In the 1840 census for New Haven County, Southbury, Ct. it shows Sally Whitlock as living alone.

On March 12th, of 1839, Elisha Pearce purchased from Daniel Couch Whitlock & wife, land in Southbury, Ct., parish of South Britain. The land had been given to Sally Whitlock wife of D. C. Whitlock by Seth N. Wheeler and wife. Daniel C. Whitlock and Sally Whitlock's names were both

on the Deed. This same land was then given by Elisha Pearce to Russell Pearce's children on May

31, 1839. Marietta E. Hinman and Daniel Hinman were Witnesses and Daniel Hinman was the Justice of Peace at the time.

I do not know who the Daniel and Sarah were that you found in Newtown, Ct. Fairfield Cty. but, I

must say that is interesting as Caroline (Pearce) Fairchild was their granddaughter and she did live

in Newtown, Ct. Caroline is one of Russell and Sarah (Whitlock) Pearce's children that was given

the land from Elisha Pearce.

I believe though like I said that Daniel Couch Whitlock died sometime after the land was sold in

1839. In the 1840 census on the same page as the listing for Russell Pearce (Pierce) it shows Sally Whitlock and she's alone. Also interestingly there is a man in Russell's house that is over 60

and under 70 years of age and I believe that was Elisha Pearce. If there's anything that I can do to

help your search let me know.

I haven't made any progress on Ephraim Whitlock. So many records were burned either intentionally or unintentionally it gets kind of frustrating at times. An Ephraim Whitlock showed up

in Sherman, Ct. but he was younger than my Ephraim. I was pretty excited for awhile thinking that I

found him.
