

# RICHARD WHITLOCK, LONDON, GOLDSMITH WILL 1670

While I don't have a copy of this will, I did take extracts in the 1970's while I lived in England. We now know that all five Whitlocks who were Goldsmiths in London are all from the same family. Extracts from his will show his wife was Alice. He wished to be buried in St. Andrew's, Holborn where he was living at the time he made his will.

Richard was in debt to his cousin Richard Barnes for £200 He leave bequests to cousins Edward Sager, Edward Taler and his wife's sister's son.

One third of his estate to niece Rebecca Howell? One third to niece Elizabeth Mortlock. He mentions his wife's former husband and his brother Hugh Whitlock.

Land holdings include land and tenements in Borough Greene and Bullingham, Cambridge. Freehold messuage in St. John Street.

There were additional bequests to Arthur Hollingsworth, apothecary, John Wirrell? Sopemaker, Moses Marsh, Vintner and John Steele, Esq. all of St. Andrew's parish.

He mentions his nephew Richard Barnes and cousins William Howell and M. Mortlock.

Richard's will is dated Jun.29, 1670 and was proved October 10, 1670
