Another very busy quarter with some great new information being sent in. With the connection last year of the huge Whitlocks of Virginia family (W25) with the Whitlocks of Wokingham family (W02H) it has opened new and very interesting areas of research to members of this family. Particularly the collateral lines that this part of the Whitlock family married into. Work on the DelaBeche, Herne, Paske, Goldsborow and Planner families, all ancestors to this part of the family has expanded our knowledge considerably. I have included a great example in this issue of how collateral lines can provide missing details about the Whitlock family as well as correct errors that have occurred in the past. See the article on the Will of William Planner and my apologies - every article in this issue is going to relate to the WHITLOCK02H family.

I recently spent some time in the hospital having an appendix operation and used the down time to transcribe the Will of Alice (Paske) Herne 1628. It kept my mind busy as I had not had a chance to read the Will beforehand as the hand writing was a little difficult to read. The Will was amazing for several reasons and hopefully resulted an interesting article for this issue of the Newsletter.

I am working with Alan Whitlock to determine how the Whitlocks of Bristol fit into the family and what other families connect to this line that Alan has traced back to the 1500's. They were involved in the shipping business out of Bristol and we are trying to determine if Thomas Whitelock, the Loyalist British ships' Captain from Philadelphia, who came to New Brunswick in 1783 was also descended from this part of the family.

I am very pleased also to have made contact with Teresa Oswald-Sealy of Australia who descends from the WHITLOCK12 and WHITLOCK21 families of Yorkshire. Teresa's name has shown in the records for some years as a researcher of the Yorkshire families and I am looking forward very much to sharing research with her.

There is a short obituary in this issue for Mary S. Maxfield who, at 96, was a long time researcher and subscriber to the Newsletter and definitely one of our most senior members.

Patrick and I made our annual trek across the country again this summer but it was different this year as his Aunt Alexandra had died at 90 a few weeks before we started out. We stayed with one of her friends in Springfield, Missouri and had a very nice time remembering Alexandra and the interesting life she had experienced.

We spent some time in Little Rock, Arkansas getting to know Bill Lindsey and his husband of 43 years Steve Shafer. Bill and Steve were able to get married in Arkansas in May and we attended the reception they held in June. Bill is part of the WHITLOCK25 family that we connected back to England and to the WHITLOCK02H family last year and we spent some interesting time helping him get to know his ancestors from the 16th and 17th centuries. The Will of William Planner included in this issue, arrived while I was at Bill's and we reviewed the changes this made to his ancestors together. Patrick was very interested to meet Bill as Bill's YDNA results had shown him his ancestry was likely from the Lynch family and as both Bill and Patrick's Lynch ancestors were from Ireland and both had connections to South Carolina and Arkansas they wanted to compare research. A very interesting visit and likely a place and people we will try to visit again. See Main Line 442 in this issue. As we were in Arkansas we spent sometime visiting places Patrick's ancestors had lived and managed to find a couple of cemeteries with relatives including the one where his great-grandfather Lynch is buried.

When researching the many collateral families connected to the various branches of the Whitlock family, you are always hoping you will find one where the family have set up the same research repository as we have for Whitlock. I was therefore thrilled to find as I did some preliminary research into the Paske family that there was a Paske one-name organization and that they were fellow members of Guild of One-Name Studies that the Whitlock Family Association belongs to. I have made contact with Teresa Paske and am looking forward very much to sharing research with her. Both of us were swamped with other commitments when we first made contact but we have traded some documents already and I know we are going to be able to help each other.

One of the items I found while in Arkansas was the reference to an obituary for Obediah Whitlock for 1875 in the Arkansas Gazette (R3742). Obediah was the son of Jonathan & Jemima (Cain) Whitlock and hopefully finding a copy of this obit will give us more detail on this part of the family. Rita Silva has been working on this family and recently sent in a copy of Alexander Cain's Will 1805 (R3731) which mentions his daughter Jemima Whitlock. We know there were eight children and so far we have only been able to trace descendants of Jane Whitlock who married Thompson Gregory Bates about 1827 in Union Co., South Carolina. I have long felt there are likely connections to several of the other Whitlock families with South Carolina origins.

I finally finished cataloguing the information on the April 2013 disc from Lawrence Otis and have started work on the next one. Needless to say Lawrence is way ahead of me and another disc arrived in the mail the other day. With the additions from Lawrence plus a great collection of Glasgow documents from Bob Whitlock our Certificate collection has grown to 4215 documents. Bob Whitlock gave me access to his on-line version of the WHITLOCK26 chart and I did a major update to this part of the family. Bob has made some assumptions regarding the Irish families from Co. Armagh but I have included the connections as they do make some logical sense and are likely.

Charles Coe also directed me to his on-line family tree for the WHITLOCK28 family and I added great new detail on the descendants of Malachi Whipple & Mary Elizabeth (Whitlock) Coe to that family.

More and more I find myself using the Find a Grave website to add great detail to the charts in our files. In addition to photographs of the actual grave sites, many include photographs and documents relating to members of the family. My thanks to Valerie McEachern for sending in her great collection of photographs of her WHITLOCK22 descendants of Joshua Spicer & Charlotte Northmore (Whitlock) Wood of Australia. (PH1658-PH1666).

Interest in the Whitlock YDNA study continues although I have not received any new information since the June issue.

Great information from everyone who shared their research and much appreciated. I do try to keep the files current and up to date as much as possible but from time to time it takes me awhile to catch up. I know the website has not been updated for awhile and I will be working on that over the next couple of months. As Summer winds down and we head into Fall there will be more time for Family Research and I look forward to hearing about the new finds and discoveries researchers are making.

WILL OF WILLIAM PLANNER 1569

In the name of god amen the xvj daie of Julie in the yeare of o' lorde god a thousande fyve hundred threescore and nyne and in the xjth yeare of the raigne of o' Sovereigne Ladie Elizabeth by the grace of god of england, Franncce and Ireland quene defendor of the faithe of' I william Planner thelder of wockingham in the countie of wilts clothier beinge sike in bodie but whole and perfect of remembrannce thanks be gyvven to almightie god consideringe nothinge to be for certaine to mind as Death and nothinge soe uncertaine as the tyme of Deathe/ doe ordaine & make this my testamente conteynge my last will as well concerninge certaine of my landes and Tenementes which I am nowe seized of, As of all my goodes and cattelles bothe moveable and unmoveable in manno' and forme hereafter followinge / first I give and bequeathe my Soule to almightie god my creato' desireinge his mercyfull goodnes to forgive and remytt all my synnes, and to make me partaker of the heavenlie heritage thorowe the mearite of Jesus christe my readeamer whose precious death hath mearited for all, and savethe all that doe pute their whoale truste and confidence in god the father by Jesus christe, Item I give and bequeath my earthelie bodie to the earthe to be buried in the church of alhallowes in wockingham aforesaide on the sowthe side where my anncesters doe lie, Item I give and bequeathe to the mother church of Sar' iijjd, Item I give and bequeathe to the poore mens boxe of wockingeam aforesaide S / Item I give and bequeathe to Thomas Planner my sonne my Tenemente in the peachestreete in wockingeam aforesaide called fletchers wherein the same Thomas late dwelled / and one littell Tenemente theretoe adioynge, sometyme one william Glovers, and my Tenemente in the Rowthe Streete called hatches wherein nowe dwellethe Richarde Gennene, And my closes of lands called Scanncheir lieng together. and sometyme percell of the channtrie lands, and one close of lande called the holteclose nowe in the teanure of Cleamente Danburie sometyme pertcell of the saide channturye lands, beinge nigh the highe waie leadinge from wokingham aforesaide towarde Readinge To have and to hold all the saide landes and Tenements with their appurtenannces to the foresaide Thomas Planner and to theires of his bodie lawfullie begottenn / To hold of the cheefe lorde or lordes of the fee or fees by the rentes and services thereof dewe and of righte custome, And for lacke of yssue of his bodie lawfullie begottenn so revert and retourne to the righte heires of me the said william Planner forever / And alsoe I give and bequeathe to the saide Thomas Planner a standinge bedsteede, A fetherbedd / a bolster, a paire of canvas sheetes / a coverlett, A planck table with a paire of tresles, and Tenne poundes of lawfull monnye of england / Item I give and bequeathe to Richard Planner my sonne my Tenement with a gardeneor plott thereto adioynge wherein nowe dwellethe william Sowthy scituate and beinge in wokingham aforesaide on the south este side of the foresaide streete called the peachestreete / And one close of land with a littell meadowe plott thereto adioynge henge on the northe side of Patins Asshegrene, and nowe likewise in the teanure of the same william Sowthy / and one other close of lande nowe alsoe in the teanure of the same william Sowthy beinge beyonde the littelle oke besides the cawsie leadeinge froe wokingham aforesaide towards nomdeso' and my Tenemente called Tapeners with the close of lande thereto adioynge w'ch I boughte of one Richarde Hone nowe in the teanure of John Hawtrells, and ij closes of lande lieinge over againste the same Tenemente which was sometyme percell of saide channtrie lands, and nowe likewise in the tenure of the saide John Hawtrells / and three Tenementes adioynge in wokingham aforesaide in the foresaide peachestreete in thone nowe dwelleth John otwaie / in an other Betteris watson, and in the third margarete Pegatt To have and to houlde all the saide landes and Tenements w' th their appurtenannces to the foresaide Richard Planner and to theires of his bodie lawfullie begotten / To hold of the cheefe lorde or lordes of the fee or fees by the rentes and services thereof dewe and righte custome / And for lacke of yssue of his bodie lawfullie begottenn to revert and retourne to the righte heires of me the said william Planner forever / And also I give and bequeathe to the saide Richard Planner / A standinge bedsteede / a brass pott vj platters iijj or eare disshes, on kettell of iij gallons, and my buckecome hangeinges inthe parlo' / Item I give and bequeath to william Planner my sonne all my howses, and all my landes lieinge and beinge in the p'ishe of bynfield nowe in the teanure of Edward Holton, and iij closes of lande now likewise in the teanure of the same Edward beinge in the parisshe of wockingeam aforesaide sometyme percell of the saide channtrie lande / and iij puddelles of lande beinge at Assheridge, and nowe in the teanure of Thomas Gorwaie / And halfe an acre of lande beinge in the parisshe of warefeelde nowe in the teanure of the foresaide Edward Holton To have and to houlde all the saide houses and landes w' th their appurtenannces to the foresaide william Planner and to theires of his bodie lawfullie begottenn / To holde of the cheefe lorde or lordes of the fee or fees by the rentes and services thereof dewe and of right custome / And for lack of yssue of his bodie lawfullie begottenn / to

reverte and retourne to the righte heires of me the said william Planner forever / And alsoe I give and bequeathe to the saide william Planner my sonne fouretie pounds of lawfull monnye of englande to be paide to the same william Planner at the daie of his mariage orelles at his full age of xxiiij yeares w'ch of them as shall happen to be firste / The w'ch fouretie poundes is in the handes of his m' John Gilborne as it appeareth in and by A recteinie obligacon' / And if it happenn the saide william Planner to die before he shalbe maried orelles be of the saide full aige of xxiiij yeares then I will that my executors hereafter to be named shall receive of the saide John Gilborne the saide fouretie poundes w'thin one monnethe nexte after the decease of the same will'm Planner / and paie it to all my children then overlyveinge the saide william equallie to be devidid amongst them / And further I give and bequeath ot the saide william Planner my sonne my silvertt / my golde ring, a pewter basonn vj pewter platters foure eare dyshes and ... And if it happenn the same cleamente to die before he shalbe married orelles be of the saide full aige of xxiiij yeares then I will that the saide fouretie poundes shalbe paide to all of my children then overlyveing the same Cleamente equallie to be devidid amongst them And further I give and bequeathe to the saide Cleamente Planner my silver salte with the cover fyve silver spoones A standeinge bedsteede w' a fetherbedd and a fether boulder / A coverlet the thirde beste, my beste foundinge table in the hall w'th the ioyndfom one thereto belonginge / my cobberde in the haulle w' the basonn and ewer w'ch standethe thereon , A cobbarde clothe twee bell candelstickes, A greate candewens A brass pott of the myddell sorte, a chafinge disshe my beste water chaffer of brass, A coffer w'ch nowe standethe in the parlo' / A paire of the c.... sheetes ij ioyned stooles, and an Ironebeame with a paire of scalles / And halfe hundred weight of larde, A todde weight of ledd a vL a vjL a vijL, an viiiijL / all of led / Item I give and bequeathe to my sonne in lawe John Whitlock / and to Agnes my daughter nowe the wife of the same John, a pidle of lande lying at beare lane nowe in the teanure of the same John sometye percell of the saide channtreye lande / To have & to holde the saide pudle of lande with thappurtenannces to the saide John Whitlock and Agnes his wife, and to theirs of their two bodies begottenn / To holde of the cheefe lorde of the fee by the rentes and services thereof dewe and of righte custome and for lacke of yssue of their ij bodies, begottenn to reverte and retourne to the righte heires of me the saide william Planner forever / Item I give and bequeathe to marthae Planner my daughter fouretie poundes of lawfull monnye of england to be paide to the same Marthae at the daie of her marriage orelles at her full aige of xx yeares w'ch of them as shall happen to be first / And if it happenn the same Marthae to die before she be married orelles be of the saide full aige of xx yeares / then I will that the saide xlb shalbe paide to all my children then overlyveinge the same marthae equallie to be devidid amongstest them / And alsoe I give and bequeathe to the saide marthae a cove / a ioyned bedsteede standeinge in my owne chamber where I doe use to lodge w't the curteines of grene and redd saie no't my beste fetherbedd a feather boulder ij feather pillowes with ij of the beste beste pillowbearers / a flock bedd, a paire of blannkettes, my beste coverlet, A paire of hollon sheetes, A xperinge sheete with A blacke seame / a draper table clothe, ij table napkins of hollon mybeste greate caudron my beste panne my beste chafinge disses my beste cammock table clothe vi table napkins Twoe of the beste candelstickes iij brasse pottes / A greater and a smaller my beste kettle viij platters iij pottingers ij saucers, a posuet, A longe blank ..dresser standeinge in my owne lodgeinge chamber / ij ale tubbes ij kevers, a warming panne vj silver spoannes a hangeinge chaffers a basen mortar w't the pestle, A charger, a stone mortar with the pestle my beste trivett a paire of pott hokes my rodden chaire w'ch standethe in my foresaide owne lodgeing chamber / A quishoin of neadell worke and the side sadle / Item I give and bequeathe to bridget Planner my daughter fouretie poundes of lawfull monnye of england / To be paide to the same Bridgett at the daie of her marriage orelles at the full aige of xviiij yeares w'ch of them as shall happen to be first / And if it happenn the same bridget to die before she be married orelles be of the saide full aige of xviiij yeares then I will that the saide xll shalbe paide to all my children then overlyvinge the same bridget equallie

to be devided amongstesthem / And alsoe I give and bequeathe to the said bridget a maser with a bande of silver and guilte A standeinge bedsted w't featherbedd a flockebedd / A feather boulder a covered of red and blewe lyste a paire of hollon sheetes .. coppers vj bell candellsticks vj platters v potingers and ij saucers / Item I give and bequeathe to my daughter Margarete Whitlock's fyve children evry one of them vjs viiid a pece / Item I give and bequeathe to my daughter Agnes whitlock fyve children evry one of them vjs viiid a pece / Item I give and bequeathe to my daughter Joanne [heath?].evry one of them vjs viiid a pece / Item I give and bequeath to Alice Sergente of readeinge xs, Item I give and bequeathe to Agnes Parkins xs / Item I give and bequeath to my godsonne william planner the sonne of william Planner of Stevens....[Item I] give and bequeathe to Alice Planner one of the daughters of my brother Thomas Planner deceased vjs viiid Item [I give and bequeathe] to Anne Planner the daughter of Richarde Planner A cowe / Item I give and bequeathe to Cleament Planner the sonne of the same Richarde vjs viiid Item I give and bequeathe to Dorothe Planner & frannes Planner and ... Planner the children alsoe of the same Richard evrye one of them iij a pece Item I give and bequeath to Johane Pittle the wife of John Pittle the younger iij a pece Item I give and bequeathe to henrie Butler my servanntre a bedsteede / a flockebedd, A boulder and a coverlete the same which he liethe on, a littell kettell a candlestick and xxs of monye Item I give and bequeathe to william Gennene my godsonne, and sarvannte ij paire of fullers sheares my course of handles my Curlinge Irones and xs in monnye The residue of all my goodes and cattalles bothe moveable and unmoveable and not bequeathed I doe give them freele and whoalie unto my eldest sonne John Planner whom I doe consititute ordaine and make to be my true and soale executo' of this my p'nte testamente and last will / and I doe ordaine and make my ij sonnes in lawe John Whitlock and Jerome Whitlock and the forenamed Richard Planner my cosyne, to be my supervisors of this my p'nte testamente and laste will desireinge // them to take the paines to see that it maye be truelie performed accordinge to my true intente & meaninge herein / and I give ...and evry one of them inrecompence for their paines xxs a peece / In wtnes that this is my verry true testamente and last will that all other willes and note of willes whatso ever heretofore by me made or caused to be made in what place or in whose handes forever they are shalbe utterlie frustrate void and of noe effect / I the saide william Planner have hereunto put my seale and alsoe subscribed my name w't my own hande the daie and yeare abovewritten in the p'nce of theies whose names are hereundereth subscribed w'ch are witnesses to the same that is to saie, by me william Planner, bartholomew bromley anratethert Edward by Thomas boxe and Allexander Steple boxes marke////

Probatum fuit testamentum supra scriptum coram magro walter haddon legum doctore ... prerogative canto comissario apud london terrio die Maij Anno domini Millimo quingentesimo Septuagesimo / Juramento Johannis Planner executor in testo fuit administrato omni et singlor bonoAd sra dei Evang Jurate ///

The Will of William Planner 1569 is a perfect example of a document from a collateral family that reveals unknown information about the Whitlock family. William Planner was a Clothier from Wokingham in Wiltshire (now Berkshire). He made his Will July 16, 1569 and it was proven in May 1570.

This Will corrects a mistake in the WHITLOCK02H chart where John Whitlock's wife is shown as Agnes Planner the daughter of John Planner. This Will makes it clear William Planner was Agnes' father not John as was shown on Julian Wyatt's documents R0013. Even more interesting is that William Planner mentions his daughter Margaret Whitlock and her five children in his Will. Plus he makes his two Whitlock sons in law John Whitlock and Jerome Whitlock supervisors of his Will. This confirms Margaret was married to Jerome Whitlock. There was some indication that Jerome's wife was Rachel but his Will showed his wife as Margaret. We now know she was Margaret Planner. While the children are mentioned, we only know the names of two of Jerome's children, William and Rachel. We now know that in 1569 there were at least five children. The Will also tells us that in 1569 John Whitlock and his wife Agnes were living in Beare Street, in Wokingham as the lease of the property they lived on was left to them. The Will uses the expression "*To holde of the cheefe lorde of the fee by the rentes and services thereof dewe and of righte custome*" which would indicate the property was not freehold.

Jerome Whitlock is mentioned in several documents from the 1500's. Two of his children were named in the Will of his brother Richard Whitlock (1533-1570), father of Sir James Whitlock (1570-1632). William and Rachel (Mychell) were Richard's godchildren. He left them £3 5s 8d each. When Thomas Godwin the Bishop of Bath and Wells died in 1590, he left Jerome Whitlock one of his great horses called Boulting. Jerome died in 1593 and his Will was proved by his wife Margaret and his son William.

MARY S. MAXFIELD (1918-2014)

I received an email from Patrick Blair, Mary's daughter, advising that Mary had died July 23, 2014 in Tomball, Texas age 96.

Mary was born in Shelbyville, Illinois March 23, 1918 the daughter of Claude Fielding Stiarwalt and Nina Eugenia Whitlock. Mary was very proud of her descent from the "Old 300", the pioneer settlers in Texas. We corresponded from 1989 and in her first letters she detailed her research into the family of William Whitlock the son of Robert & Aggy (Stringer) Whitlock of Virginia and later North Carolina.

We never were able to prove Robert's connection to the Virginia families and are still hoping that the latest YDNA technology will provide us some clues there.

William Whitlock and Mary White were married February 16, 1813 in St. Martinsville, Louisiana and eventually settled in Liberty, Texas while it was still part of Mexico. Patrick and I actually visited St. Martinsville in the 1990's as a result of my contact with Mary. It was an amazing place and it was hard to imagine what traveling through Louisiana must have been like in 1813!!

While Mary's research into her part of the Whitlock family finished in the early 2000's she kept her subscription to the Newsletter and requested copies of items mentioned from time to time.

She will be remembered and missed and her research will be preserved and will be passed on to future family history searchers.

WILL OF ALICE (PASKE) HERNE, 1628

In the name of God Amen *I Alice Herne* the relicte of my late most deare and loveing husband *Richard Herne* sometymes Sheriffe and Alderman of London being thorough the goodnes of god at this present in good health of bodie and ability of minde yet carefully wayting for the tyme of my change Doe willingly and readily forsake myselfe and all that I possesse to bee wth Christ the ioye of my harte, and the end of my hope And therefore dispose thereof as followeth The cheife good wch I enioye is my soul This I returne againe to god who gave it, not in that pfection wherein it was Created stamped with his own image can I return it but miserablie defaced wth mine infinite transgressions besides originall corruptions neither yet I presume to offer it unto him as it is thus defaced and defiled with sinne and wth iniquitie I know that noe uncleane thinge can enter into heaven, but as it is Washed and cleansed wth the bloud of his only begotten sonne and covered with the white robe of his righteousnes, humbly desireinge and stedfastly believing that he will accept thereof for his sake who so loved mee as that he gave himselfe afull and perfect ransom for mee, the next to my soule is the the earthly vessell of my bodie (wch at the time of there dissolucon) I recommend to the care and love of my Executors to bee decently interrred at y'er discrecon, nothing doubtinge but that as it was a Companion of the Soule heere, soe it shalbe reunited againe unto the same

hereafter, and in the daie of the resurrecon, though wormes destroye my bodie, yet I shall see god in my flesh when both together shall bee satisfied with those uncouvraneable wyes wch my redeemer hath purchased for me and not for mee onlie but for all those whoe love his appearinge As for the temporall and worldly goods wherenth the lord hath so mercifully blessed mee I give and bequeath them as is here expressed To my eldest sone Nicholas Herne I give the Teaster and vallance wrought in Tent s..ish the taffeta Curtaines thereto apptayneing wch two Taffeta windowe clothes and Cupbord clothes Suteable to the same, being in my Chamber called the Kitchn or backe house chamber To Alice Hearne my Grandchild and daughter to the said Nicolas I give one hundred pounds of monie whereas my second sonne John was by agreements to have one third parte of cetaine vessells and houshold stufte beinge at the tyme of the Said agreements in my house at Henden as appeareth by the articles of agreement betweene mee and my sonne Nicholas with third parte of utensells and houshold stufte I am desirous by this my will otherwise to dispose off And to the end that such my disposicon maie bee effectuall & available according to my intent and meaneing to such persons as by this my will I shall dispose thereof I doe give the legacies by this my will given and to bee given to my said sonnes Nicholas & John and to their wives and Children upon condicon that my said sonnes Nicholas and John before they or any of their wives or children take any benefitt of any legacy of this my will shall assent and agree to the disposicon and gift of this my will of the said third parte and of every parcell thereof And shall likewise sufficiently by their writings release and suffer quietly to bee enjoyed to and by every legatee in this my will respectively such parte of the said third parte of utensells and houshold stufte as to every such Legatee by this my will is meant or intended Otherwise all the guifts and legacies by this my will given or meant unto my said sonnes Nicholas and John their wives and Children shalbe utterly voide And such legacies as by this my will I doe give unto my said Sonne John I doe give unto him Conditionally that he before he have benefitt thereby doe quite all clayme and interest to and in the rest of my goods bequeathed and under and upon theis condicons first to bee performed I doe give unto him the said John his Wife and Children as followeth To the said John I give the bedsteed beddinge Chaires stooles and three longe Cushions of greene veluet Andirons Cobirons, tables, Carpetts and all other furniture of the great chamber as it usually stood in my life time I give him alsoe the bedsteed beddinge with the whole furniture thereof and the Court Cupbord in the little wainscott chamber next the Studdie The bedsteeds beddinge and all other furniture of the two next chambers lying on each side of the entry from theure to the great chamber I give him alsoe all my Coppers, brewinge vessells and other utensells in the brewhouse washhouse and Dayrie house To my Daughter Susan the wife of my said sonne John I give one of my pearle braceletts conteyninge the number of two hundred and twentie & five pearles To Alice Herne my Grandchild and goddaughter and daughter to the said John I give one peere of plate that is to saie a lyon of silver guilt To Joseph Herne my Grandchild and sonne to the said John I give one hundred pounds of money, To my third sonne Richard Herne I give one featherbedd, one boulster one pillowe, one rugge a paire of sheets and a pillowbeere wch I delivered to my sonne John for the use of the said Richard one other Featherbedd bedsteed bolster two blancketts Rugg quilt and a yellow Cotton coveringe a side Cupbord a chest wth drawers a trundle bedsteed and beddinge and brasse andirons in the Chamber called the Kitchin or Backehouse chamber I give him alsoe three paire of Flaxen sheets and three paire of towen sheets two pillowes three paire of pillowbeers fower tableclothes and fouer dozen of napkins flaxen, one tablecloth one dozen of napkins and one towell diaper one beere bole one wine Cupp six spoones wth heads called appostles heads one trencher salt one stoop or pott of silver and one fourth parte of my pewter I doe allot give unto the said Richard one hundred pounds of money to bee paid unto him at such tyme and upon such occasions as shall seem most fitting to my two sonnes his brethren Nicholas and John Herne wth the advice & consent of my Executors To my brother William Paske I give one suite of Damaske that is to saie one table cloth sixteene napkins one Towell and a (Table crossed out) Cupbord cloth I give him alsoe one paire of fine flaxen sheets one paire of fine pillowbeers two silver Orewells And I doe returne unto him a Diamond Ringe wth six stones wch he had formerly bestowed on mee To my broth' Samuel Paske I give one sute of Damaske that is to saie one Table Cloth sixteene napkins one Towell and a Cupbord Cloth I give him alsoe one paire of fine flaxen sheets and one paire of pillowbeers To my brother Thomas Paske I give one sute of Damaske that is to saie one Table cloth sixteene napkins one towell and a Cupbord cloth I give him alsoe one paire of fine flaxen sheets and one paire of pillowbeers To Anne Paske the wife of my brother Thomas I give one longe sike Cushion wrought wth an harte worke, two dishes mother of pearle and one hundred twentie and five pearle in one of my braceletts to whom I give that other hundred alsoe wth remayne of the said bracelett paying & allowing for the same the some of twentie and five pounds To my Sister Francis Bowles I give five pounds of money To my Sister Margaret Bradshawe I give five pounds of money To my Sister Jane Herne I give the bedsteed beddinge quilte and furniture thereto apperteyninge the Court Cupbord or chest wth drawers one high chaire two stooles, a paire of brasse andirons five shovell and tonges beinge in the Chamber over the parlor I give her alsoe six silver saucers one sute of diaper that is to saie a Table Cloth twelve napkins one towell and one Cupbord Cloth To my nephew Richard Herne eldest sonne to my Sister Jane I give the bedsteed beddinge and all the furniture in the upper chamber over the backehouse, the walnutt tree there standing in the Chamber over the parlour, one silver stoope or pot, two dozen of napkins two table clothes two pillowbeers and two paire of flaxen sheets one sute of diaper that is to saie one table cloth one dozen of napkins a towell and a Cupbord cloth and one fourth parte of my pewter To my nephew Nicholas Herne second sonne to my Sister Jane I give one halfe headed bedsteed wth a Canopie of

Dornex fower dornex Curtaines to the windowes wth the beddinge and other furniture in one of the gallerie Chambers, one beere bole one silver porrenger two dozen of Flaxen napkins two table clothes two pillowbeers two paire of sheets flaxen and one sute of diaper That is a table cloth a dozen of napkins a towell and a Cupbord cloth, and one fourth parte of my pewter To my nephew Robert Herne third sonne of my Sister Jane I give the bedsteed beddinge and all the furniture of the hothouse chamber, two dozen of napkins two table clothes two pillowbeers two paire of sheets flaxen, one sute of Diaper that is to saie one table cloth one dozen of napkins one towell and one Cupbord cloth one wine Cupp six spoones of silver wth heades called apostles heads and one fourth parte of my pewter, to my neece Marie Hearne Daughter to my Sister Jane I give the two beddsteesds bedding quilt and all other the furniture in the red chamber wherein I used to lodge together with a barred Chest a Cabynett a Court Cupbord and two redd stooles wch usually stood in that Chamber, one beere bole, one wine Cupp of silver one sute of Irish stitch wrought in silke That is one longe pillowe, and two fine pillowbeers three paire of flaxen sheets and three paire of towen sheets, one sute of diaper, that is to saie, one table cloth one dozen of napkins one towell, and one Cupbord cloth To Mr Hinton if he bee Viccar of Henden at the tyme of my decease I give five pounds And to every hired servant in my house as well maid servants as men servants I give fortie shillings in money To the six inhabitants of the six almehouses erected by my late husband in the burrough at Henden I give five pounds That is to saie twentie shillings to thinhabitants of every of such house, And to the poore of that parish five pounds To the poore of Saint Fosters parish in Cheapside London I give ten pounds of money And for the better execution and performance of this my last will and testament I doe hereby make and ordaine my beloved brothers William Paske and Thomas Paske my Executors And in witnes whereof to this my last will and testament now made and published conteyneinge six sheets of paper written with two and twentie lines in every sheet I have sett my hand and unto every leafe of the same, and to the last leafe thereof I have sett my seale this five and twentieth daie of November in Anno domini One thousand Sixe hundred twenty eight And in the fourth yeare of the raigne of our Sovereigne Lord Charles by the grace of god Kinge of England Scotland Fraunce and Ireland Defend'r of the faith & c *Aylle Hearne* Sealed subscribed and published the daie of the date hereof in the presence of us Robt Wilson Scriptor Phillip Grymer Tho: Stockton

Alice Paske was born in the 1570's the daughter of John Paske, a draper and his wife Mary Goldsborow who were married in 1565 at Cambridge. She married Richard Herne February 18, 1592 at St.Lawrence Jewry, London. Richard Herne became a Sheriff and Alderman of London. Alice's Will shows us that her sister Jane also married a Herne. Richard's brother Robert Herne married Jane Paske January 6, 1602 St. Vedast, London.

Both Alice and Jane had sons Nicholas Herne but it has to be Alice's son Nicholas born 1593? who married Elizabeth Hooker August 13, 1613. Nicholas and Elizabeth had sons John Herne and Nathaniel Herne. It is Nathaniel's Will of 1677 that includes the item "ITEM I give 20 shillings to _____ Whitlock wife of _____ Whitlock of Virginia, daughter of my Brother Jno Herne deceased" We are fairly certain the blanks refer to Dorothy Herne and James Whitlock born about 1650.

We know Alice's grandson John Herne married Mary Page September 14, 1658 at St. Vedast and that he died before 1677. John was 33 in 1658 so this may have been a second marriage. We have not found a Will for this John Herne but do know he and Mary had children John, Mary and Thomas born 1660-1666 in St Helen's Bishopsgate. We know from his brother Nathaniel's will that John Herne had a daughter old enough to be married in 1677 but we have not been able to confirm her name was Dorothy. In 1685 James' wife is named as Dorothy and again in 1691. The Herne's were a fairly prominent family and hopefully we will be able to find documents relating to either John Herne or his children. We have also not found a Will for his father Nicholas Herne or his wives Elizabeth Hooker (d.1628/9) and Sarah Ironside Hopefully one of the collateral documents relating to the Herne family will confirm the names of John Herne's wife &/or children.

John Goldsburgh was born 1510-20 and lived in the parish of St. Edward, Cambridge. He was married twice to wives Mary & Margaret who both predeceased him. There were several children, Thomas, Geoffrey, John, Suzan, Flower & Mary. Thomas became a member of parliament, Geoffrey was the Bishop of Gloucester and Mary married John Paske Oct.22,1565 St.Edwards, Cambridge. Mary's daughter Alice married Richard Herne (1565?-1625) an Alderman and Sheriff of London. Alice died 1629 and left a Will. Their son Nicholas Herne (1593?-1674) of Tibenham, Norfolk married Elizabeth Hooker in 1613. Nicholas' granddaughter was (Dorothy?) Herne who married James Whitlock and was shown as the daughter of John Herne and living in Virginia in 1677. This family is part of the WHITLOCK02H & WHITLOCK25 families. Note: John's name is also spelled Goldsborow.
