>I have scanned through the 1900 WVA census records and should be able to verify all of the Kanawha county families.

>

>1. A.G. Whitlock - I believe this must be Albert G. Whitlock (b. 1863) who was the son of William Robert Whitlock (b. 1834) and Frances Webb (b.1841). Alberts wife was named Ema C. Gay (b. 1868).

>

>2. Chas. Whitlock - Charles B. Whitlock (b. 1876) was the brother of Albert and the son of William Robert Whitlock. Charles married Ella Brogan (b. 1878).

>

>* William Robert Whitlock was the son of Preston Whitlock and Martha Mary Martin.

>

>3. Charley Whitlock - I have a Charles E. Whitlock (b. 1874) who was the son of John Preston Whitlock. His wife was named Carrie B. (b 1874). They had 12 children. Ida M. (b 1898) and Lurena (b. 1900) must be the two listed.

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>4. James M. Whitlock - James M. Whitlock (b. 1853) was the son of Giles Whitlock (b. 1824) and Sarah Jane Green (b. 1824). James married Jacova Alice Elkins (b. 1859). Giles was the son of Preston. I have 8 children listed for James and Jacova.

>

>5. John A. Whitlock - John A. Whitlock was the son of Thomas J. Whitlock (b. 1820) and Susan Sneed. Thomas was the brother of Preston. John married Mary Buckle and had 7 children.

>

>6. John P. Whitlock - He is my gggrandfather. He was born 1841. He married Elizabeth Dearing (b. 1842). He was the son of Preston. John had 11 children although I can only find 8. Joel Preston is my ggrandfather and the son of John Preston.

>

>7. Susan Whitlock - Susan (Sneed) was the wife of Thomas J. Whitlock. Nanie was their daughter and married William Walters when Mary B. was 18 and Blanch was 14.

>

>8. W. R. Whitlock - William Robert Whitlock (b. 1834). He was the son of Preston. His wife was Frances Web(b. 1841). They had 8 children.

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>All of these Whitlocks and lots more are in the information I sent to you in the mail. All are descendants of Richard L. Whitlock and Sarah J. Hancock from Patrick county Virginia.
