Hi Peter;

Thanks again for your help in finding information on the Whitlock who married one of my ancestors, Jonathan Ogden.

I am sending you this email because:

1. I have some information on the children of Jonathan Ogden and Millie Whitlock which you may want to include in your data base for the Whitlock Family Association. I have found records for the Anglican Church in Gagetown, Queens Co, NB (available on-line at <http://homepages.rootsweb.com/~nbpast/Church/gage-ang-chr-l.htm>) which list christenings for 3 children of Jonathan and Millie Ogden on 2 March 1794. The names of the children are William, Rachel and Millie; birthdates are not given.

2. I found a minor typo in a file on the Whitlock Family Association website. The reference is entry # X 498/1 in the file X Misc which refers to handwritten " Notes on Jonathan & Mila (Whitlock) Ogden (M1790's) of Owen County, N.B., Canada from Helene deWit". The reference to "Owen county" should be "Queens county". There is no Owen county in New Brunswick and, from other records such as the Anglican church records mentioned above, I know that the Ogdens were living in Queens county NB; in addition, it is not hard to see how the hand written word "Queens" could be read as "Owen".

3. I would like to know if it is possible to get a xerox copy of Helene deWits handwritten " Notes on Jonathan & Mila (Whitlock) Ogden (M1790's) of Owen County, N.B., Canada " which are referenced by the above entry in the X Misc file. I will write to Helene deWit at the address you gave me, but the date for this address, 15 Aug 1986, makes me worry that she may no longer be there. If the Whitlock Family Association has copies of these notes in a file somewhere, I would very much appreciate receiving a copy if this is possible.

I have only secondary evidence that the 2nd wife of Jonathan Ogden was a Whitlock. The Anglican church christening records mentioned above give the name Millie (sometimes read as Milla), but no maiden name is given, so I can only infer that Millie Whitlock is the full name of his 2nd wife. Also, I can not identify this Millie Whitlock as being the daughter of John and Sarah Whitlock from Goochland VA. This scenario is believable if John Whitlock from Goochland VA is the same as the loyalist John Whitlock who served in the Queens Rangers during the American revolution and then settled in New Brunswick, Canada after the war.

It appears that Helene deWit has found some evidence beyond that which I

have, and I hope it is discussed in more detail in her notes.
