

WILL OF ANNA ELIZA WHITELOCK, 1870

This is the last Will and Testament of me Anna Eliza Whitelock of Chatham in the County of Kent Spinster Direct that my funeral may be as private as decency will permit and after my debts funeral and testamentary expenses I give and bequeath to the Reverend John Edward White of St. Pauls Vicarage Chatham in the County of Kent all my moneys now in the hands or under the custody of the Reverend Richard Whitelock of Saddleworth, Yorkshire amounting to the sum of £813.0.0 Eight hundred and thirteen pounds thereabouts and also my gold watch and all my other effects excepting jewelry As to my jewelry I bequeath my turquoise broach and my emerald ring to Charlotte Julia Turner wife of the Reverend John Bowman Turner rector of Barford in the County of Norfolk and all the remainder I bequeath to Frances Ann Hughes wife of Hugh Hughes Esquire of Mount Place Brightling in the County of Sussex And I do hereby appoint the Reverend John Edward White aforesaid to be Sole Executor of this my Will In witness whereof I have in this my last Will set my hand this twenty sixth day of October Eighteen hundred and sixty seven - Anna Eliza Whitelock - Signed and acknowledged by the said Anna Eliza Whitelock as her Will in the presence of us present at the same time and who in her presence and in the presence of each other have hereunto subscribed our names as witnesses - Anne Katherine Whitelock., C.R. Whitelock Col.H clls Indian Arm (Retd) of Belle Hatch Park, Harpedon, Oxon.

Proved at London 5th Oct. 1870 by the Oath of the Reverence John Edward White Clerk the sole Executor to whom Admin was granted.

This Anna Eliza Whitelock was the daughter of Rev. Richard Hutchins Whitelocke and his wife Frances Storer who were married in 1800 at Purley, Berkshire. The two witnesses to the will were her brother Col. Charles Robert Whitelock and his wife Anna Katherine (Storer) Whitelock. This family is detailed on the WHITLOCK21 chart.
