I have a list of 12 children of James and Sarah Whitlock Radford that comes from various (totally non-documented and often inaccurate) sources within my parents' & grandparents records.

Thomas (1789 -); James W. (or John) (1790-1850); William Layton/Laton (1798-1875); Raymond (1800-); Millender (1801-); Riley (1805-1850); Charles (1807-); Luford (1809-1868); Mary (abt 1811-); Elizabeth (abt 1813-); George (abt 1815-); Caleb (1824-1896). Note that this last child would have been born when he was 62 - possible, but not probable? Maybe someone else's?

I have some spousal names also. I'd love to trade info. My direct connection is James W. who married Martha Petty.

I've just begun looking at this family. It has been 'lurking' in the file drawer for years and years. Now I'm living in central Virginia for a few more months and decided I really should take advantage of the chance to do original research.

I'll have to take some time to digest this, and to follow some of the threads in the GenForum, but it appears you guys are doing some terrific work.

Can I do anything here? I'll try to put together the legitimate facts and dates I have on the later generations and get them to you. My John Whitlock Radford (1814 - 1889) was one of the early Utah Mormon pioneers - arrived in 1850.

"John W. Radford was one of the early settlers of Fillmore, Millard Co., Utah. He was a city alderman for a time and is noted in many of the histories and records of the county. He helped build and operate one of the first sawmills in Fillmore. He participated in the United Order and a Consecration Deed giving all their possessions to the [Mormon] Church was filed, showing total worth of \$572.50, including 3 pieces of land totaling 16 1/2 acres, house, mill, yoke of oxen, cows, calves, etc..

"He was superintendent of the building of the Old Fort Deseret in Deseret Utah during the Black Hawk war. He later settled Oak City in Millard County and in 1889, moved to another new area to settle - Star Valley, Wyoming - where he died that year. It was one of the worst winters on record in that area - cattle and wild game died by the thousands.

"His body was later moved to the family cemetery in Ririe, Jefferson, Idaho."
