Peter,

So sorry to be tardy in returning your E-Mail. As you know, we live in New Hampshire. Both my wife and I work for Loon Mountain Ski Resort during the winter (we're avid skiers) and February is starting into the "high" season. Between working and settling in our new home (we relocated from Connecticut and moved in on 12/22), it's been pretty busy.

Anyway, to fill you in on James S. Whitlock (he died at age 25, we believe it was typhoid fever). He was a clerk at the T.H. Whitlock Store in Croton Falls, NY. Yes, he was the son of Artemus Whitlock and Sarah Tucker Whitlock. They had seven children, only two of which we can trace. One child was Anna G. Whitlock, who married S. Allen Kennard of Brooklyn, NY. Other child was James S. Whitlock, B. Croton Falls, NY 2/14/1880, D. Danbury CT 5/1952. Married Mary Dyer in 1902, Bronx, NY. James and Mary had six children, Ellsworth, Evelyn, Gilbert, James J. (my father), Laura & Dorothy. After that, I can provide all details to the present time. Actually, the first born grandson with Whitlock name was born on Aug. 13, 1999. It was our son's son. His name is William Harry Whitlock. The first male Whitlock of his generation. Our son is the oldest male of his generation.

As I said before, I have information to the direct line from present back to Joseph Whitlock B. 1718, married Mary Jarvis of Westport, Conn. Have names of two previous generations (Thomas and John) but no details. Please let me know if you have any information that may help us and if you need any more details from us.

Peter,

I believe I have read your documentation correctly. The earliest Whitlock you have is John (G1) d. 1659. Our earliest is also John, but we have no dates. I created a Microsoft Word document using what I believe is the same outline format and began with John. It has more details all the way down to our new grandson, William Harry. Hope it helps.

As we are originally from Danbury, CT, we noticed a few things in your document that may help you:

John Whitlock b. 12/15/1717. Married Mary Lee in Danbury CT. There was a very famous Lee Hat Factory during the golden age of hat manufacturing in Danbury (was known as the Hat City of the world). Possibly a connection.

Hannah Whitlock, b. 10/2/1743. M. Elijah Barnum. 2/1/1738 of Danbury CT, PT. Barnum, the famous circus owner, was born in Bethel, CT (the next town). Possibly a connection. Further down there is a reference to a SEELEY. There is a Seeley Street in Danbury, CT to this day.

Several other names are familiar. Benedit (famous Revolutionary War General from the area). WEED - old Bethel name, believe the family died out.

These bits of information may help someone who comes to you for information on their family trees. I believe some of these names have books written about them or, in the case of the LEE name, the hat manufacturing industry of Danbury.

Here is my document. Please advise if you can make a connection to us.
