Thank You for getting in touch. I wish I had more information to input on Thomas W. Whitlock. I do know he joined Tennessee Volunteers in 1864 in Alabama and served with Union 12th Calvary Co. I. He was listed as absent without leave on June 23, 1865 and arrested near Ft. Leavenworth, Kansas a week later. He was held about 5 days then sent back to his Co. His dishonorable discharge was changed in 1884 to discharge with full benefits. I have since learned from a historian in Tenn. on 12th Calvary that his Co. was disbanded and men were dispersed to other Co's. Numerous men were wrongly charged as deserters since they did not know where they were. No computers then. He did receive full benefits till death.

I have recently learned he married a Mary ? in Indiana and had three children. John Robinson Whitlock, Guy Whitlock, and Emmy May Whitlock.? Help
