I think we are on the cusp of making a major break-through with several families. The WHITLOCK09 family The Whitlocks of Connecticut, The WHITLOCK16 family The Whitlocks of New Jersey and New York, the WHITLOCK24 family the descendants of Rose Whitlock and her husband Abraham Parker and possibly the WHITLOCK31 family the descendants of Hannah Whitlock and her husband Joseph Baldwin.

The Whitlock DNA project has shown that the WHITLOCK09 family and the WHITLOCK16 family, share the same YDNA. I have proposed that as we knew Thomas Whitlock (1623?-1703) who heads the WHITLOCK16 family came from Salisbury, Wiltshire that both families likely came from Wiltshire.

I was answering a query from a descendant of the WHITLOCK09 family who had asked about the earliest records we had from Salem, Massachusetts where Rose Whitlock shows in 1643 and where John Whitlock who heads this family first settled before going to Connecticut. I listed the 1643-1650 entries which included one from the Brand Whitlock papers that I had not looked at for some years. The item was R0381 and referred to Francis Webb of Dorset, England who in 1629 had permission to build a Sawmill in Salem, Massachusetts. Francis Webb was the brother of Katherine Webb who in 1625 married Alexander Whitlock at Salisbury, Wiltshire. Alexander Whitlock was from Farley, Wiltshire a joint parish with Pitton. The R0381 document provides evidence that there was likely a family connection between the Webb and Whitlock families of both Salisbury, Wiltshire and Salem, Massachusetts. The Webb family and Whitlock family have a centuries long connection with each other through the Pitton and Salisbury, Wiltshire families with at least five Webb/Whitlock marriages between 1625 and 1821.

There were four male Whitlocks over the age of 18 who appear in the 1641 Protestation Return for Pitton & Farley. William Whitlocke, Edmond Whitlocke, John Whitlocke & Alexander Whitlocke. Of these four we have only traced descendants of Alexander. There was a John Whitlock who buried a son Harry at St.Martin, Salisbury in 1585. We know there was a William Whitlock having children in Alderbury, Wiltshire as he had a son William born and died there in 1620. There was also a John Whitlock shown as the father of John Whitlock baptized in 1605 at Alderbury. A Richard Whitlock baptized a son Richard in 1608 and buried a son John in 1608 at Alderbury as well so lots of Whitlocks in the area within five miles of the east side of Salisbury, Wiltshire in the late 1500's and early 1600's. Unfortunately there are very few parish records prior to 1680 for Pitton and Farley so we are limited in our abilities to determine family groups prior to that time.

With what we now know from the YDNA connection, it is possible the John Whitlock shown on the 1641 Protestation return is the one who in 1643 was living in Salem, Massachusetts. There is no way to tell how old any of the four males shown on the 1641 Protestation Return were other than over 18 but there is a good chance they were related to the Whitlocks living in Massachusetts in the 1640's and the Whitlocks were likely in Salem, Massachusetts because of Alexander Whitlock's brother-in-law Francis Webb.

The descendants of Alexander Whitlock & Katherine Webb are shown at the end of the WHITLOCK03 chart, The Whitlocks of Pitton, Wiltshire #1 as also from Pitton & Farley, Wiltshire. I would say an obvious next step would be to test some male Whitlock descendants of Alexander Whitlock & Katherine Webb and check if they share the same YDNA as the WHITLOCK09 and WHITLOCK16 families. Because we know from tax records the Whitlocks have lived in this area of Wiltshire since before the 1540's there will likely be several different YDNA lines but hopefully at least one of them will match the WHITLOCK09 & WHITLOCK16 families and confirm this is their place of origin. This is the closest we have come in years to placing these four Whitlock families in England with any certainty. The indications are for Wiltshire and we now have a Wiltshire Whitlock family with connections to Francis Webb who built a sawmill in 1629 and owned land in Salem, Massachusetts.

This issue includes another connection made when after more than forty years we finally determined who the parents were of Howard Whitlock (1813-1862) of Louisiana. Always great when everything finally falls into place and the answer fits in the way you expected it to.

It was another busy quarter with nearly 200 Certificates received since the December 2016 issue. So many that I likely don't have room to show all of them in one issue. There are more than 100 marriage certificates from Georgia.

As many of you know Lawrence Otis is a distant cousin of mine who lives in Stratford, Ontario. Lawrence monitors several charts and about once a year forwards a disc of research that fills in blanks in these families plus a wide range of miscellaneous research that he has determined has not yet been added to our collection. This issue includes the last of Lawrence's 2015 disc and all of the January 2016 one. There is a reason my weekly back-up is over 80GB these days and takes about four hours! Our thanks to Lawrence for his latest additions.

Our thanks also to Vicki House for sending the link to the New York Public Library's on line records that includes items from the Thomas Addis Emmet Collection. I downloaded a couple of letters from the 1820's & 1830's from General Lafayette to William Whitlock (1791-1875) of New York and one dated 1824 from Francis Allyn to the same William Whitlock regarding the arrangements to bring General Lafayette and his family from France to America on the ship *Cadmus* to participate in the 50th anniversary celebrations of American Independence in 1825. R4207 & R4208.

I wrote an article for the September 2004 Newsletter about the author of the children's Bunyip stories Judith Whitlock and asked for more details if anyone knew her family. I recently received an email from a New Zealand genealogist, Athol Munro who had seen the article on our website and had additional information and a correction. We had wondered if the author was Judith Lorraine Whitlock of Swan Hill born in 1933 but Athol advised us she was Judith Anne Whitlock born in 1932. She was born in Australia but lived most of her life in England only returning to Australia a few years before she died there in 1993. Judith married Hilary Risdon Haydon and had two children Peter Risdon Haydon and Katherine Risdon Haydon. Athol did not know who her parents were.

An item of interest came from Martha Endres X7905 that detailed her possible descent from John Rolfe & Pocohantas who were married in 1616. They are working to confirm the father of Judith Bolling (1708?-1770) was John Fairfax Bolling (1676-1729) to confirm the connection. The line descends through the DePriest family from there to John Anthony Whitlock who is a member of the WHITLOCK35 chart.

There has been a steady increase in the members of the Whitlock DNA project and we are now up to 156 members with over 340 Family Finder matches. With each new member I have been able to connect most of their matches with our charts. At least four in the past month have been able to add eight to ten generations to their ancestors and detail their ancestry back to John Whitlock and Agnes Dela Beche of Wokingham, Berkshire who were married about 1454.

A fairly wide variety of articles in this issue so I hope you enjoy them. My thanks to everyone who has renewed their subscriptions and for the many kind comments and donations included. I really think we are making great progress.

I have attached renewal notices for those I do not show a 2017 subscription yet and hope you will be willing to help support the Whitlock Family Association for another year.

HOWARD WHITLOCK (1813-1862) OF LOUISIANA

We have been collecting information on Howard Whitlock and his descendants since the early 1970's. We knew from some of the first records we found that he was married to Elizabeth H. (Elizer) Johnson (1822-1862) in Talbot Co., Georgia Mar.12,1840. They had eleven children from 1840 to 1859. The family was still living in Talbot Co., Georgia in 1850.

We knew from the birth places of their children that by 1852 the family was living in Alabama and by 1859 they were in Louisiana.

None of the descendants had been able to determine who Howard's parents were.

The breakthrough clue came when we discovered Howard's gravestone on Find a Grave. It gave his date of birth June 12 1813 and date of death December 20 1862. On the back were the details for his wife Elizabeth H. Johnson. Best of all the places of birth and death were shown. Howard was shown born in Surrey Co., North Carolina.

We still did not know who his parents were but at least now we had a clue where to look. Howard's eldest son was named James Howard Whitlock. Using this information I checked my Surry Co., North Carolina records for a possible James Whitlock having children in 1813.

BINGO. There was a James Whitlock and his wife Nancy Bowen living in Surry Co. and having children between 1780 and 1809. It was recorded they had eight children but we only knew the names of seven. Their eldest child was named Bowen Whitlock so we knew they used ancestors surnames in their naming patterns for their children. This did not prove James and Nancy were Howard's parents but there was a good chance of it. Was Howard the missing eight child?

The final clue was right in front of us - Howard's name. The records showed Nancy Bowen's father had died and her mother Sarah married as her second husband Philip Howard. Nancy Bowen's step father was therefore a Howard. While not proof - just too many connections fitting together. Nancy named her first child Bowen after her father and her last child Howard after her step-father. Howard had to be the missing eight child.

This family is detailed on our WHITLOCK87 chart and we recently showed that Nancy Bowen's husband James Whitlock was likely the son of James Whitlock and Silvia Jones who show on the WHITLOCK25 chart. This means Howard Whitlock and his family can now trace their line back to John Whitlock and Agnes delaBeche of Wokingham Berkshire who were married about 1454.

WILL OF PHILIP HOWARD 1808

In the name of God Amen. This twenty-eighth day of July in the year of our Lord Christ one thousand eight hundred and eight. I Philip Howard of the County of Surry and State of North Carolina being weak and low in body, but of perfect mind and memory thanks be to God for the same; and knowing that it is appointed for all men to die do make and ordain this to be my last will and testament, and first I do recommend my soul into the hands of Almighty God that gave it, and my body to the Earth to be buried in a Christian like manner, and as touching my worldly Estate wherewith it hath pleased God to bless me with, I give and dispose of in the following manner.

Imprimis: It is my will and desire that all the land I possess and live on and adjoining thereto including the Island, the whole is said to contain 346 acres be the same more or less be sold by my Executors hereafter named whenever either three of my sons, viz Samuel, John, Philip, and Benjamin consents thereto and the monies arising therefrom to be equally divided between my four sons above named after paying my son William two hundred dollars out of the money arising from the sale thereof to be paid as soon as they receive the monies for the sale of said land which said sum of two hundred dollars I give to my son William and his heirs, But in case three of them should not agree and sell the land as aforesaid Its my desire that Philip should have the use of the new field he cleared to himself until it is sold, and the other three to use or occupy the old plantation, and if they do not sell it all. Each of them are to pay their brother William the sum of fifty dollars each within four years after my decease.

Item: I give and bequeath to my beloved wife Sarah the feather bed and furniture that I usually sleep on to her and her heirs forever.

Item: I give and bequeath to each of my sons, to wit Samuel, John, Philip, and Benjamin a feather bed and furniture (meaning that all the furniture after my wifes bed is fixed off) be equally divided between the four boys.

Item: I give and bequeath to my son Benjamin a two year old grey mare to him and his heirs forever.

Item: I give and bequeath to my son William all my wearing clothes, all my books of every description, a certain blue rug and my walking cane to him and his heirs forever.

Item: I give to each of my grand-sons (children of my son William) viz. James, John, Philip, William and David Hampton Howard five dollars in money each.

Item: I give to Lewis Bryan and Nancy Bryan (children of my deceased daughter Betsy Bryan) five dollars each in money.

Item: I give to each of my six grand-daughters, children of my daughter Sallie Holliman, five dollars each in money, mind there are six of them.

Item: I give to each of my two grand daughters (children of my daughter Susannah Douthite) five dollars each in money.

Item: I give to each of the eight children of Nancy Whitlock (grand children of my present wife) three dollars each in money to be paid to their father James Whitlock in trust for said children.

Item: It is my will and desire that all my negroes, horses, cattle, hogs, sheep, and crops now growing and all the rest and residue of my Estate that is not heretofore bequeathed of what nature or kind sources of every description be sold to the highest bidder and the monies arising therefrom and the out standing debts collected after paying all my just debts and funeral expenses and the small legacies above bequeathed be equally divided between my beloved wife Sarah, my daughters Sally and Sucky and the children of my daughter Betsy Bryan, they the children of Betsy to be considered as entitled to one fourth part thereof only to them and their heirs forever.

Lastly, I do appoint my sons Philip and Benjamin Executors to this my last will and testament, ratifying this and no other to be the same.

In testimony whereof I do hereunto set my hand and seal the day and year above written.

Philip Howard, Seal

Signed sealed and acknowledged and pronounced in presents of us who in the presents of each other signed the same.

State of North Carolina, Surry County--August Session--A.D. 1809

Joseph Williams, George Kimbrough and Marmaduke Kimbrough (the subscribing witnesses to the foregoing last will and testament of Philip Howard) made oath that they saw the said Howard sign publish and the same to be his last will and testament, that he was of sound and disposing mind and memore which was ordered to be recorded.

Recorded accordingly by Jo Williams

Philip Howard married as his second wife Sarah (??) Bowen, the widow of Thomas Bowen. Thomas & Sarah Bowen's daughter Nancy Bowen (1771-1852) married James Whitlock of Surry Co., North Carolina. This family is detailed on the WHITLOCK87 chart with connections to the WHITLOCK25 and WHITLOCK02H families. Philip mentions in his Will "the eight children of Nancy Whitlock (grandchildren of my present wife)". Until recently we only knew seven of the eight. It is obvious now that the number eight shown in Philip's Will was misleading as it likely included children that did not survive. Howard Whitlock was born after Philip Howard made his Will and there may be one other extra child as well, Rebecca born about 1809 making a total of ten. There is a gap between 1800 and 1807 and there may have been children born in that time frame who died after Philip made his Will in 1808 or like Howard where we have not yet made the connection.

WHITELOCKE'S CORANTO

In 1633 when Bulstrode Whitelocke was 28 he was a young lawyer and member of the Middle Temple in London. The four Inns of Court joined together to present a Royal Masque to King Charles I and Queen Henrietta. The Queen who enjoyed participating in Masques had been insulted recently by William Prynne who had published a book that called "women actors notorious whores" and the Inns of Court wished to show the Queen they did not share Mr. Prynne's opinion.

Edward Hyde and Bulstrode Whitelocke were chosen to be the two representatives of the Middle Temple on the committee of the four Inns putting on the Masque. Bulstrode was given the job of putting together the music and musicians for the event and they used his house in Salisbury Court to meet and practice. Bulstrode notes in his Dairy "I was so conversant with the musicians, & so willing to gaine their favour, especially all this time, that I composed an aier myselfe, with the assistance of Mr. Ives, and called it Whitlockes Coranto, which being cryed [written] up, was first played publicly, by the Blackfryers Musicke, who were then esteemed the best of Common Musicke in all London."

The piece became very popular and Bulstrode notes that when the Queen heard it she did not believe it had been written by an Englishman. Copies of the music circulated widely and Bulstrode notes that for years when ever it was known he was in a audience where there were musicians, they would play a few bars from his Coranto.

Bulstrode included the Coranto in his Diary for his children “ that you seeing hereby, that I was throughly versed in it & capable by my full knowledge of it, to judge of this delight yett I can say of it, & you may give the more credit to my experience, that it is like all other worldly delights, butt vanishing into aier, soon past & gone & forgotten as if it had never bin”. He advises his children to work hard but also take some time for the pleasures in life such as music.

The Masque took place at the end of January before Candlemas Day (February 2) and was intended to be a finale to the Christmas celebrations. The venue was the Banqueting House at Whitehall.

The Middle Temple colours chosen for their chariot and coachman’s livery and horses for the parade to Whitehall were silver and blue, similar to the colours of Bulstrode’s Coat of Arms and he adopted those colours from that point as his colours. The event cost the four Inns of Court nearly £20,000 and Bulstrode spent £1,000 on the musicians. Huge sums of money. In modern terms the cost was an estimated \$4.7 million.

Sir Bulstrode Whitlocke (1605-1675) was the son of Sir James Whitlock (1570-1632) and Elizabeth Bulstrode (1575-1631). The was a lawyer and supported Oliver Cromwell. He was Keeper of the Great Seal, a member of Parliament and Cromwell’s Ambassador to Sweden. He is part of the WHITLOCK02H family.

As a postscript - Edward Hyde who was Bulstrode’s fellow committee member from the Middle Temple to plan the Royal Masque, became the Earl of Clarendon and in 1659 his daughter Anne married King Charles’ son James and making Edward the grandfather of Queen Mary II and Queen Anne. While Edward Hyde and Bulstrode’s political careers took vastly different paths, they remained life long friends. Following the restoration in 1660 it was his friend Edward Hyde whose influence likely spared Bulstrode most of the effects prominent supporters of Oliver Cromwell suffered, including many who were executed. Edward Hyde did warn Bulstrode that Gilbert Sheldon the new Bishop of London was planning to reclaim the Manor of Fulham a sequestered property that had been settled on Samuel Harvey by his father when Samuel married Bulstrode’s daughter Cecily in 1658. Despite Bulstrode and his son-in-law meeting with the Bishop to negotiate the surrender of the property destroyed or confiscated most of their household goods and evicted Samuel and his pregnant wife. Within eighteen months the couple and their child had died and Bulstrode blamed the Bishop for his daughter and her husband and his grandchild’s deaths. Gilbert Sheldon became the Archbishop of Canterbury and in a quirk of fate Catherine Dolben the daughter of Gilbert Sheldon’ niece Catherine Sheldon married Bulstrode’s grandson Samuel Whitlocke in 1702.

JOHN OLIVER TRUSCOTT (1863-1946) SASKATCHEWAN PIONEER

The following article includes the eulogy given at Jack's funeral in 1946.

It was in the middle eighties that Jack Truscott left the place of his birth in South Monahan, Ontario to seek and find a new home in the North West Territories.

Today, this 18th day of March, 1946, his remains were laid to rest in the cemetery at Alameda, after having lived in this Alameda district for sixty-one years.

While he was not among the first settlers in the district, nevertheless he was among those who endured the hardships, hopes and thrills of the Pioneer and shared the honour with about a dozen other courageous young men and women who firmly established the "Bridge-Head" for settlers and their families who came later into the settlement. He welcomed his Father, Brothers and Sisters from Ontario to the new prairie home after four years of preparation.

Jack Truscott was well liked wherever he was known, his strong character, combined with a strong, athletic body, his head of curly red hair and his jovial disposition were assets that were never to be forgotten by those who knew him in his younger years. He farmed most of his life, but took time out to serve a term on the Alameda Town Council, and was a member of the Liquor Board for the south-east portion of Assiniboia under the Haultain regime. He had definite strong religious convictions, and in politics he was Liberal.

In the death of John Oliver Truscott on the 14th day of March, 1946, at the age of 83 years one month, the prairies have lost another of its sons who bore the hardships and disappointments with a courage characteristics of the pioneer whose motto was "Never say Die."

He married Bertha Whitlock, of Estavan, on November 12 1900. He is survived by his wife and two sons, David Henry and John Irvine, also six grandchildren. Three brothers and three sisters also survive him, Edward B. and Archibald D. of Alameda, Sidney James of Edmonton, Mrs. Joseph Kerr of Vancouver, Mrs. F.B. Gibson of Penticton, B.C. and Mrs. T.H. Truscotte of Alameda.

The following is taken from a book on Alameda and District published by the Historical Society in 1982.

Submitted by John Irvine Truscott (b. 6 Sept 1908) -

Being the last male of the generation of Truscott's to be born in Canada, it is my responsibility to tell this take. Oh my!

I presume we came from as far back as the dark ages, even perhaps the dark, dark ages. However, be that as it may, maybe we should start at a more acceptable date.

William Truscott was born approximately 1800, give or take a few years. Now, Grandpappy William was no piker, and his better-half was no quitter. For proof of the above statement along came twelve boys and one girl. Assume the nest was small, so the family scattered to Australia, New Zealand, Africa, and some stayed in England. One became the headmaster of a Cornish school, another was one of the doctors of famous Harley Street in London, and another Lord Mayor of London: such illustrious predecessors eh what? Last of all came David, born 1826 - married Elizabeth Ball, born 1826, at St. Ewe, Cornwall, England in 1858. They took off, forthwith, for Canada.

They settled in South Monaghan Township in Ontario. Also, they proceeded to uphold the standards of their forefathers. To prove this, along came six boys and four girls. these were the family that, as a unit, and as individuals, became an integral part of this community. They were: Edward, Fred, Thomas, Archibald, Sidney, Elizabeth, Caroline, Laura, Florance and John.

This is not meant to be a eulogy, just a bit of the life of John Oliver Truscott.

At the age of twenty-two, J.O. 'went west'. as it was called. Arriving in Brandon in 1885, on the train that brought the Riel Rebellion troops west, he ended up in the Alameda district and proceeded to establish himself as a homsteader, SE 1/4 Sec. 24-4-3-2.

There he built a sod house and started to make ready for the family to come west.

J.O. was a very tenacious man. What he put his hand to, he tried to finish. One very hot day, Father had his hands on the walking plow handles. The flies were bad and the oxen capricious. Finally they came, the horse flies. The oxen took off. Father said it must have looked ludicrous. The oxen, the plow, and he, all lined up in the slough, in about two feet of water. However, a store in the offing matured, which made it possible to re-establish himself on reasonably dry ground.

The Truscott family came west in 1889. They established a family home on the NE 1/4 Sec. 14-4-3-2. This home turned into a general hospitality center, and different church denominations held services there, and all were welcome anytime. Grandfather David died in 1891. Grandma predeceased him in the east prior to the westward trek. In the ensuing years, all and sundry spent their time establishing homes and fortunes, such as they were.

J.O. seemed venturesome, along with one William Hamilton, they went to Beinfait, and staked out a claim. This eventually became the Beinfait Collieries. Father had a machine agency in town. He, along with James McClay and Ras Davidson, drilled a good many deep wells in the ensuing years.

He was veterinarian to everyone's sick cows for years on end. When a windmill was erected or repaired, Dad did it. He was a carpenter of sorts, and a general community handyman.

On November 12th 1900, John Truscott and Bertha Witlock were married born of this union were three sons - David Henry April 30 1902, J. Irvine September 1908, Baby January 25 1917 (lived 11 days).

Father had a few firsts - he built the first frame house north of the Souris River, delivered the first load of grain to the Pool elevator, was on the first Board of Directors for the Agriculture Society. He was one of the few men who gave one thousand dollars and his services to build the United Church, as it now stands. He was the one and only man to tell me he never swore.

The old timers often called him "Honest John." Father had deep religious convictions. I remember once I saw father really cross. I'd have sworn, and so would you. Father was milking. It was hot and humid. I was about twelve years. I carried the milk into the separator. The milk pail was half full. Again it was the flies. I watched the old cow swat dad in the face with her tail, time after time. Finally, a heel fly landed. Down went Bossy's head and out came a great big "Mooo," up went Bossy's rear end and away went Pop into the gutter. Bossy's hind feet ended up in the pail. The milk was a thing of the past. Father picked himself up, also the stool, slapped her on the bum and said, "Stand still, you old bitch!" That's the worse I ever heard father say.

There is no end to stories and glorifications if one wishes it to be so. Yet I wish to thank father for the wonderful legacy he left his sons, for us to know

On November 12, 1900 Jack married Bertha Whitlock in Alameda, Saskatchewan. Bertha was born Mar.28,1876 in St. Marys, Ontario and died January 11,1947 in Weyburn, Saskatchewan. Bertha was the only child of my great grandfather Fredrick Whitlock's brother Henry Whitlock b.1847 and his wife Sarah Elizabeth Gilbert. Henry's parents Thomas & Ann (Whitlock) Whitlock had come from Langtree, Devon to St. Marys, Ontario in 1842. This is the WHITLOCK01 family.
