

WHITLOCK FAMILY NEWSLETTER

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This issue is going to be major one - I have huge news of finding a connection that has eluded us for 40 years!!

For the past couple of years I have spent a week in Salt Lake City researching at the Mecca for genealogists, the LDS main library there. One of the chief reasons to make this trip is to get free access to all the many research databases around the world to which the library subscribes. During my visit this year I was directed to *The Genealogist*. This site is dedicated to sharing research and one the sections relates to the Prerogative Court of Canterbury wills, pre 1858. There were over 60 Whit(e)lock wills listed and I worked my way through them downloading images for all of them.

When I got back home I set to work cataloguing and cross referencing each of them (R3188-R3243). Many of these wills I had made extracts from in the 1970's but I did not have copies of them. One of the wills was for Robert Whitlock (1618-1671). This will held the clue to who the parents were of James Whitlock (1650's-1716) who heads the huge WHITLOCK25 family the Whitlocks of Virginia. His parents were Robert's brother Richard Whitlock (1616-1666) and his wife Joane.

Due to the import of this discovery, most of the articles in this issue are related to this part of the family. They include the will of Robert Whitlock (1618-1671), an article about his brother Richard Whitlock (1616-1666) and an article about Agnes (de la Beche) Whitlock and her de la Beche ancestors. Other articles for this issue relate to the several generations of London Whitlocks who were goldsmiths in the 16th and 17th centuries. Unfortunately there was no room for pictures in this issue.

While still in Salt Lake City, having done so well with the pre-1858 wills, I then tackled the post 1858 wills. I was able to download the indexes and summaries of both the Whitlock (128) and Whitelock (113) wills (R3230). I spent the last couple of days downloading images of the actual wills from 1858 to 1873 (R3242-R3267). A great collection of wills and addition to our files. Over the next few months I will work on cataloguing and cross-referencing each of these documents and uploading them to our website.

I did manage to also do some work on my own family while I was in Salt Lake City. There is a series of four small portraits from my mother's family and I was able to finally determine they were from Alderbridge, Worcestershire and were of Rev. William Price, his wife Hannah, his daughter Sarah Price and his son-in-law Thomas Ward. Sarah & Thomas were married in 1823 at Alderbridge and Rev. William Price officiated. The portraits were painted for the wedding of Thomas & Sarah and we knew the older couple were Sarah's parents but we did not know their names. I also found Rev. William Price's will and the will of his daughter Mary. I shared copies of the portraits with the Alderbridge Historical society and they got one of the local parish council to send me a photograph of Alderbridge church and the plaque on the wall dedicated to Hannah the wife of Rev. William Price. This gave me her name as Rev. Price's will only mentioned "my wife" and never gave her name. Rev. Price was at Alderbridge from 1812 until his death at 80 in 1830. He was therefore 73 at the time of his daughter's marriage and when his portrait was painted. His daughter, Sarah, was about 20 as she need parental permission to marry. Her husband Thomas Ward was the brother of my gggrandmother Emma Ward (1822-1896). Great to finally learn something about these portraits I had seen all my life.

I did manage to spend some time at the library on the Fold 3 site extracting more Revolutionary War pension file entries. Unfortunately since the last time I had been to the library the site had installed a new indexing system and the 662 Whitlock entries were now sorted in a completely different way and I had to try and figure out which ones I had not extracted previously. I had done over 400 so it was a time consuming process to determine which ones I had already done.

The trip to Salt Lake City is always fun and although our group on this trip was small we enjoyed sharing each other's finds each day. For anyone seriously doing genealogical research it is an amazing experience and totally recommended.

I have continued working on the 1850 US census for New York and have almost completed that. Once that is done I will upload the images to the website. I did finally get the major update to the website completed recently. While the documents I have scanned over the past couple of years have all been uploaded as I catalogued them, the references to these items contained in my databases do not show when you search the databases until I update them. This has now been done, adding a huge amount of new information to the several databases the website contains. I constantly use the website "Search" feature found by clicking on the "Sources" tab on the website home page and I encourage everyone to try it from time to time to check what new information may now be available.

My friend, Malcolm Toms who works at the University of British Columbia, was able to download for us a copy of *ZQOTOMIA, or, Observations on the Present Manners of the English: Briefly Anatomizing the Living with the Dead. With an useful detection of Montebanks of both Sexes.* (R3269) This book was written by Richard Whitlock (1616-1666) and was published in 1654. The book is written in 17th century vernacular and contains quotes in Greek, Latin and French so is interesting but not easy reading. Richard was obviously not in favour of women becoming doctors and refers to them as "Quacking Dalilahs". "I am confident a practicing Rib shall kill more than a jaw-bone of an Asse; and a Quacking Dalilah, than a valiant Sampson."

I am still working my way through the previous research disc from Lawrence Otis. There are some interesting applications for membership in various Sons of the American Revolution societies (R3271, R3272, R3273 & R3281) from the early 1900's. Most of these added descendants to these families that were not in our files.

One of my regulars in the Family History section of the Cloverdale Library advised me recently that he had discovered a Whitlock married to one of his Hatfields. This turned out to be part of the WHITLOCK16 family and as Brett is researching the family of movie mogul, Louis B. Meyer, he has come across some interesting movie connections concerning Whitlocks. His latest contribution was a copy of a movie poster regarding Lloyd Theodore Whitlock (1891-1965) (R3270)

I was pleased to receive the information from Mandane Ennis (X7279) regarding the George family of Halifax Co., Virginia. Robert Whitlock and Elizabeth George were married Oct. 12, 1808 in Halifax Co., and you often receive information about the Whitlock families from the research into the collateral lines. In this case it told us Elizabeth was born about 1787 the daughter of Jordon & Rosemond (Maddox) George and that the George and Whitlock families lived in the same area of Halifax & Caroline Co.'s, in Virginia. Thanks also to Mandane for the great collection of photographs (PH1442-PH1448)

The information from the churchyard of Stanhope, Durham (X7304) provided some details about the family of Rev. Edward Whitlock (1773-1821) who the Curate of St. John's Chapel, Stanhope at the time of his death. Edward is part of the WHITLOCK78 family, the Whitlocks of Skelton, Cumberland.

A couple of the miscellaneous items give further incites into the lives of members of the WHITLOCK02H chart. X7305 relates to a 1732 lease naming Hester (Leche) Whitlock of Bath and X7306 relates to documents from Mary (Maddison) Whitlock's family, including Lady Apollina Hall after whom she likely named her daughter Apollina. Jennifer Hart continues to post great pictures from the WHITLOCK21 family on the Whitlock Global Facebook page. Bit by bit I am copying them and adding them to our collection.

This issue includes the Main Line of Karma Lee Collins who is the first member of the WHITLOCK25 family to have her Main Line show the connection to the WHITLOCK02H family. See Main Line #ML419.

Lots of great information since the last issue - my thanks to everyone who contributed new material.

WILL OF ROBERT WHITLOCK 1670

In the Name of God Amen the Second day of March in the year of our Lord God One Thousand Six Hundred and Seaventy, I Robert Whitlocke of Wokingham in the County of Berks Gent being in health of Body and mind praised be God Do this present day and year aforesaid make and ordaine This my Last Will and Testament in manner and forme following Imprimus I committ my Soul into the Hands of my deare Redeemer the Lord Jesus Christ my Saviour therein assuredly through his Richteousnesse only to be made ptakers of Eternall Life and I committ my Body to the earth whereof it was formed to be buried at the discretion of my Executor thereafter named and as for my worldly goods wherewith God hath blessed mee I dispose of them as followeth First I leave to my Son Richard Whitlock and give to him and to his Heires for ever All that my Manno.s of Beaches my Capital Messuages called the Hoult House with the Lands thereunto belonging viz the Causy Close the Parke Close home pit close the Moores Higwell meade the Coppice the Close butting on the Coppice to the South and on Matthews Green on the North the ..ease [Close butting on the two Pidles John ... holds on the North and the] meade being in all Twelve Severall tenements by estimation fifty acres...at present in my occupation together with the Quitrents due to the Mannor and also I bequeath to my Son Richard Whitlock and his Heires for ever all Those my lands called Telehouse Lands with their Severall Tenements now in the occupation of Widow Cowley, her Teniment with .. Severalls of Land containing Seaven acres and in John Raines possession a Teniment with five

Severall parcels of Lands containing Eleaven Acres And in Marmaduke Nevins possession a Teniment with Three Severalls of Land containing Nine Acres And in Mr. Giles Haneleys possession Two Severalls of Land called Sheepcoate I likewise give and bequeath to my Sonn Richard Whitlock and to his Heires forever my Teniments & Water Mills together with the Mill Lands now in the ... of Widow Joane Webb containing Foure and Twenty Acres in Six Severalls of Land And in the occupation of [blank] the present Miller the Mill house & the Mills with One Meadow conteyning Three Acres And also I give unto my Son Richard Whitlock Those five severall parcell of Lands bought of John Olynes at Wooshill containing Thirteene Acres now in my occupation and also These my Three Acres in Suning Mead All which said Mannor and Messuages Teniments Mills and Lands are lying and being in Wokeingham and Suning in the County of Berks Also I give and bequeath to my Son Richard Whitlock and his heires for ever All that my Messuages or Tenements with their appurtenances called Bill-hill with all the Lands thereunto belonging being severall parcell of land containing Forty Foure Acres together with the wast ground thereunto belonging in the Occupation of Thomas Webb And also One Close called Bannisters contayning five Acres in my Occupation which said Tenement and Lands are lying and being in the parish of Wokingham in the County of Wilts But if my Sonn Richard dye before he accomplish the age of One and Twenty yeares Then my Will is That my deare and loving wife Mary shall enjoy all the Rents over and above her Thirds fo the above demised Lands to my Son Richard Whitlock for and during her naturall life And then my Will is that after my wifes decease that the abovesaid Lands Shall be and remaine to the right Heires of mee Robert Whitlock And as for my Goods and Chattells wherewith the Lord hath blessed mee I bequeath and give as followeth Item I give and bequeath unto my deare and loving Wife Mary Whitlock one full Third part of my personall estate aforesaid I likewise give unto her All my household stuffe and all my Plate Item I will and bequeath unto all my children that shall be unmarried or have not been disposed of in marriage before my decease one full Third part of all my personall estate in goods moneys debts and chattells in equall portions to be devided among them respectively Provided that if any of them dye before they are of full age or are married then my Will is that his or hers or their gte so dying shall be and remaine to the survivors of my said children to be equally devided among them And out of my other Third part of my estate personall as goods debts money, chattells I give and bequeath as followeth To my Daughter Katherine Ten Pounds to my Daughter Elizabeth Two Hundred Pounds if she be not nor hath not been married at my decease but if she hath been married my Will is she is to have Ten Pounds only Item I give and bequeath to my Son Richard One Hundred Pounds And to my daughter Mary I give her Two Hundred Pounds & To my daughter Apolina Two Hundred Pounds And I give to my Daughter Anna Two Hundred Pounds and to my Daughter Deborah Two Hundred Pounds And to my Daughter Sarah Two Hundred Pounds Provided That if any of them marry before my decease Then hee her or them shall have but Tenn Pounds each upon so marrying Also Provided That if any of my said Children shall dye before they accomplish the age of One an Twenty yeares or are married Then my Will is that his hers or their part so dying shall be and remaine to the Survivors of my said Children in equall portions Item I give to my Sister Jordan Forty Shillings And to my Brother John Whitlock Forty Shillings and to my Sister in Law Joane Whitlock Widow of my Brother Richard Whitlock Tenn pounds And to my Niece Anna Whitlock Daughter of my Brother Richard Tenn Pounds **And to my Nephew James Whitlock Sonn of my Brother Richard Forty Shillings** and to my Nephew John Whitlock Forty Shillings And to all the Children of my Sister Jorden Twenty Shillings a piece Item I give to my deare and loving friend Mr. John Collins Twenty Pounds And I give to Mr. Francis Astly my loving friend Five Pounds in Plate For a remembrance Item I give Twenty Pounds to Tenn psons such as my wife shall thinke fitt Item I give to Mary Webb my servant Foure pounds And to John Barnard my Servant Forty Shillings And to widow Greene Twenty Shillings And to her Sonn John Greene Forty Shillings The Overplus of the Third part of my Goodes and Chattells I bequeath as followeth Item I give to my deare wife Mary Twenty Pounds And what shall then remaine I give and bequeath to all my Children that as my decease are unmarried by even and equall portions to be devided amongst them I do make and appoint Mary my loving Wife Execute of this my will Thus beseeching the Lord Almighty to be the Chief portion of them all And the Lord Jesus Christ my Sonnes portion I conclude this my Will In wisse whereof I have hereunto set my hand & Seale Robert Whitlock

This Robert Whitlock was baptized May 13, 1618 at St. Peter le Poer, London. He was the son of Richard Whitlock d. 1642 and Katherine Brechette (1595-1649). Like his father, Robert became a successful London merchant. He was a member of the Himmers Co. of Clapham Surrey. He married in the 1640's Mary Maddison the daughter of Ralph Maddison and Elizabeth Hall. There are documents from the 1650's regarding Robert's ownership of Whittington Manor once in the possession of his wife's Aunt Lady Apollina Hall.

There are occasional glimpses of Robert's life in the documents that have been preserved in the archives. In 1642 together with his mother Katherine (Brechette) Whitlock, Robert set up a charity in Wokingham as directed by his father's Will. It was for the relief of the poor in Wokingham to be paid on St. Thomas' day.

Originally the charity owned the following lands and properties: a cottage (5 tenements) in Langborough Lane or Down Street (now Denmark Street), a close in Little Langborough (1½a) and 5a in Langborough Common Field. On inclosure in 1817 these lands exchanged for a close in Birchen Inhams (6a) and two in Langborough Common Field (3a). In 1856 all the land and property was sold and the proceeds invested.

During the Interregnum Robert Whitlock joined with other London merchants in 1658 to petition the Protector regarding the fishing trade with Ireland. In particular for the same bonding conditions to apply in Ireland for the loading of pilchards as are applied in England.

In 1664 Robert was called before Elias Ashmole (1617-1692) celebrated chemist and antiquarian in his role as Windsor Herald of Arms to prove his descent and his right to the Whitlock coat of arms. It is recorded that the meeting took place at the sign of the Bear in Reading, Berkshire March 11, 1664/5. Robert entered his descent from his grandfather John Whitlock (1509?-1589) of Wokingham, Berkshire. He claimed the right to the Whitlock arms quartered with the de la Beche arms. In *Liber Familicus* his grandfather is recorded as marrying quite late in life, above age 45. There is no record of when Robert's father was born but it was likely in the 1570's or 80's.

Robert and Mary had at least 11 children several of which do not appear to have survived infancy. By 1664 only one son is shown Richard Whitlock aged 10 in 1662. At least three daughters married, Mary to James Ball, Apollina to Seth Ratchiff and Deborah to Mr. Prathy. From Robert's Will you would assume Katherine was also married as he leaves her only £10 as opposed to £200 that he leaves to his unmarried daughters. No mention of a married name is given. When Mary (Maddison) Whitlock makes her Will in 1695 there is no mention of either Katherine and or Elizabeth Whitlock. We know Elizabeth died in 1674 so it is assume she never married.

Their son Richard Whitlock (1651-1706) died in Wokingham but there is no record of him marrying or having children. Little is known of his life. He is shown living in Amersham, Bucks in 1688 where he joins other residents to appeal the rates. Between 1683 and 1698 there is a series of leases and agreements between Richard Hawes and Richard Whitlock regarding the Manor of Beches in Wokingham, resulting eventually in Richard Hawes purchasing the manor ending more than 200 years of Whitlock relationship with Wokingham and the Manor of Beches. In the 1960's the old Manor House burned but Holt House (part of the original Manor) remains to this day as a girls school. (See WFA March 2013 issue)

So far we have not traced any descendants of Robert Whitlock and Mary Maddison through the Ball, Ratcliff or Prathy families.

RICHARD WHITLOCK (1616-1666)

Richard Whitlock was baptized Nov.17, 1616 at St. Peter le Poer's Church, London - he was destined to live through some turbulent times. Lucky for him he was the eldest son of a wealthy Wokingham, Berkshire family. His father was also Richard Whitlock, the sixth child in the family, his father's eldest brother, William, being Lord of the Manor of Beches, in Wokingham, Berkshire. By his death in 1642 Richard owned the Manor of Beches, and was Lord of the Manor, his brother William, having first mortgaged the Manor and then sold it to Richard. In 1642, on the death of his father, Richard Jr found himself Lord of the Manor.

While Richard's father was schooled at Merchant Taylors in the ways of business and became a very successful London merchant, Richard was sent to Oxford and thrived in academia. Entering Magdalen College at 16, in four years he took a degree of Bachelor of Arts and in 1638 was elected a fellow of All Souls College. By 1640 he had a Bachelor of Civil Law degree.

By his father's will of 1642 Richard inherited the Manor of Beches and by 1644 he had sold the Manor to his younger brother Robert, who like his father was a successful London Merchant. Richard appears to have concentrated on academic pursuits and in 1654 published the book *Zootomia - or Observations on the Present Manners of the English*. It is not clear what role Richard Whitlock played during the Civil War and the Interregnum but Anthony a Wood comments that, following the restoration in 1660, Whitlock "wheeled about and took holy orders". He served at Foxton in 1660 and Stowe in 1661 and finally at Ashford in Kent. Richard appears to have found being a cleric challenging and it is recorded he did not get along with his parishioners at Ashford. He took to expressing his frustrations by etching sentences in Greek, Latin and English in the glass panes of the Vicarage House in Ashford.

Sometime after his father died in 1642 Richard married Joane ?? and we knew they had a least two children Anna Whitlock bp.Feb.4,1647 at St. Margaret's, Westminster, London and Elizabeth Whitlock bp.Apr.18,1648 and br.Mar.26,1649 St. Dionis Backchurch, London. What recently came to light in the Will of Richard's brother, Robert is that Richard and Joane had a third child, James Whitlock, likely born in the 1650's. The will tells us James survived childhood and was alive in 1670 when his Uncle Robert made his will.

This James Whitlock is the one we have been searching for for so many years. I am not sure how I had missed the reference to him when I first had access to Robert's Will in the 1970's but my extract taken at that time omits the reference to James. We know the James Whitlock who heads the Virginia families was born in the 1650's and was related to the Whitlocks of Wokingham family as he acted as their Power of Attorney in the 1680's when the Rappahannock, Virginia lands belonging to Thomas Whitlock (1615-1659) were inherited by Anthony Whitlock of Lambeth, Surrey. Anthony and James called each other "kinsman" although no relationship was given. We now know that Anthony Whitlock's grandfather Thomas Whitlock was a brother to James Whitlock's grandfather Richard Whitlock. We also suspect that James' wife Dorothy was the daughter of John Herne mentioned in his 1677 Will as married to _____ Whitlock of Virginia. The Herne family lived in London and John's brother William was in Maryland in the 1680's so there is a likely connection.

We have suspected for years the WHITLOCK25 family and the WHITLOCK02H family were related and the YDNA tests confirmed they shared the same YDNA. The Will of Robert Whitlock now confirms just how the families are connected. This adds six generations of Whitlocks to descendants of James Whitlock and takes these families back to the 1400's. If you trace back from Agnes de la Beche that family takes you back a further nine generations to the 1100's.

DE LA BECHE FAMILY

Agnes Whitloke, who with her husband John, head the W02H family, The Whitlocks of Wokingham was a de la Beche. Records show that she was the only daughter and heir of her father Robert De la Beche. In *Liber Familicus* page 2, Sir James Whitlock notes that in a deed dated May 12 Edward IV, Agnes called herself "*generosa*" which is the female equivalent of "*Sir*"

Her will is dated March 26, 1491 and proved in Canterbury in May 15, 1491. While she does not mention any of her children, she does leave her estates to her husband John Whitloke. Her will mentions to the church of St. Augustine in Canterbury which is now a National Heritage site outside the walls of Canterbury cathedral. Canterbury cathedral is also dedicated to St. Augustine but the church mentioned in Agnes' will is the one outside the walls. The de la Beche family owned the Manor of Beches near Wokingham back to the 1100's and the deeds to this manor have been used to determine a likely outline of her ancestors. The following was compiled by Julian Wyatt in the 1960's:

While it is not the Whitlock family the ancestors of Agnes de la Beche do take each of her descendants back another nine generations to the 1100's. I have not found a lot of research into the de la Beche family and hopefully some of the descendants of this part of the Whitlock family will be interested in exploring this family further.

ALICE WHITLOCKE'S WILL 1616

In the name of God Amen I Alice Whitlocke of London widow being sicke & weak in body but of p'fect memorie (thanks be to god) doe ordaine & make this my last will & testament in forme followinge Imprimus I bequeath my Soule to almightie god & my body to the earth to be buried in the p'sh church of St. Marie Steyninge london, Item I doe will & bequeath to Thomas Whitlocke & Alice Whitlocke children of my sonn Henry Whitlocke Deceased the some of ten pounds to be equallie devided betwixt them Item my will & desire is that the Lease of my dwellinge house shalbe sould by my executor hereafter named to the best value & that all my goodes & implement of Houshold shalbe appraysed & sold by my said executor & that the money ther uppon growinge the said legacie to the children of my sonne Henry Whitlocke & my burial charges beinge discharged shalbe equallie devided betwixt & amoungst my sonne Richard Whitlocke, my Daughter Alice Baldey widowe & my Daughter Thamasin Hodgekins wife of John Hodgekins, Item I doe ordaine & make my welbeloved Friend William ?arthwarke of London Bricklayer & Tyler sole executor of this my last will In Wittnes whereof I have hereunto sett my hand & Seall Dated the three & twentieth day of Julii Anno Dom 1616

Alice's will was proved August 7, 1616. This will fills in several blanks in our records and provided information that there were at least four generations of Whitlocks who were goldsmiths in London in the 16th and 17th centuries.

Alice's maiden name was Jonson. She married Thomas Whitlock November 24, 1551 in Uxbridge, London. Thomas was a goldsmith. His will was made May 3/4, 1609 and proved May 15, 1609 St. Mary Stainings, London. One of the witnesses to his will was his daughter Alice Bauldrey. Their son Henry Whitlock, also a goldsmith died in 1608 in St. Mary Stainings, London. Henry was married to Blanch Williams December 3, 1593 at St. Gregory by St. Paul, London. Another son, Richard Whitlock, goldsmith of St. Vedast was having children 1596-1609. There is also Richard Whitlock, goldsmith who died in St. Andrews Holborn, London in 1670. His will mentions his brother Hugh Whitlock which confirms him as a son of Richard Whitlock, Goldsmith of St. Vedast. This makes three generations of London, Goldsmiths, Thomas Whitlock (1520's-1609), Richard Whitlock (1550's-1619) & Richard Whitlock (1607-1670).

Further information has been received from Sophia Tobin, Library Secretary to the Goldsmiths Company in London. Ms Tobin kindly provided details on the apprenticeship records that they hold. Research by Gerald Taylor indicates that there were two Thomas Whitlocks who were goldsmiths, a father and son. This would indicate that the Thomas Whytlock, goldsmith who died in St. John Zacharies Parish, London in 1557 was the father of Thomas Whitlock who died in 1609. His will is dated October 18, 1557 and is proved in London November 26, 1557. He mentions his "welbeloved wife" Anne and directs "her be good unto her poor children and myne..." This is therefore four generations of goldsmiths in one family.

“T.F. Reddaway who researched the early history of the Goldsmith’s Company notes that Thomas as ‘sometime apprentice to John Hollowey’ in 1560 in Court minute book K, p.114. In the same book, Thomas is described as being at one time a servant of Garreth Waynesick, along with his brother Alberrow or Albert, who was made free by patrimony on 30 August 1560”. Albert Whitlock also of St. John Zacharies left a will proved May 20,1572.

Sophia also mentions Henry Whitlock’s apprentice record and that of his brother Richard: “We have a ‘Hary (sic) Whitlock’, son of Thomas, who was apprenticed to his master Richard Williames (sic) in 1578 (Apprentice Book 1, page 6). It appears he did not become free.” “Richard Whitlock, son of Thomas, was apprenticed to Richard Williams in 1582 (Apprentice Book 1, page 42). He was made free on 6 April 1593.” This confirms that Richard Whitlock was the son Thomas & Alice (Jonson) Whitlock. Likely Albert was older than Richard by 4 years assuming they were apprenticed at the same age. If they were both apprenticed at 14 Henry would be born about 1564 and Richard 1568.

The last generation also shows in the apprenticeship records. “Richard Whitlock was apprenticed to John Langton and turned over to John Kettle (Apprentice Book 1, page 251). Apprenticed in 1621, he was made free on 19 November 1630”. Richard would have been 14 in 1621. He was the son of Richard Whitlock and grandson of Thomas & Alice (Jonson) Whitlock.

RICHARD WHITLOCK, LONDON, GOLDSMITH WILL 1670

While I don't have a copy of this will, I did take extracts in the 1970's while I lived in England. We now know that all five Whitlocks who were Goldsmiths in London are all from the same family. Extracts from his will show his wife was Alice. He wished to be buried in St. Andrew's, Holborn where he was living at the time he made his will.

Richard was in debt to his cousin Richard Barnes for £200 He leave bequests to cousins Edward Sager, Edward Taler and his wife's sister's son.

One third of his estate to niece Rebecca Howell? One third to niece Elizabeth Mortlock. He mentions his wife's former husband and his brother Hugh Whitlock.

Land holdings include land and tenements in Borough Greene and Bullingham, Cambridge. Freehold messuage in St. John Street.

There were additional bequests to Arthur Hollingsworth, apothecary, John Wirrell? Sopemaker, Moses Marsh, Vintner and John Steele, Esq. all of St. Andrew's parish.

He mentions his nephew Richard Barnes and cousins William Howell and M. Mortlock.

Richard's will is dated Jun.29, 1670 and was proved October 10, 1670

May 1,1668 Richard Barnes, widower about 34 was married to Martha Evanson abt 20 the ward of Richard Whitlock, Goldsmith.

Richard Whitlock was married twice but no children are mentioned in his will and it is assume there are no descendants.
