

Part of contents of a letter to Eliza Ashton from
 H.M. Johns.

...Aunt Ann Whitlock lived with her nephew, Joshua
 Johns (1816-1891) after Thomas' death in 1875.

I can get a photo of Thos. and his wife Ann, if you
 think they belong to your line, and if you want a
 picture. An elderly granddaughter of Silas Whit-
 lock (nearly probable is 'has it'). Also a
 photo of two boys taken at Darlington or Pickering.
 I have a photographer who has taken pictures from
 the old faded pictures, and make them smaller, so I
 have 16 photos on a sheet, of our really ancest-
 ors (Johns and Whitlocks) in the Johns's Tree. To
 me, it is very interesting. The Whitlocks did not
 order any photo sheets at first, so I didn't put
 these photos in, didn't get them taken off. It
 would cost you \$5.00 each for the photos, if you
 want them. I sold the sheets for \$1.00 each to all
 who wanted them. I would have had Thos. and Ann's
 group finished and on the sheet, had I known so
 many Whitlocks would take them. I sent all the
 photos back to the owners, but I could get them
 again. If you are interested in the Whitlock and
 Johns sheet (16 photos) I will send you one.

In my correspondence, I found a lady whose grand-
 father or mother (a Whitlock) lived in Newfound-
 land. She may have information for you.

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Whitlock of Holsworthy Parish, N. Devon

1. Ann

(1816-1891)
Thomas Whitlock
(1807-1875)

The father was a bell ringer in the established English Church of the same name, but of knew of no blood relationship. He was the son of Richard and Mary Whitlock of Langtree Parish. Married in 1841. He belonged to the established English church. Lived as a boy with his Uncle John W. at Collacut Farm, Langtree, Devon. Uncle John was a local preacher. Thos. also was a lical preacher and was a member of Society of Silsiam in Shepbear Circuit. They came to Canada in 1843, settling in Pickering on Lake Ontario or Darlington, near Pickering on Lake Ontario. Moved to St. Mary's Ontario in 1855.

A. Fredrick
(1842-)

Born in England in 1842. The rest were born in Canada, Isaac (1845), B. Henry (1848), C. Samuel (1849), D. William (1851), E. Sarah (1853), George (1855), F. Richard (1857), G. Walter (1859-1863), H. Minnie (1869-1870), I. John (1859-1880). In 1855, they moved to St. Mary's, Ont. The last three children and the parents are buried in St. Mary's cemetary, (Section A, S 1/2, lot 323). St. Mary's is 17 miles from Elmville where Ann's brothers and a sister, Eliza Johns all had bought farms. They lived at Pickering until 1855. I saw

photos taken in that district of some of the family (on the back of one, "for my cousin Clifford")

2. Silas
(1819-1896)
Mary Hooper
(1819-1914)
Clifford's grandparents. Came to Canada in 1849, as bride and groom. Silas and Bill Johns (Richard's brother) had worked on a farm belonging to Silas' Uncle. Silas was ploughman, and Bill, horse-man.
 3. Isaac
(1821-1899)
Bachelor
Came to Canada in 1857. Got deed for farm Feb. 1st, 1868. Buried in Elmville cemetary.
 4. Eliza
(1823-1904)
Richard Johns
(1824-1910)
Son of William and Mary Johns of Langtree Parish. Came in 1859. (My husband's grandfather). Got deed of land in Jan. 11th, 1860. His parents emmigrated to Canada about ten years after the family came. Buried in Elmville ceme.
 5. Harriet
Lived in Toronto.
 6. Heziah
Lived in Langtree - Simon Square.
 7. James
A sailor lived on N.32 coast of Devon.
- My daughter-in-law, Margaret (Hilborn) - Mrs. Martin Johns great grand daughter of William W.
- William Whitlock (1812-1890) Asa boy lived in Barnstaple, Devon. Married in Barnstaple in 1845
- Mary Brook (1819-1880) She was a school teacher in the Dartmoor district. Her father was the Manager of a mine in Dartmoor district. They came to Canada in

1846 or 1847, with two daughters. They settled near Darlington on Lake Ontario, we think. In 1864 got land near Exeter. Died and buried in Exeter, Ontario.

Williams

Small 'acombe Four children, Martha, Frederick, Ada Rowena, Garnet lived near Exeter, Ontario.

(b) Ann Brooks
(1846-1890)

Buried in Exeter cemetary. Samuel Westaway six children - Mary married Edwin Hilborn (buried in Hamilton cemetary) a) Gordon Hilborn married Audry Lewis, b) Margaret Hilborn married Martin Johns, our oldest son.

William Whitlock had at least three brothers and one sister.

- 2. Isaac (1823/4 -) Came to Canada in 1849. Got his farm near Exeter in 1850.

- 3. Christopher Moved to Wales, Lived at Ryn-graig, K. Neeth, in Glamorgan-shire. Both had large families.

- 5. A sister or cousin lived at Seaforth Ontario.

Jesse Whitlock was a Cousin of William's. He was a ~~Rev.~~ minister, and died in Toronto.
