Thank you for the email and yes I would like to talk to you about this family. My telephone number is 1 703 369-1021 and you can reach me either morning (Sat. or Sun) between 8 and 11 or in the evening on Sunday between 8 and 10. I am home other times but I'm just not sure when.

As for Mary C Holland's birth date I think she was born in 1796 as stated in that paper I sent you. I saw the notation Mary C age 21 in the Goochland County Marriage Bond book and I think you are right that it means she was at least 21. My reasons for liking the 1796 date are:

1. The Religious Herald of April 28, 1864 had an obituary of her and stated that

she died March 28, 1864 "in her 68 year of age." I took that to mean that she

was not yet 68 otherwise I think it would say she was 68 years old. This would put her birth in 1796.

2. In the 1830 census she was listed as being between 30 and 40 which falls in the range.

3. Her daughter Judith Holland was born about 1820 which means Mary Holland was about 24 when she had her and I think that is more likely than her being

13 years old which she would be if she was born in 1807.

Does this sound right to you? Let me know what you think and I am really looking forward to talking with you.

I am so glad to hear from you. I can't believe that you found John Thomas Whitlock in Philadelphia in 1900. It is him and the Charles B Winston he is living with was married to John's sister Isabella. I would never have found this. I assumed he was dead. I have a newspaper clipping of Thomas and Clara's wedding and there was no mention of any of his aunts or father among the guests so I thought they were not alive. Both boys were sent to a boarding school for underprivileged children and Jennie Traylor was listed on the application as their guardian. I guess John Thomas was not a good father and they did not keep in touch.

In answer to your questions

#1 Howard is also in the 1910 census with a third child Howard L age 6 I did not find him in Virginia in the 1920 census and don't know what happened to him

#2 Thomas address is 180 South 9

The marriage places were 1900 Brooklyn, N.Y., 1926 Brooklyn for the licence but they got married somewhere upstate N.Y. and my marriage was in Short Hills N.J.

I am mailing you some papers tomorrow. I am stillshocked to hear your news about John Thomas. Thank you very much .
