

WHITLOCK FAMILY NEWSLETTER

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It is amazing that after working on Whitlock research for over forty-eight years that I am still surprised when great new information from the 1600's just falls into my hands. As I have had considerable experience transcribing 16th and 17th century documents, I was asked to give assistance to a researcher who was having trouble reading a Will from 1641. The researcher was Jo Pleshakov and she downloaded a copy the Will of Humphry Jorden of Kinver in Staffordshire and I started the transcription process. My interest was piqued as I had a Thomas Jorden connected to the WHITLOCK02H family in London in the 1600's and the Will actually mentioned a Thomas Jorden but I had no information on a connection between the Kinver and London Jordens. The next day Jo email me a copy of a Jorden chart done pre 1883 showing the descent of the Jordens of Kinver from the early 1500's. On the edge of the chart there was a Thomas Jorden of London married to Katherine Whitlock!! While the descent on chart was not correctly shown, the family was correct and we figured out my Thomas Jorden was the son of Humphry Jorden's brother Thomas born in 1571. Things just snowballed from there. I discovered references to Katherine (Whitlock) Jorden's 1690 Will and was able to locate it at the British National Archives and paid my £3.30 to have a copy downloaded into my computer. The list of children and grandchildren Katherine mentioned in her Will allowed me to connect other material in our files and on the Internet to the point that within a couple of days I had traced some of Katherine's fourteen children several generations and one line all the way to the present day. Katherine even leaves a legacy to her nephew James Whitlock (1650?-1716) the original immigrant to Virginia. Most of this issue deals with the new information uncovered as a result of Jo requesting some help transcribing her ancestor's Will.

I have included a review of Alison Light's book *Common People - A History of An English family*. Among Alison's ancestors is the Whitlock family of Syresham, Northamptonshire and she follows this family on their journey to Birmingham and eventually to where she grew up in the dockyard area of Portsmouth. A very personal history of a working class family living through the first industrial revolution.

I managed to continue cataloging information from Lawrence Otis' discs and added a great deal of detail to the WHITLOCK28 family (X7643). I was also extremely pleased to finally make a connection from Lawrence's information with a descendant of my great-grandfather's only sister Sarah (Whitlock) Crichton (1853-1887). Sarah died young and her husband Charles Crichton married again. Their children eventually moved to the USA and the family, lost contact with them. I contacted Mike Stakes who showed as a grandson in the obituary of Sarah Whitlock's granddaughter, Marjorie (Rowles) Stakes (1915-2005). Mike was doing research on his Stakes ancestors and his email address was shown there. He lives in the US and I am looking forward sharing research on his Whitlock ancestors with him. Our collection of photographs continues to grow with the addition of lots more gravestone photographs. Mandane Ennis sent me the link to the Warren Co., Tennessee ones on Find a Grave and I extracted them all for the one cemetery as they filled in a lot of detail on the WHITLOCK33 chart.

There is so much new information becoming available on the Internet that it is hard to keep track of what might be new to our research. Find my Past recently released 1.7 million new births, marriages and deaths for Nottinghamshire. I went through the marriages and updated our database but when I started the births I had to limit myself that those pre 1837 as the vast majority of them were after 1900. To keep up with the volume of new information, I would need a group of volunteers with copies of our database to take on small projects to scan new sources to pick out items missing from our files. They would then need to create separate compatible databases of new information that could be later incorporated with the master database. We are up to 44,259 entries and this is certainly my first place to search when looking for connections but it is by no means complete and does not even include the vast majority of my births and deaths after 1900 that I still have on the old 3 x 5 cards. One day...

I have earlier sent out renewal notices to everyone who has not yet renewed for 2015 and I hope you will continue to support this research for another year. I have new and renewed subscriptions for 52 so far and am hoping to reach 100 this year so am more than half way. Several have kindly given gift email subscriptions to various relatives which is a rather unique gift.

My thanks as usual to everyone who has shared their Whitlock and Whitlock descendant information. This is what the Whitlock Family Association is all about. I hope you find this issue of interest.

WILL OF KATHERINE (WHITLOCK) JORDEN 1690

In the name of God Amen I Katherine Jorden of London widdow being weake in body but of sound mind and memory (blessed bee God doe make and ordaine this my last will and Testament And as touching the Temporall Estate wherewith God hath Graciously blessed mee I doe Will and devise the same as followeth Imprimis I give unto Doctor Samuell Annesly and to my brother Mr. John Whitlock the sume of one hundred pounds of lawfull money of England to bee payd unto them within one yeare next after my decease Uppon trust in the in them reposed that they or the survivour of them shall give and dispose the same to such and soe many poore Godly Ministers and in such proportions as I shall either in writeing under my hand or by word of mouth before witnesses nominate and appoint to receive the same within one yeare next after my decease And if any of these persons that I shall nominate dye before they have received the proportion by mee appointed them Then my said Trustees are to pay the same to such other person or persons in his or their stead as my said Trustees shall thinke fitt Item I further give to the said Doctor Annesley and my brother Whitlock the sume of Thirty pounds like money to bee payd them within the Time aforesayd uppon Trust that they or the Survivour of them doe likewise give and dispose of the same to such and soe many poore widdowes feareing God (and in such proportions as I shall either by word or writeing nominate and appoint to that end) within one Yeare next after my decease And if any of them soe nominated shall dye before they have received the proportion by mee appointed them Then to such others in their stead as my said Trustees shall thinke I fitt Item further give to the said Doctor Annesley and my roher Whitlock the sume of Thirty pounds like money to bee payd them within the Time aforesayd uoon Trust that they or the Survivour of them doe likewise give and dispose the same to such and soe many poore widdowes fearing God (and in such proporcions as I shall be word or writeing nominate and appoint that end) within one year nxt after my decease And if any of them oe nominated shall dye before they jave received th proportion by mee appointed them Then to such others in their stead as my said Trustees shall thinke fitt. Item I give to the poore of the parrish where I share bee buryed (in case it shall be the parish of Stratford Bow where my deare Husband was interred) the sume of Five pounds but if I bee buryed in any other parish Then I give only the sume of Three pounds to the poore of any such other parish Item I give unto my Sister Mary Whitlock wife of my sayd brother John Whitlock To my Nephew James Whitlock to my Nephew John Whitlock and to my Neece Anne Langford Fourty shillings apeece Item I give to all the children of my Brother Robert Whitlocke Deceased Twenty shillings apeice Item I give unto my sonnes in Law Mr. Joseph Burrough Mr. Godfrey Webster Mr. John Timme and Mr. John Billingsley Fourty shillings apeece Item I give unto my aforesayd brother Mr. John Whitlock and my sonne in Law Mr. Godfrey Webster the sume of Fifty pounds of lawfull English money in Trust to bee payd to my Granddaughter Anne Timme when she shall attaine the Age of one and Twenty yeares or on the day of her Marryage which shall First happen and if she dye before her age or Marryage Then to bee payd to her brothers and sisters (if any of them shall be liveing att the time of her decease) equally share and share alike Item I give to my sayd brother John Whitlock and the sayd Godfrey Webster the sume of one Hundred pounds more of like money in Trust for the sole and separate use of my daughter Katherine Burrough wherein my Mind and will is that her husband Joseph Burrough shall not intermeddle therewith or with any parte thereof and that the improvement that shall be made thereof dureing her sayd husbands life shall either kept or layd upp for her good and advantage in such manner as my sayd brother and sonne in Law Godfrey Webster shall thinke fitt and best for her And after her sayd husbands decease my will is that the sayd one hundred pounds with such profitts the rest as shall bee then undisposed shall bee payd unto the sayd Katherine Burrough or her Assignes And in case shee dye in the life tyme of her sayd Husband then the sayd one hundred pounds shall bee payd unto her daughter Katherine Clerke the wife of James Clerke Item I give unto my sonne Thomas Jorden the sume of Four hundred pounds And alsoe I give unto him my sayd sonne my large Diamond Ringe and Gilded Silver Cup with a Ewer Item I give to my daughter Margaret Scott the sume of one hundred pounds Item I give to my Grand daughter Katherine Scott the sume of one hundred pounds And in case shee dye before her age of one and Twenty yeares or day of Marryage then my Will is that Fifty pounds of the last mentioned one hundred pounds shall bee payd to my Grand daughter Elizabeth Scott Item I give to my sayd Grand daughter Elizabeth Scott Fifty pounds And as to these last Legacies given to the children of my daughter Margaret Scott my Will is that my Executors hereafter named shall and may either keepe the same and the Improvement that shall bee made thereof in their hands until the sayd children sall attaine their respective ages of one and Twenty yeares or bee marryed or else lay out of the sume and what improvement shall bee made thereof soe much as they shall judge necessary towards theire education and promotion before they come to their respective ages or bee marryed Item I give to my daughter Abigail Webster the sume Fifty pounds And to my Grandson Thomas Webster the sume of one hundred pounds And in case my sayd Grandsonne Thomas Webster dye before hee attaine the Age of one and Twenty yeares I doe hereby give and bequeath the last mentioned one hundred pounds to my sayd daughter Abigail Webster and if shee dye before her husband Then I give him the sayd Godfrey Webster the sayd one hundred pounds Item I have to my sayd brother Mr. John Whitlock and my sonne in Law Godfrey Webster the sume of one hundred pounds more In Trust of the sole and separate use of my daughter Elizabeth Timme wherein my mind and will is that her husband John Timme shall not intermeddle therewith and that the Improvement that shall bee made

thereof dureing the life of her sayd husband shall bee either layd upp or layd out as my sayd brother Mr. John Whitlock and Mr. Godfrey Webster shall thinke fitt for her good and after her sayd husbands decease I will that the last mentioned one Hundred pounds with such such profitts thereof as shall bee undisposed shall bee payd unto the sayd Elizabeth Timme or her Assignes And in case shee dye in the life time of her sayd Husband Then the sayd one hundred pounds shall bee payd unto the children of my sayd daughter Elizabeth Timme equally share and share alike Item I give unto my daughter Dorcas Billingsley the sume of one hundred pounds To my daughter Katherine Billingsley the some of Fowerscore pounds To my Granddaughters Mary Billingsley and Dorcas Billingsley Threescore pounds apeece and my Grandsonne John Billingsley Tenn pounds Item my will is that all my plate Lynnen and household goods (not already disposed in this my Will) shall be equally divided amongst all my daughters that shall bee liveing att the time of my decease And if any of my above named Grandchildren shall happen to dye either before marryage or their respective ages of one and Twenty yeares Then my will is that the Legacy and parte of the deceased Grandchild or Grandchildren shall goe and bee payd to his and their surviveing bretheren and sisters and I case there bee none such then to my other surviveing Grandchildren equally share and share alike Excepting what is otherwise disposed of in this my Will Item I give to Hannah Smalley daughter of Robert Smalley deceased the sume of Three pounds The rest and residue of all my Estate (after my debts Legacies and Funerall charges shall bee payd and discharged) I give and devise as followeth That is to say the one halfe thereof I give to my sayd sonne Thomas Jorden and the other halfe thereof I give to and amongst my daughters that shall bee liveing att the time of my decease to bee equally divided among them share and share alike And I hereby nominate make and ordaine my sayd Brother Mr. John Whitlock and my sayd sonne in Law Mr Godfrey Webster Executors of this my last will and Testament In Trust for the performance thereof for the benefitt of the Legatees therein named according to my true intent therein And I doe give unto my sayd brother Mr. John Whitlock and my said sonne in Law Mr. Godfrey Webster the sume of Fifty pounds apeece for their paines and care in the execution of this my Will And as touching my Funerall my Will is that all my children and Grandchildren with both my Executors and their wives shall have Mourning that is to say Five pounds apeece shall bee allowed for men and women and Three pounds apeece for younger persons And for all other things relateing to my Funerall I leave the same to the discretion of my sayd Executors Provided they keepe within the compasse of Two hundred pounds And as to the Legacies left to my Grandchildren (excepting those left to the children of my daughter Margaret Scott and the children of my daughter Elizabeth Timme) my Will is that if their parents shall give such security as shall bee satisfactory to my sayd Executors for the payment thereof according to this my Will Then they may pay such Legacies into the hands of such parents and thereuppon my sayd Executors shall bee discharged thereof and from any Account for the same In wittnesse whereof to this my Will conteyneing two sheets of paper and this parte of another sheete I have to the Two First sheets putt my hand att the bottome of each sheete and to this last sheete putt my hand and seale and sealed the whole att the Topp of the First sheete The Fowertenth day of June in the second year of the Reign of our Sovewraigne Lord and Lady King William and Queene Mary over England or Anno duo one Thousand six hundred Nynety Katherine Jordan signed sealed published and declared to bee the last will and Testament of the sayd Katherine Jorden in the presence of us and before the signeing sealeing publishing and declaring here of the word (Grandsonne was interlined in the second sheete) Thos Abraham William Marriott Mary Enden

KATHERINE (WHITLOCK) JORDEN (1622-1690)

Katherine (Whitlock) Jorden was born July 2, 1622 in the Parish of St. Peter Poer, London, the fourth child and only surviving daughter of Richard Whitlock & Katherine Burchett who married November 4 1615 at St. Andrews Holborn, London. Her father, Richard was educated at Merchant Taylor's School, became a member of the Skinners Co. and a successful London merchant. He leased the Manor of Beches from his brother William in 1617 for a period of 21 years, eventually taking ownership. He died a fairly young man at about 49.

Katherine's eldest brother was Doctor Richard Whitlock (1616-1666) author of *Zootomia* and after the restoration in 1660 a fairly troubled cleric. Katherine's nephew James, mentioned in her 1690 Will, was Richard's son, James Whitlock (1650?-1716) of Virginia. Katherine's Will also names her niece Anna (Whitlock) Langford. I think this Anna Whitlock is the one baptized February 4 1647 at St. Margaret's Westminster the daughter of Katherine's brother Richard and his wife Joane. This Joane is mentioned in the

Will of Katherine's brother Robert Whitlock in 1670. There is no mention of Joane in Katherine's Will and it is assumed she had died before 1690 and her daughter Anna was likely living with Katherine's brother John Whitlock (1625-1708) of Mansfield. Anna married Thomas Langford May 16, 1671 at Mansfield, Nottinghamshire and like her uncle John Whitlock, Anna's husband, Thomas Langford, was a non-conformist minister.

Katherine's brother, John Whitlock (1625-1708) was the Vicar of St. Mary's Nottingham who was ejected for non-conformity. He became the minister of the Presbyterian Chapel High Pavement, Nottingham. He married Mary Tuckney the daughter of Anthony Tuckney Master of Emmanuel College Cambridge where John Whitlock received his MA degree in 1645. In 1680 this John Whitlock appeared before Sir Robert Clayton to provide proof that Anthony Whitlock of Lambeth, Surrey was the rightful heir of Thomas Whitlock (1615-1659) whose son Thomas Whitlock (1658?-1678) of Rappahannock Co. Virginia died before reaching age 21.

There is a plaque in St. Mary, Bow church in London. "*Near this Place lyeth the Body of Thomas Jordan, of London, Merchant, who married Katherine only Daughter of Richard Whitlock, of London, Merchant: By whom he had issue five Sons and nine Daughters, of which he left living two Sons and five Daughters. He finished his Course in the 62d Year of his age, and yielded up his Spirit unto God April the 9th 1671, Bequeathing his Body unto the Earth, to wait for a blessed Resurrection.*" From this memorial we know Katherine had fourteen children of which seven were still alive in 1671 when Thomas died. So far we have been able to determine the names of eight children.

In her Will Katherine mentions six of her children and several grandchildren. Her daughter Katherine and her husband Joseph Burrough, daughter Margaret and her husband Robert Scott, daughter Dorcas & husband John Billingsley, daughter Elizabeth and her husband John Timme, daughter Abigail and husband Godfrey Webster and her son Thomas Jorden. The other son John Jorden must have died between Thomas Jorden's death in 1671 and Katherine's in 1690. Grandchildren include Katherine Burrough the wife of James Clerk, Katherine & Elizabeth Scott, Katherine, Mary & Dorcas Billingsley, children of her daughter Elizabeth Timme (not named) and her grandson Thomas Webster.

SIR THOMAS WEBSTER (1676-1751)

Sir Thomas Webster was born in the parish of St.Gabriel, Fenchurch, London October 27, 1676. He was the son of Godfrey Webster and Abigail Jorden and grandson of Thomas Jorden and Katherine Whitlock. In her 1690 Will Katherine (Whitlock) Jorden left her grandson Thomas Webster one hundred pounds at age 21. No small sum on October 27, 1697 when Thomas was 21.

Assuming, following the custom of the day, that Thomas & Katherine (Whitlock) Jorden negotiated the marriages of their children, the marriage of Godfrey Webster to their daughter Abigail was an auspicious one. Godfrey Webster was a fairly wealthy man who lent money to the new King and Queen, William & Mary following the Revolution of 1688. He was rewarded by being given a very lucrative contract to supply all the clothing for the Army. By 1710 he owned so many shares of Bank of England stock that he was able to be a governor or director. Thomas joined his father as a partner and on May 21, 1703 at age 26 Thomas was knighted and created 1st Baron Webster.

Thomas Webster had also made an extremely advantageous marriage, when in 1701 he married Jane Cheek the granddaughter of Henry Whistler. At this time Thomas purchased Copped Hall, Essex from Charles Sackville, the Earl of Dorset. As a young man of 24 Thomas spent considerable sums (likely of his father's money) improving his new estate including in 1706 enclosing part of Waltham Forest to provide easier access.

In 1719 Thomas Webster purchased Battle Abbey in Sussex from Henry Whistler. From 1705 to 1727 Thomas was the member of Parliament for Colchester three times.

Sir Thomas Webster died May 31, 1751 and his estates were inherited by his son Whistler Webster. The Websters were not very good at producing heirs and twice the Baronety was inherited by a brother due to no heir. The Baronety became extinct in 1923 when the 8th Baron died six years after his only son died at Ypres in the Great War.

Battle Abbey was built on the site of the Battle of Hastings in 1066. It was largely destroyed in 1538 and the property sold. It remained in the Webster family until 1858 and was repurchased in 1901 and has housed a girls school since 1912, finally being sold to the Government in 1976. It is now a British Heritage site.

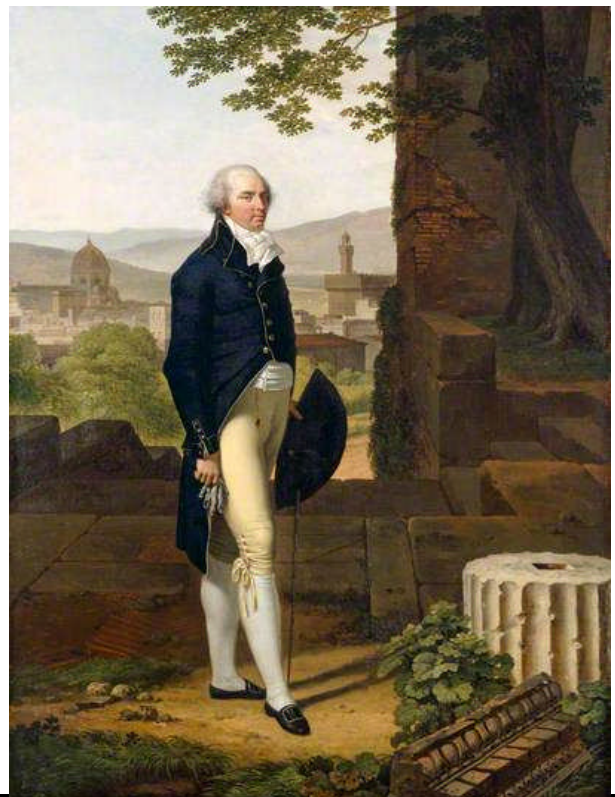


Top: Sir Thomas Webster (1676-1751)

JOHN BILLINGSLEY (1657-1722) PRESBYTERIAN MINISTER

John Billingsley (1657–1722), Presbyterian minister, was born at the vicarage at Chesterfield in Derbyshire, the only son of John Billingsley (1625-1683), vicar of Chesterfield, and his wife, Mary (d. in or before 1665), daughter of the puritan minister Immanuel Bourne. Educated at Nottingham by John Reyner (son of Edward Reyner, the presbyterian minister of Lincoln), Billingsley briefly attended Trinity College, Cambridge, but did not matriculate. Instead he continued his studies under his father, who kept a school in Mansfield, Nottinghamshire, and his uncle, John Whitlock the elder. In a remarkable instance of hereditary succession Billingsley, John Oldfield, and Samuel Coates were ordained together by their fathers at Mansfield in September 1681. On 22 August 1682 Billingsley married Dorcas Jordan (d. 1717) at Oliver Heywood's chapel at Coley, Northowram, Yorkshire. After preaching for a time to his father's former flock at Chesterfield, he moved to Sheffield to assist the Presbyterian Edward Prime. He ministered in and around Selston, Nottinghamshire, from about 1687 to 1694, when he accepted a call to succeed Samuel Charles as pastor to a joint congregation of Presbyterians and Independents at Kingston upon Hull. There he remained until 1706 when he was elected to replace Samuel Rosewell as assistant to William Harris at the Presbyterian meeting of Crutched Friars, London. He also preached a Sunday evening lecture to a society of young men at the Old Jewry, in which he expounded the Westminster assembly's shorter and larger catechisms. Despite his own orthodoxy, when the Exeter Trinitarian controversy divided London dissenters at the Salters' Hall synod in 1719 Billingsley sided with the non-subscribers, who thought the imposition of religious tests of any sort violated the fundamental principle of dissent. It is not clear whether his decision was at all affected by the prominent role taken by his cousin Nicholas Billingsley, of Ashwick, Somerset, in sheltering the Arians Hubert Stogdon and James Foster.

With its uncompromising insistence that ‘strictness is not fanaticism’, Billingsley's first work, *The Believer's Daily Exercise* (1690), placed him squarely within the godly tradition. Dedicated to his Selston congregation, it offered a wealth of practical guidance to help serious Christians distinguish themselves from hypocrites and formalists. This included warning readers against wasting their mornings ‘between the comb and the glass’, like ‘the gaudy butterflies and gay peacocks of our days’, and advising them, quite specifically, on what and how to read (pp. 71, 9). Personal reformation alone, however, was not sufficient, as Billingsley made clear in his two sermons preached before the societies for reformation of manners in Hull

and London (1700, 1706). Christians must be reformers, first of themselves, 'but next of others also' (Billingsley, A Sermon Preached to the Societies for the Reformation of Manners, 1706, 20). After defending the societies from the usual charges of canting and meddling, Billingsley employed the language of patriotic whiggery in contrasting the slavishness sown in their debauched subjects by absolute monarchs with the sobriety which sustained England's freedom: 'sobriety and the love of liberty are twins that laugh and live, mourn and die together' (ibid., 18). Besides a number of separate sermons he also published Brief Discourse of Schism (2nd edn, 1714), and the exposition of the epistle to Jude in the continuation of Matthew Henry's commentary. William Harris edited his posthumous Sermons Against Popery (1723).

Billingsley and his wife had five children, including one son, John, a dissenting minister in Dover, Kent, who dedicated a sermon to his father in 1717. John subsequently married a sister of Sir Philip Yorke, later Chancellor Hardwicke, conformed to the Church of England, and became a prebendary of Bristol. In addition to suffering all his life under a 'crazy constitution', Billingsley was naturally melancholy. During his last sickness, he confessed, '[I] pretend not to transports of affection, and rapturous joys; for ... you know my temper and make' (Harris, 256-7). He died, probably in London, on 2 May 1722, and was buried on 13 May in Bunhill Fields. Harris published funeral sermons for both Billingsley and his wife in his Funeral Discourses (1736).

As Jim Benedict mentions John Billingsley married Dorcas Jordan. She was the daughter of Thomas Jordan and Katherine Whitlock. Of John and Dorcas' five children we have only been able to trace a couple of generations on for John Billingsley b.1684 and Samuel Billingsley b.1696. There is a Billingsley One Name Society and I am looking forward to working with them to trace more descendants.

COMMON PEOPLE - The History of an English Family - by ALISON LIGHT

Some months ago William Lindsay brought to my attention the book *Common People* by Alison Light. This history of an English family includes the family of Alison's grandmother Evelyn Whitlock. I contacted Alison Light and she kindly had her publisher send me a copy to review.

As a long time family historian I found this book amazing. Alison came to the realization fairly early that most of her ancestor's families were on the verge of poverty for most of their lives. She was not going to find an ancestral home, a cache of family documents or artifacts. If she wanted to get to know and understand her ancestors and the lives they lived, she was going to have to use her skills as a historian to uncover their stories.

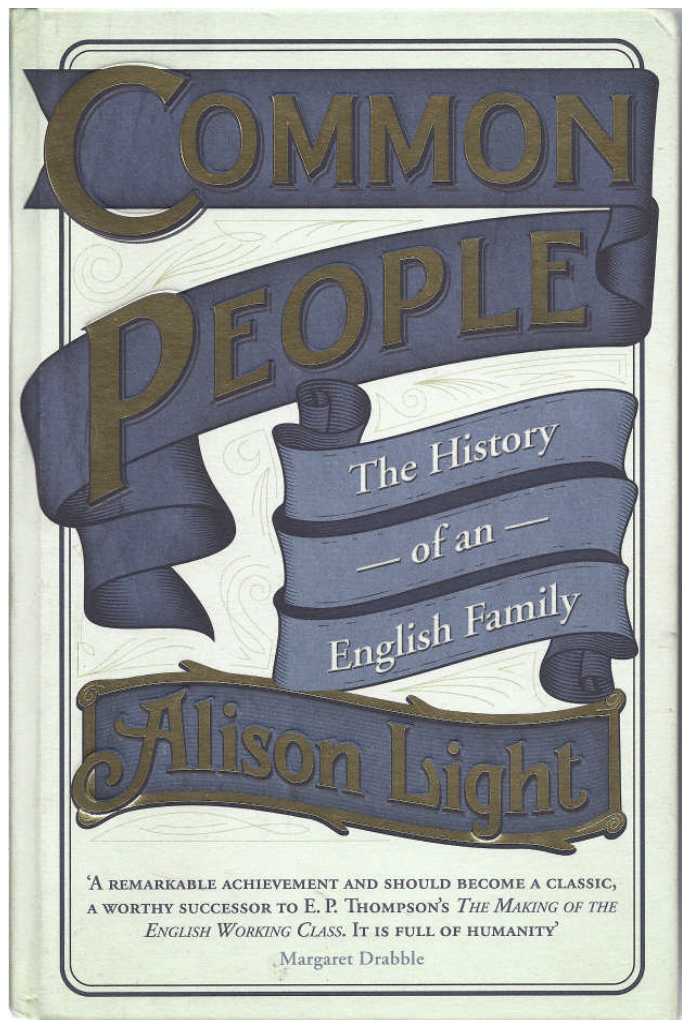
Most of her lines trace back to the 1700's and Alison works both forward and backward revealing the story of the Industrial Revolution of the early 1800's and its affect on the lives of the common English family. The endless struggle to provide for your family in an age of dramatic change. The move from rural to urban living, the change from cottage industries to factory work and the specter of the dreaded workhouse looming over it all. Alison makes her families real, using the information the census and other documents reveal about the community and the neighbours to tell her family's story.

Alison wipes away the family myths that people create for themselves and achieves the goal of all family historians - she provides a real and clear picture of the lives of her family members, and is able to meet and know them intimately. An inspiration to all family historians no matter how common or working class their family origins.

We think we know the history of this time but Alison uses her skills as an historian to tell a very readable and personal story of how working class families actually coped and survived the creation of the first truly industrial nation.

This Whitlock family is detailed on our WHITLOCK77 chart, The Whitlocks of Northamptonshire. Alison follows her family from Syresham NTH to Birmingham, WAR and eventually to Portsmouth HAM.
