co., Ohio. He appears on the 1828 tax rolls for Clear Creek,

Ashland Co. as a householder and in 1832 Franklin Co. although his residence is given as Franklin, Indiana. Thomas G. Whitelock is also shown as a Non-Resident on the 1825 tax roll for Richland Co.

When Thomas G. Whitelock's land is registered in Franklin Co., Ohio Nov.23,1832 SE 1/4 NE 1/4 S6 there also land registered for an Abraham Whitelock on the same day SE 1/4 SE 1/4 S6. On Dec.24,1832 William Whitelock registers land NE 1/4 SE 1/4 S6. On Feb.13,1836 Charles Whitelock registers land NW 1/4 SW 1/4 S7.

According to the "History of Hancock County" by anonymous pub 1886, Thomas G Whitlock was an early settler of 1832 and he bought John Bishop's farm Section 25, and opened the Green Tree Tavern which became a resort of the "fast youth" of the surrounding country. After a controversy over the disappearance of an herbal doctor Wolverton, who lived with them in the 1830's, they sold out and left for parts unknown. I cannot find him on the 1840 or 1850 census records and he reappears in Kansas in 1860.

Also shown on the 1820 census for Richland Co., is Michael Whitelock who died there about 1825. He is also from Virginia. In information received from Lt. Col. (Ret) Rex Knoke Moorhead in 1976 (via June Lutz) Michael Whitelock was born in Virginia pre 1760 had one son Thomas Whitelock born about 1780 in Virginia (now West Virginia). Thomas married twice - second wife was Elizabeth Scott. He came to Hancock Co., Ohio in the 1830's and ran a tavern there. Michael Whitelock shows on the 1782 census for Monongalia Co., Virginia (now West Virginia). He was also a soldier and appears in the Pay Lists of Colonial Soldiers of Virginia.

The name Garnett Whitelock is usual and there is a Cyrus T. Whitelock born in Virginia about 1810, living in Hancock Co., Ohio in 1850 with a son Garnett Whitelock born about 1834 in Ohio. Cyrus' eldest son is named Thomas Whitelock born about 1832 in Ohio.

Cyrus T. Whitelock married Amelia Carr August 9,1830 in Richland Co., Ohio and it seems likely he was the son of Thomas G. Whitelock and grandson of Michael Whitelock.

The family may originate from Maryland. Abraham Whitelock who registered land the same day as Thomas G. Whitelock and adjacent to each other was born in Maryland and was also living in Franklin Co., Indiana in 1832. Abraham Whitelock was born about 1801 in Maryland and died 1863 Huntingdon Co., Indiana.

HARRIET (CROSLEY) VENTUM, (1760s - ??), AUTHOR

Harriet Ventum (fl. 1800–1814): Biographical Notes

Born Harriet Crossley sometime in the 1760s, Harriet Ventum would seem to have spent most of her life within a two-mile radius in London. Nothing is known of her early years, but we can glean some information from the work she later produced: she was educated—she worked for part of her life as a teacher in a school—she may perhaps have travelled to Italy, Wales, and Portugal among other places, and she may have been a part of or known about members of the gentry.

On 12 October 1786, Harriet married a Thomas Ventum at St Benet Gracechurch, London. [27] According to The Times for 10 December 1790, the couple took up residence in a house at 20 Greville Street, Holborn. There is a record of a Thomas Ventum given as a ‘court officer’ and ‘gentleman pensioner’, a post he held between 1788 and 1789. [28] (The Oxford English Dictionary defines ‘gentleman-pensioners’ as ‘royal bodyguards, one of 40 gentlemen who act as guards or attendants to the sovereign on state occasions’.)

On 11 November 1790, Harriet and Thomas christened their daughter, Elizabeth Frances, at St Andrew’s Church Holborn. However, Thomas’s duties to the King seem to have ended abruptly—the record simply states, ‘vac by 1790’. [29] Then, in December 1790 and January 1791, Thomas’s name appears twice in the archives of The Times—under ‘Sales by Auction’—first on Friday, 10 December 1790:

Lot I. A Spacious FREEHOLD HOUSE, situate No. 20, on the South-side of Greville-street, recently repaired, and let, to Mr. Ventum, one year of whose term was unexpired at Lady-day last [25th March 1790], at a very low Annual Rent, clear of Land Tax and all Outgoings, of FIFTY POUNDS per Annum. [30]—and then for Tuesday 18th January 1791:

By HENRY WATKINS, On the Premises, No. 20 Greville street, Hatton Garden, THIS DAY and TO-MORROW, at Twelve o’Clock THE Neat and Genuine HOUSEHOLD FURNITURE, Plate, Linen, China, Prints, and Books, of Mr. THOMAS VENTUM, amongst which are neat four-post and sield [sic] bedsteads, with printed cotton and morine furnitures, a number of good beds and bedding, a general assortment of cabinet work, a fine toned harpsichord by Griffin, an eight day clock in mahogany case, good kitchen requisites and other effects.

To be viewed to the Sale, and Catalogues had on the Premises, and of Henry Watkins, no. 63 Holborn Hill. [31] Perhaps these were felicitous rather than ominous events; perhaps the Ventums simply needed a bigger residence for themselves and their new daughter; but it is just as likely that their financial circumstances may have been taking a distinct turn for the worse. Almost two years later, on 13 December 1792, a second daughter, Mary Harrison, was christened when she was two days old in the Lying-in Hospital at Endell Street. The hasty christening tells us that, in all likelihood, the child did not survive; the place of Harriet’s confinement almost certainly indicates that at this point her circumstances were very much straitened indeed.

For the next eight years the trail goes cold; however, turning to Ventum’s work we find a description of extremely straitened circumstances in her first novel, Selina (tantalisingly subtitled ‘A Novel, Founded on Facts’), published in 1800. Certain passages in this novel speak of first-hand experience of real penury. Selina was printed for C. Law, Avemaria-Lane, by Bye and Law, St John’s-Square, Clerkenwell. A second novel, Justina; or, The History of a Young Lady followed in 1801. For the next thirteen years, however,

Ventum turned her attentions and talents almost exclusively from novels for adults to didactic prose intended to improve and inspire children and young people, writing seven books for children, four of which were published by J. Harris, successor to Elizabeth and Francis Newbery, the famous children's publishers who had a press-cum-bookshop in St Paul's Churchyard. (The renowned Newbery Medal, awarded annually to the author of the most distinguished contribution to American literature for children, was named in tribute to the Newbery family of publishers.)

In the Preface written for her fifth book (and her third for children), published in 1802 and entitled *Surveys of Nature: A Sequel to Mrs Trimmer's Introduction*, Ventum writes,

Engaged in the business of a school, and constantly in the habit of teaching, I found that although Mrs Trimmer's Introduction was a very serviceable work for the perusal, something on the same plan, but on a rather more enlarged scale, with more particular descriptions, would be highly necessary to assist my purpose of instruction with the elder ones. [32]

Thus we know that she worked as a teacher alongside her work as a writer. Perhaps Ventum was influenced in part by a desire to contribute to the growing canon of work by women, such as Maria Edgeworth and Sarah Trimmer, which sought to meet the social mood of concern for the 'rising generation' during turbulent times at home and abroad.

I could find no extant record of Thomas Ventum's death, nor of a divorce, but on 9 July 1803, Harriet married a William Brown at St Mary's Whitechapel. At this point Harriet would have been somewhere between 35 and 43 years old. There is no easily recoverable record of any children from this marriage, and Harriet continued writing under the name Ventum.

Most of her works seem to have had only one edition, though the Newberys seem to have had enough faith in her abilities to accept—perhaps even commission—roughly one a year. Her work was often favourably reviewed, for the most part, though sometimes she was accused of being derivative. [33]

The publication of *The Holiday Reward, or, Tales to Instruct and Amuse Good Children* during the Christmas and Midsummer Vacations in 1814 is the last public record I have been able to unearth concerning Harriet Crossley Ventum Brown. Her story was not that of a player in the social carnival of bluestockings, theatre parties, and nobility, such as that enjoyed by more lustrous contemporaries, but of a keen observer and self-appointed guardian of morality, who grew from her early Gothic-influenced work to the more serious business of guiding the young. Her life was spent in the workaday world of London as a woman whose relative lack of status would seem, ironically enough, to have granted her more, not fewer, opportunities and freedoms, though perhaps at a price which, at times, may have included real hardship.

We also do not know Harriet's birth or death dates. We do know she was the daughter of Samuel & Elizabeth (Whitelock) Crosley who were married Nov.29,1761 St.Leonard's Shoreditch. Harriet was therefore likely born in the 1760's. Her grandparents were Peter Whitelock & Hannah Harrison who were also married at St.Leonard's Shoreditch Apr.28,1728. Harriet is mentioned in her mother's will of 1789. There was also an additional child, the first born, Harriot Harcourt Ventum bp.Oct.17,1787 Great Stanmore, London. It is not clear if any of Harriet's three daughters survived. This family is detailed on our WHITLOCK21 chart. Harriet Ventum's books were published from 1800 to 1814 and several are still studied today as examples of early books for children.

This find is a direct result of the great research done by Jennifer Hart who is researching the Tate family of Jamaica and has uncovered so much information on this collateral line.

WILL OF ELIZABETH CROSLY, 1789

In the Name of God Amen I Elizabeth Crosley widow of Craven Buildings Hoxton in the Parish of Shoreditch Middlesex being of sound and disposing mind and Memory Do make and ordaine this my last Will and Testament in the manner and form as follows Imprimis I commend my Soul to God who gave it and my Body to be buried in as plain a manner as possible and to be interred in the vault with my ancestors as near the Body of my late Dear Husband as convenient in the family Vault which is under the Church of Saint Leonard Shoreditch in the County of Middlesex and as my worldly Effects are small and my family large to prevent future altercations I Dispose of them in manner and form following as my eldest son Nalum Harwood Crosley enjoyed the whole of his late Fathers Estate I give and bequeath to him and Ann Crosley his Wife the sum of one guinea ... for a Ring in where ...I die in love with them and as I am possessed of six hundred pounds Stock in the three per cents Stock in the Bank of England I give that among my three Daughters for their sole use and benefit To wit Daughter Hannah Triquet wife of Charles Triquet of the Bank the Sum of one hundred pounds Stock and to my Daughter Harriet Ventum Wife of Thomas Ventum of Westminster two hundred and Fifty pounds of the said Stock and to my Daughter Mary Crosley the remaining two hundred and Fifty pounds which make out the whole six hundred pounds Stock and as I am entitled by the Will of my late Dear Father Peter Whitelock to one hundred pounds Stock to my Son Samuel Crosley and my Son James Alexander Crosley to be equally divided between them and should either die before Mrs. Perry the whole to go to the Survivor and should they both die before the said Mrs. Perry the said hundred pounds Stock is to be equally divided between my said Daughters Hannah Triquet Harriet Ventum and Mary Crosley and my Daughter Hannah Triquet may have my Ruby and Diamond Ring the six Silver Tea Spoons that she has at present and my large and Small plated waiters in lieu of the Ring that Harriet is to have and the watch that Mary will have I also desire all my Wearing apparel Linen Lace Toweles Trinkets and Body Linen may be given to my said Daughter Mary Crosley I likewise desire that all my household Furniture may be sold in the best manner that my hereafter mentioned Executor shall think most advisable and that the Money arising from the sale may be appropriated to the payment of my Funeral Expenses Legaties and whatever Debts I may own at my decease and should any Surplus remain after their payment I desire It may be equally Divided between my three Daughters Hannah Triquet, Harriet Ventum and Mary Crosley and my two Sons Samuel Crosley and James Alexander Crosley share and share alike I do herewith appoint Mr. Richard Reddish of the Excise Office London and my two Sons in Law Charles Triquet and Thomas Ventum Executors of this my last Will and Testament made this tenth day of February in the year of Lord one thousand seven hundred and eighty nine and to which I have set my Hand and Seal Eliz' th Crosley - in the presence of us Ann Smallpiece Frances Whitelock

Providing my Furniture should not sell for Money sufficient to defray the Expenses of my Funeral etc my will then is that my three Daughters pay an equal proportion out of the Stock before mentioned towards making good such Deficiencies if any and my desire is that my three Daughters Provide a decent Suit of Mourning for my Son Samuel Eliz. Crosley Frances Whitelock, Ann Smallpiece

This Will was proved at London with a Codicil the fourth day of March in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and eighty nine before the Worshipful William Battim Doctor of Laws Surrogate of the Right Worshipful Sir William Knight also Doctor of Laws Master Keeper or Commissary of the Prerogative Court of Canterbury lawfully constituted by the oath of Richard Reddish one of the Executors named in the said Will to whom administration was granted of all and singular the Goods Chattels and Credits fo the deceased having been first sworn Duly to administer power reserved of making the like grant to Charles Triquet and Thomas Ventum the other Executors named in the said Will when they or either of them shall apply for the same.

Elizabeth Crosley was born Oct.31,1734 in the parish of St.Leonard, Shoreditch, London. Her parents were Peter Whitelock and Hannah Harrison who were married in that parish Apr.28,1728. Elizabeth first married William Lee who died in 1761. On November 29, 1761 at St. Leonard's she married Samuel Crosley.

Elizabeth's father was a permit examiner in the General Excise Office in London, likely a very lucrative position as he was fairly well off when he died in 1781. His will is extensive and includes six hundred pounds of Bank Stock that he is dividing amongst his children.

Samuel and Elizabeth (Whitelock) Crosley had at least six children that are mentioned in Elizabeth's Will made two days before her death February 12, 1789.

THE HOLT HOUSE, BERKSHIRE

There has been quite a bit written about the Manor of Beches in Wokingham, Berkshire that was the home of the Whitlock family in the 1500 & 1600's. Attached to this Manor was the Dower House called The Holt House. The old Manor House of Beches burned in 1953 but the Dower House still exists and since 1930 it has been a school for girls.

The earliest reference to Whitlocks at The Holt appears in the Wokingham parish registers for the burial July 20, 1589 of John Whitlock of Hoult. This John Whitlock was married to Agnes Planner in the 1550's and they had a large family of more than 10 children. According to the family history written by Sir James Whitlock (1570-1632) in 1609, John Whitlock did not marry until he was 45 and he lived until he was 80. Agnes Planner was reputed to be 17 at the time of her marriage. Agnes was buried at Wokingham July 20, 1630 and her will dated June 8, 1629 is extensive.

By deed dated June 10, 1617 John Whitlock (1509?-1589)'s son William Whitlock and his wife Ursula (Beresford) Whitlock lease lands including The Holt House to William's cousin Richard Whitlock (d.1642) for a period of 21 years. William and Ursula Whitlock appear to have lost all the Beches Manor properties and when Richard Whitlock died in 1642 his will leaves the Manor of Beches to his son Richard Whitlock (1616-1666). It is assumed William transferred the estates to his cousin Richard Whitlock (d.1642) sometime after 1617. William Whitlock and Ursula Beresford had descendants who can be traced down into the 1700's in London but they had no claim on the Whitlock estates.

In 1644 Richard Whitlock (1616-1666)'s brother Robert Whitlock (1618-1671) bought Richard's portion of the Manor of Beches for £300. Richard Whitlock (1616-1666) was a graduate of Oxford University, A doctor of physic and a fellow of All Souls College. In 1654 he published "Zootomia: Observations on the present manners of the English" and was considered a man of wit and learning. While Richard had supported or at least accepted the changes during the Interregnum, at the restoration in 1660 he "wheeled about" and took holy orders and was granted the benefice of Foxton in 1660 and became Vicar of Stowe in 1661. As Vicar of Ashford in Kent he clashed with his parishioners and took to etching phrases and sentences into the glass of the windows of the Vicarage reflecting his frustrations. He was buried there October 24, 1666.

Robert Whitlock (1618-1671) was the more successful of the two brothers. He was a member of the Himmer's Company of Clapham, London and a successful merchant in Surrey. The Manor of Beches including The Holt House passed to Robert Whitlock's son Richard Whitlock (1651-1706) of Amersham, Bucks. In the 1680's Richard Whitlock enters into several mortgages with Richard Hawe and by 1687 the entire estate was sold to Richard Hawe. This ended at least 100 years that The Holt House had been associated with the Whitlock family. The property in 1687 included both the Manor House of Beches plus The Holt House and fifty acres of land included tenements and messuages. In addition four closes of land containing 16 acres in the tenure of John Rance of Wokingham.

Since 1930 The Holt House has been school for girls and is known as The Holt School. The buildings were renovated in 1886 and again in 1997. During the latest restoration Steve Thomas photographed each stage of the restoration and has given us a disc of these photographs. It shows the interior of the house stripped down the wooden beams, many irregular shaped sections of tree incorporated into the building. This use of tree shaped beams help date the building to pre 1600.
