Something else I meant to inquire about:

My grandfather was T.D. Whitlock. His sister and four of his children have/had cerebellar atrophy/ataxia, which we're told is a hereditary deterioration of the cerebellum. This condition has its onset around age 60 and results in the slow loss of all muscle coordination. My dad, two of my uncles and my aunt have all been completely debilitated by this.

Do you know of any other Whitlock's who have this condition? My cousin Jim (a physician at Vanderbilt University Hospital) and a geneticist will or have isolated the defective gene. They might like to study anyone else who has the condition. Also, others in the Whitlock line might benefit from the research some day.
