Marriage at Pitton 28 Aug 1803,  
William Cusse (shown as Cufse) to Jane Whitlock  
Witnesses, Mary Seaward, Stephen Seaward, & Robert White  
Jane signed register as JEAN

Monumental Inscription in Pitton Churchyard;

William Cusse d. 29 Oct 1826 age 53  
Jane Cusse d. 23 Sept. 1820 age 45

>From Pitton P.R's.

bpt. 15 Sept. 1776, Jenny dau Thomas & Martha Whitlock,  
born 10 Sept.

This provides marriage another link between my Seaward family  
and a Whitlock family of Pitton!

William Cusse was the illegitimate son of Mary Cusse, b. 15 Feb.  
1773, bpt. 27 June 1773 both at Pitton.

Have recently received film of several wills for Pitton/Farley,  
included one for Henry Seaward (on my Seaward chart), he left his  
leasehold to Mary Cusse, his housekeeper and mentions several  
children including William, Stephen Seaward (when he married  
entry said alias Cusse), Ann Seaward, and Mary Prewett (nee  
Cusse) deceased. Thrilled to find this will, always wondered which  
of the Seaward males was the father of Mary Cusse's children.

Henry never married, suppose the reason why he never married  
Mary Cusse was a class matter. Seaward family were from  
yeoman stock.

Will now have to sort out Thomas Whitlock & Martha's family to  
add to my data base!
