To Margaret, my wife, and Eleanor Heyward my daughter, each a foal. All my cattle to be equally shared I give my wife Margaret and my three children Henry, William and Eleanor. My wife sole exix. My friends Mr. Wm. Hay, Mr. Edward Mihill, Mr. Henry Tiler of the Middle Plantation, Overseers. Witnesses: WILLIAM WHITLOCK, Edmond Watts.
