Do you think it will help me to visit the court house and look for records?

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I really can't answer whether or not it would benefit you to go to the courthouse. I have been several times, and to be honest, I have usually walked away disappointed. There doesn't seem to be a lot of information from the early days of Patrick County, which was formed from Pittsylvania County (I checked Pittsylvania, too, and didn't find a Richard Whitlock). They have a very good library there, but again, you have to be lucky enough to want the family that they have done research on. Also, in nearby Bassett, they have a very good library with lots of genealogy.

>From the Abstracts of Wills, Inventories & Accounts, Patrick Co, VA 1791-1823, I find the following:

Estate of Richard L. Whitlock, deceased in account with John P. Carter, administrator. Paid: George Hairston, William Via, Warren Massey, Barnard M. Price Barnard M. Price is my ggg grandfather . Total \$60.28 Returned June court, 1824.

p.192, Sep 12 1822, John Whitlock witnessed a settlement of the estate of William Moore (who MAY also have been my ancestor) in the Legislature of Surry, N.C. I saw nothing in the document that would indicate anything relating to Whitlocks

p206-207 Leathery R. Moore, who is an infant of William Moore, deceased. Dec court 1823 in account with Wm McCraw her guardian, expenses. John Whitlock mentioned.

Also, mentioned again p227-230, account of Wm Moore.

p181. Account of estate of John Johnson, decep330ased. Signed by Thomas *MISC* Whitlock, July court 1820

p.201. Alfred Moore account with G. Moore, guardian from Dec 1820 to Dec 1822, commissioner was Thomas Whitlock.

p221 Account current of Gallehue Moore, guardian for John Moore. Signed by Thomas Whitlock, May court 1825

In Halifax County, Jan 3rd 1769, Thomas Whitlock witnessed the will of James Hendrick

I assume you already have the will of Thomas Whitlock in Halifax County, but I'll give you the abstract anyway.

To my beloved wife Elizabeth Whitlock, money , etc. divided among my 7 children beginning at my son John Whitlock, Thomas Whitlock, Patty Arnold, Morning Medley, Temprence Bartlet, Gilly Lipscombe, Leuce Whitlock, my dearly beloved children and at the death of my wife that part lent her to be sold by Ex. & divided in the same manner. Executors are "my loving friends Jeremiah Pate and William Edwards, surety is Thomas Whitlock. Written Dec 27 1779, Proved June 15 1780. Witness by John Estes, Mathew Pate, Edward Dowdy, Elizabeth Edwards. Presented by Jeremiah Pate and William Edwards exr. Sec: John Shackelford, Joseph Gill and Thomas Lipscomb

Thomas Whitlock witnessed the will of William Edwards, June 21 1780. William Edwards names his wife, Elizabeth Edwards. Nov 16 1780, presented in court and James Coleman and Richard Edwards, exr. named refused & on motion of Elizabeth Edwards, widow & relict certificate granted her for probate.

Sorry I am not able to help you any further. I have only listed the bare facts in the above notes, because it really wasn't very helpful. If you need anything specific, I'll be glad to copy it in detail, but as I said, there wasn't much.
