Do any of these Whitlocks tie in to your family information? If so, can you fill in any missing info for me? I appreciate any help you can give and will try to reciprocate. Many of the farmers in Greene and Jersey County came from Tennessee, Kentucky or Virginia. In the 1810 Virginia Fed Census I found Tarlton and R.C. Whitlock - these same names also appear as settlers in Greene County, IL. Looking forward to hearing from you -

Thank you very much for your interesting e-mail and information! I have never done too much research on my mother's family lines, but I will share what I have.

I have George Washington Whitlock's marriage certificate in which he states that he was born in Denton County, Texas and that he will be 22 years old on his next birthday. His birthdate was 22 Feb. 1860 and he and Rachel Minerva Grizzle were married on 7 Aug 1881 at the home of J.M. Whitlock in Greene County, Illinois, and was witnessed by Robt. Watson and Wm. Whitlock. He lists his father as John Whitlock and his mother as Emaline Myres. (Spelling is as written)

I have George Washington Whitlock's death certificate. He died in Our Savior's Hospital in Jacksonville, Morgan County, IL. 5 Dec. 1925 due to cancer and was buried in Oak Grove Cemetery. His birthplace was listed as Texas, town unknown. Father was listed as John H. Whitlock (unknown birthplace) and Emaline Meyer (born in Illinois, town unknown). The informant was his wife, Mrs. George Whitlock.

I also have a land record: Grantor: William H. Whitlock and Sarah J. Whitlock, his wife of Rockbridge, IL Grantee: George W. Whitlock
Dated 31 May 1920

George's father was John H. Whitlock. I have his marriage certificate which states that on 16 Dec. 1841, John H. Whitlock married Miss Emaline Myers. Apparently both John and Emaline were younger than the legal age for marriage because both of their father's had to write authorizations to Jersey County to issue the marriage license. John's father Hemney Whitlock wrote his authorization on 13 Dec. 1841 (it is signed by him) and Emaline's father, Dan Meyers (or Myers - handwriting is difficult to read) wrote his on 16 Dec. 1841.

My mother gave me the following information: she remembered her grandfather, George Washington Whitlock and his sister, Sarah Abner Whitlock. Sarah was born 18 Aug 1854 (not sure if she was born in Texas or Illinois). She married (first name unknown) Cunningham. She died on 20 May 1940 in Fidelity, Greene County, IL and is buried in the Whitlock Cemetery in Greene County. I requested her death certificate in 1997 but apparently never received it, because I don't have it!

In the book, Greene and Jersey Counties, Volume II Early Marriages, Early Residents and Where They Came From, compiled by Jean Maire, the following

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Whitlock's are listed:

(Since the three earliest Whitlocks came in 1826-9, I'm guessing they all came from Virginia - ?)

In the book, Greene County Illinois Marriages May 5, 1870 - Feb. 26, 1891, by George B. King, the following Sarah Whitlock marriages are listed:

S.J. Whitlock pg. 66 (not sure first name is Sarah but it fits with the land

record below for Sarah J. and

William H. Whitlock)

Sarah Whitlock pg. 6

Sarah E. Whitlock pg. 94

Sarah M. Whitlock pg. 68

Sarah R. pg. 102

Also other Whitlock females: Alice pg 76, Ellen pg 36, Isabell J pg 12, Louisa pg 192, Martha J. pg 62, Mary C. pg 84, Nancy S. pg 86, and Susan C. pg 52. Male Whitlock marriages listed are: Charles O. pg 116, George pg 174, George W. pg 108, Isaac N. pg 46, John C. pg 64, Marion pg 28, Taylor pg 12, W.H. pg 66, and William T. pg 174. I did not make copies of any except my George W. - but the book is still available - I found it at the Ft. Wayne, IN genealogy library.

And finally, my last source: History of Greene County by Greeley (from the Ft. Wayne Library) on page 795 :

"William Mason, deceased, . . . was married, Dec. 30, 1850, to Abigail (Whitlock) Ritchey, daughter of Capt. James and Rhoda Whitlock. By this union they had three children, all of whom are dead. . . . Capt. James Whitlock, deceased, came to Greene County in 1819, and located in what is now known as Kane Township, on section 20, where he bought 900 acres of land on that and adjoining sections, and remained until 1850. In April of that year, he started on the road to California with three teams, and got as far as the plains when he took the cholera and died. There was quite a train of emigrants going through at the same time, and a great many of them died with this disease. In the year 1820, James was married to Rhoda Green, widow of Thomas Greene. They were the parents of 10 children - Elizabeth, Abigail, Matheny, John W., Nancy, Henry R., Hannah D., and three who died as infants. Only three are *now living, Abigail, Matheny and Hannah. Capt. Whitlock served all through the Black Hawk war of 1831-2." * I didn't write down the year this book was published - but it was quite old! I believe this was the only Whitlock mentioned in this book or I would have copied more pages!

I have not had time to really look at the family data you sent me. It sounds like you research the Whitlock's a lot more than I do! If I learn anything else, I will be happy to share. I hope this info will be helpful to you as you sort out these Whitlock families. I go to the library at Ft.

Wayne, IN about twice a year, so if you want copies of anything from the books I mentioned, let me know! Hope to hear from you soon!
