pg 16 Robert was the only child of Abiel & Catharine living at home in 1850 U.S. census - Broadalbin, Fulton Co, N.Y. He is recorded as being born in N.Y. state, also Abiel's wife Catharine born in N.Y.

I'll copy these newer pages next week. I must also check some earlier New York censuses for Saratoga county
