A Register of Births, Deaths, and Marriages, kept in every Registration District in Scotland, are kept in duplicate, one at the Registrar's Office, and one at the Registrar's Office, and after being examined and ascertained, one of the duplicates is retained by the Local Registrar, while the other is transmitted to the Registrar-General in Edinburgh. Every person is entitled to search such Registers, and any relative, connection or inhabitant of the locality of the birth, upon the days and during the hours of business fixed by the Sheriff, or, where an special regulation has been made by him upon the subject, at all reasonable hours on any lawful day, on payment of a fee of 2s. for a General, and 1s. for a Particular Search, and to have an Extract taken in the said Registers for the further sum of 2s. 1d., including Stamp Duty. In the case of a Particular Search, the applicant must also pay a fee of 1s. for every 100 words in the case of a General Search, to be done and require to specify the object of such search. Where any one Search or Extract is required by or on behalf of a Person, the Registrar is entitled to decline to issue the same if he has justly received the Parochial Board (26 & 27 Vict. c. 55, s. 17). Every Extract of any Entry in the Register Books, kept under the provisions of the

Registration Acts (17 & 18 Vict. c. 55, 19 Vict. c. 55, and 26 & 27 Vict. c. 55), duly authenticated and signed, is admissible as evidence in all parts of His Majesty's dominions without any other proof of such Entry. The 26th Section of the Statute 17 & 18 Vict. c. 55 enacts, that "every person who shall wilfully destroy, obliterate, erase, or injure any Entry, or cause to be destroyed, obliterated, erased, or injured any such Register, or Duplicate thereof, or any Minute, Notice, or Certificate made or given pursuant to this Act, or shall wilfully make or cause to be made or inserted, or cause to be inserted or made in any such Register or Duplicate, or any such Minute, Notice, or Certificate, or shall wilfully insert or make or cause to be inserted or made in any such Register or Duplicate, or any false or fictitious Entry of or any false statement bearing any Birth, Death, or Marriage, or shall wilfully give any false Certificate, or falsify any Certificate, or shall certify any Writing to be an Extract of any such Register, knowing the same to be false or untrue in any part thereof, shall be deemed guilty of an offence, and on conviction thereof he shall be liable to be punished by Transportation for a period not exceeding Seven Years, or by Imprisonment for a period not exceeding Two Years."
