grandmother, Ann Frances Warren Bull. I imagine there is more about this in BW's recollections of his life in Belgium during the war, though I have not read them.

For the cutting I am indebted to my first cousin Adrian Wearne whose mother's birth certificate is recorded at N: 278 in the Dec 93 Newsletter. I wonder how you got this. Are you in touch with another member of my (extended) family?

About my uncle Montague's marriage the answer must be that it was after 1905. I had not appreciated that your lists did not include St Catherine's after that year.

I am taking the opportunity to enclose five certificates (copies) - my grandfather's death, my father's birth, marriage and death and my own birth. I cannot immediately lay hands on my marriage certificate - we were married <sup>at Khartoum</sup> in the (then Anglo-Egyptian)
