1976 Morgan Co. History, on page 360 there is a story of John Whitlock whose Father was William Sr. and mother Roseanna Shelton Whitlock. The William Sr. and wife came to Morgan County in 1829...one of Wm. Sr's children listed was named Sally...nothing is said about her. The story does say that the tombstone of William Sr. is in Whitlock Cemetery , southwest of Nortonville where he died Dec. 2, 1833 at age 72....and mentions a will in the Morgan County circuit clerk's office dated Nov. 24, 1834. This might give a clue or two about daughter Sally who may be the Sally Whitlock who m. your John Story.

Subject: Re: [ILGREENE] John W. Story b 1807/Sarah Whitlock; NC>TN>IL>NE?

William and Roseanna (Shelton) Whitlock, my gggg grandparents, had approx nine children. One of them, Sarah, born Feb. 15, 1815 married John Bracewell. Her brother, Thomas, married Nancy Story so there was a connection between Whitlocks and Storys. I don't see any reference to any other Sarah however, William (above) had two brothers Alexander and Charles who could have had a daughter named Sarah.

Check out the MAGA site for Morgan County. There is a lot of information there. The Gunn Cemetery, AKA Rimbey Cemetery lists 26 Storys buried there. There is an Elizabeth Story there listed as wife of J.W. Story. There also is two boys, George T. and Albert W., listed as sons of J.W. Story. It doesn't list a John W. Typical of old cemeteries many graves were unmarked when the names were recorded.

Also check out Gunn/Story Cemetery. It doesn't list names but tells some of the history of that cemetery.

The 1870 Morgan County census, page 641, lines 33-34 lists a John and Sarah Story ages 28 & 20 with one child, Harry age 2. The dates don't work out though.

There were a lot of Whitlocks and Storys around Morgan and Greene counties. The Whitlocks came to Greene County from Kentucky around 1828.

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> I am DESPERATE to find information about John W. Story, who could be my "brick wall." Could someone help? Perhaps census lookups, probate records--anything to prove his existence...

> James Story (John W's father) & family migrated from NC to Tenn, arriving in Morgan County, IL c 1810; there were 11 children, and I am certain one of the sons is the father of my gg grandfather John H. Story (m Parthena Gunn). Some of the family apparently went on to Clay Co, NE

>

> I've seen lots of research on the brothers (Vincent & Parrish Garner), but NONE on John W & Sarah. The dates correspond--John W married c.1820; John H. b 1822. John W/Sarah may have left Morgan Co, IL. Some of the relatives migrated to Clay Co., Neb. Perhaps John W & Sarah were with them...

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> Here's what I have...

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> JAMES STORY b 1770 NC; d 1830-40 Morgan Co IL; m HANNAH MARY SELF, dau of Parrish Self; b c.1775 in VA; d c.1850 Morgan Co IL

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> 2/ JOHN W STORY b 1807 NC; d 1871 reportedly in Morgan Co IL; m Sarah "Sally" Whitlock c.1820

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> 3/ John H. Story b 1822 Tenn; d bef 1880? [[Thena living alone in 1880 census]]; m Parthena "Thena" Gunn 2/22/1844, Morgan Co, Illinois; b 5/10/1825, Dickson, TN

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> Supposedly John H/Parthena's son, Charles W. Story (John W's grandson), migrated to Clay County, Neb. I wonder if "Grandma & Grandpa" went there too?

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> Please, please help! I've found info on most of the rest of the family, but just this tiny snippet on John W. I'm fairly new to genealogy, and am not sure how to go about this.
