Dear Peter -

Here is a WHITLOCK family I found in the U.S. census for New York, 1850. It is probably only 20 incidence that the given names include Catherine, Sarah and Benjamin and that they were living in Wayne county where my grandfather DAVIS was born who in 1869 married Mary Louise WHITLOCK probably in Illinois. She had sisters named Sarah and Catherine and named my father Benjamin DAVIS

Presumably the first Martha Ann and Charles were born between George and Sarah. The Martha appearing on this record must have died before 1860 she is not included in that census count when the family had moved to Dwight, Livingston Co. Illinois but John had made his appearance.

So this corroborates the information sent you which you sent to me several years ago. I haven't been working on this line much this past year, however will send you anything worthwhile that comes my way.
