

WILL OF HENRY WHITLOCK 1873

This is the last Will and Testament of me Henry Whitlock of Eastcombe in the parish of Bisley in the County of Gloucester I do hereby give unto my beloved wife Elizabeth Whitlock the whole of my property of every sort and Kind whatever and wheresoever for the payment of my just debts and her sole use and benefit I hereby appoint my said Wife my sole Executrix of this my Will and Testament for all the purposes what the law doth and hath provided Signed this the third day of June 1873.

Signed by the said Testator as his last Will and Testament in the presence of we present at the same time who at his request in his presence and in the presence of each other have subscribed our names as witnesses.

Proved at Gloucester the 28th day of November 1873 by the affirmation of Elizabeth Whitlock Widow the Relict the sole Executrix to whom Administration was granted.

The Testator The Reverend Henry Whitlock was late of Eastcombe in the parish of Bisley in the County of Gloucester Baptist Minister and died on the 5th day of November 1873 at Eastcombe aforesaid.

Henry Whitlock is part of the WHITLOCK01 family, the Whitlocks of Langtree, Devon. He and his wife Elizabeth Webber had three sons and a daughter Elizabeth Mary. There is no record of sons Elijah Webber Whitlock and Charles Henry Whitlock marrying but Elizabeth Mary Whitlock was married to Benjamin Churchill in 1870 and had three children. Her daughter Elizabeth Mary Minnie Churchill born in 1876 married John Thomas Henry Callis. Their daughter Mary Lillian Callis married Thomas William Buttifant in 1921. Their son Jeffery Thomas Buttifant is the only descendant of this part of the family that I have been able to trace.
