Subject: Richard Nicholas Whitlock et al

Greetings:

Received the newsletter today and it has spurred me to get on this information that you asked for six months ago.

This is the information that I have. Richard Nicholas was born in Gordonsville, VA in October 1829. He was married in Madison County, Kentucky on December 21, 1849, to Elizabeth Tudor. An Albert Whitlock born about 1825 married Elizabeth's sister Adaline Tudor and Albert and Richard Nicholas (also listed as R.N. on some records) lived next to each other according to the 1860 Kentucky Census. I believe that Richard Nicholas were probably brothers, but have no proof. Richard Nicholas married Elizabeth Stinnett after Elizabeth Tudor's death in 1876 and supposedly had four children by her, according to my mother's notes, but I have been unable to find any information on them. His children by Elizabeth Tudor are George S. born in 1852, William Morris (my ancestor) born in 1854, James A. born in 1856, Richard N. born in 1859, Robert born in 1860, Joseph Thomas born in 1862, Alice born in 1864 and Pete Stepherson born in 1867. The only one of them that I have been able to trace, is Joseph Thomas. Albert Whitlock and Adaline Tudor had two sons, John L. born about 1850 and James Valentine, born about 1853. All of the children were born in Madison County, Kentucky. I have been to Kentucky, but as far as I know not to Madison County. From a cousin that is doing genealogy work on the Gray line....my Dads mother, where the Whitlock's and Gray's lived was in the hills and hollers, making moonshine and so forth so may not have wanted to be too well known to the authorities. May have led the same sort of life in Virginia. Miles Tudor has done an excellent job in researching the Tudor line, but he's got his hands full research his own line and really isn't too interested in the Whitlocks.

Have found that I'm also related to John Whitlock of Fairfield, CT., on my mother's side, through the Sherwood's.

Actually I've found that I'm a descendant of a lot of interesting lines.

Have found Dutch and French Huguenot lines going back to New Paltz, NY.

I'm skeptical that you will have any information on these people, but maybe someday we'll find some.

Hope this helps.

Peter, This is informaton that I forgot I had. Pete Stepherson Whitlock born in Kentucky in 1867 was married to Annie Long. This is probably some sort of cousin. Also the Kentucky Death Index 1911-1986 shows two Pete S Whitlock's. One died July 1, 1978 at age 80 years, and would have been Wm Morris's son and my grandfathers, brother. The other Pete S. died Aug. 11, 1959 at age 91 and would have been Richard Nicholas and Elizabeths' son.

I went back to the 1850 Kentucky Census today and found a James Whitlock , age 24 married to a Mary and am wondering if he could be a brother to Albert and Richard Nicholas. It also shows that all three were born in Madison County, Kentucky, so maybe I had it wrong all along that R. N. was born in Virginia. There is also a large contigent of Long's in Madison Co., and am wondering if maybe Valentine and Lucy Ann didn't maybe follow her brother(s) out to Madison County before they had children.
