Subject: RE: [MAYFIELD] Battle

Cathy,

Battle and John W. actually moved to Jackson County, GA in 1802. They are in the tax records for Jackson County beginning in 1802 or 1803. They live on Hurricane Creek. Living in the same militia district with Battle is Charles Whitlock. I believe that Battle's first wife was a Whitlock and Charles is either his wife's brother or father. Robert Whitlock must be closely associated with Charles Whitlock as well. Since Robert owned or inherited the mill, he probably stayed in Union. Battle makes frequent trips back and forth between Union District and Jackson County. Battle must have always been on the go since we find him in land transactions in Union District in 1805, 1808 and 1812 with Robert Whitlock. Battle's mother, Mary Crain Mayfield, joins them in Georgia after 1810 and then obtains land through the 1817 Land Lottery (I've forgotten which county she got her land in but I have been meaning to get to the Georgia State Archives to search through their files for any tax or land records - it may have been Wilkes County). Also in the same militia district along Hurricane Creek is Moses Snow, the father of Abea Snow who would become Battle's second wife.

>I went back through Phil's notes and looked again at the property on Brown's creek that Battle owned. ?He owned the tract with a Robert Whitlock of Whitlock's Mill. ?In November of 1805 when the property was purchased, he would have been 20. ?Since this Whitlock name pops up in some of his grandchildren, could Battle's first wife have been a Whitlock? ?James, his 1st son was born about 1807. This land was sold and Battle moved to GA about 1808. ?Date of purchase 20 Nov 1805 and sold 02 Jan 1808. ?I have never found marriage records for this area, but would be curious if anyone else has heard of any. ?James converted to a Baptist in 1827, but his father does not

Hi Peter,

The Whitlock connection to the Mayfields is tenuous at this time because we do not have a deed that shows a dower for a Whitlock wife or any marriage record. Battle Mayfield had a son James, born about 1805-1807 timeframe probably South Carolina (according to census records). We have been unable to uncover a church record, a gravesite in Jackson County or any connection to prove a Whitlock woman was married to Battle. However, I note that Robert Whitlock's parents were married at St. James in Goochland, VA. I would like to know if there are parish registers for the Anglican church for the 96th District available for this time frame. I know Gary has searched all the Baptist records, but if Battle was a Tory he would not have been a Baptist. After the revolution a lot of southerners converted to Presbyterian or Baptist and Methodist. Those records have been pretty well searched to no avail. I know Battle's son James did not convert to Baptist until 1827 in Gwinnett co. GA, so it is likely that he and his father were still of the Anglican faith. The NC Mayfields were Methodist and there is no mention of Battle and the SC Mayfield's being of the Methodist faith. I will do what I can online today looking in Jackson, Franklin and Gwinnett, but I suspect that the best way to tell if a marriage occurred will be in a church microfilm of the Anglican faith in the Union Co. SC area. I remember surfing the websites and finding very little online, but I may try the Family History Center here in town later this week. I have not looked at your website yet, because my husband gets a little cranky when I put new software on the computer without his presence and I will have to download the Winzip program to read your files. Looks like your family is very well documented and that all of you have shared very nicely. Let me know if there is anything further that you would like to know about Battle. Cathy

Subject: Whitlocks

I searched 1800 Union Co. So. Carolina Census today and found many Whitlocks. According to some Whitlock researchers, a Robert Whitlock died in 1804 and left a will naming his children. I would like to obtain a copy of that document. I found the following Whitlocks:

On Page 18 is Robert Whitlock. He is over 45 with a wife over 45 and 4 males 16-25 and two females 16-25 with 4 children under 10.
Next door is Thomas 26-44 wife 26-44 with small children. Probably a son of William Whitlock who is next door with 3 slaves. William is over 45 with wife over 45 and one daughter 16-25.
3 households down is Betsey Whitlock single 26-44 with 6 children.
Next door to her is Suzanna Whitlock She is 16-25 with 2 children under 10. Next to Suzanna is Joel Bently and William Bently. Joel appears on several of the Mayfield deeds as a witness. Would be curious to know if Suzanna was a Bently who married a Whitlock.

I found a James Whitlock on Page 7 quite a bit away from these families. He was age 26-44 with a wife 26-44 and a female age 16-25. It's possible that this daughter could be a candidate for Battle's wife. She might have named her first son after her father. Anyway there are numerous candidates in the Whitlock households. Just thought I would let everyone know that I have checked on the online sources available and it looks like a trip to the archives in SC will be necessary to possibly come up with the will of 1804 quoted by a Whitlock researcher.

Robert and William could be brothers they are both over 45. Thomas is young enough

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to be eldest son of Wm or Robert. Looks like the sons married to Betsey and Suzanne have died. James is out on his own away from the other properties, so is likely a second son who would not inherit. They are likely Anglican since the Whitlock researcher indicated a marriage in VA at an Anglican church. St. James. If anyone is going to the SC archives soon, I would appreciate your checking for a marriage between a Whitlock woman and Battle. Thanks Cathy

Subject: Robt Whitlock's will and visit to SC Archives

Cathy,

I plan on being at the SC Archives next week, probably Tuesday and Wednesday. I have a long list of items to search for on my Wilbanks, Mayfield, Bentley, Waite, Little, Howard, Wilson and Marchbanks lines. The only thing that could keep me from going is some problems with dizziness that may prevent me from driving. But I feel pretty optimistic that I will make it.

I also have a Wilbanks Family reunion to attend on Sunday in Greenville, SC. The descendants of John W. Wilbanks and Sarah E. Mayfield (daughter of Battle Mayfield b. 1800) will be in attendance.

You mentioned Joel Bentley. He is my gggg-grandfather. Joel Bentley and his brother William Bentley were the bastard children of Sally Bentley. Joel was the younger brother and was born abt. 1780. These two men were the only children of Sally so I don't think Suzanne would be a sister to these two men and they would be too young to have a daughter married to a Whitlock. The Whitlock and Bentleys do marry a couple of generations later. I'll have to check through some packed records to get names and dates. Joel Bentley also bought land a couple of times from MARY MAYFIELD on Browns Creek between 1800 and 1805. And finally, Joel Bentley was Presbyterian as were his descendants through his son Henry Bentley.

The will of Robert Whitlock: I can get a copy of it while I am at the SC Archives. I do have an abstract from Brent Holcomb's book, "Union County South Carolina Will Abstracts 1787-1849."

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Union County Will Book A - Page 66

Pp. 70-71: Will of ROBERT WHITLOCK of Union District.... to my wife Agness Whitlock, for the time of her life, all my goods and chattels, and after her death to my son ROBERT, my house and land upon his discharging a debt due from me to Alexander McBeth; to my daughter PATSEY, one cow & calf; rest of my goods and chattels to be equally divided amongst my children; my wife Extx, and son ROBERT, exr., 31 Dec 1801. ROBERT WHITLOCK (LS), Wit: Christopher Brandon, Robert Bevil, Eliz'a Bevel (X). Proved 19 Nov 1804 by Chrisotpher Brandon and Robert Bevil.

So Cathy, the dying Robert in the above will mentions a daughter Patsey who might be a candidate for Battle Mayfield's first wife. He also has a son Robert who is probably the Robert in the land transactions with Battle and they are probably about the same age to be friends and business partners.

Next, in the will above, the Bevil's are mentioned. They are married into the Whitlocks and the Bentleys a generation or two later. The Bevil's are also Presbyterians. This makes me think the reason your Battle Mayfield is not mentioned in the Baptist records like his brother Richard or his son, James is that Battle was Presbyterian and he remained Presbyterian all his life. There could also be a possibility of his being Anglican and maybe a slight chance of being Methodist.

I notice another will in this Brent Holcomb book - for William Whitlock
Page 67

Pp. 74-75: Will of William Whitlock of Union District.... to my wife Molly, the tract I now live on 171 acres, negro fellow Natt, wench Nell, household furniture, etc; to my son John, one dollar; to my daughter NANCY, one dollar; to my daughter BETSEY, one dollar; to my daughter MOLLY, negro wench Jane, and after the deceased of my wife Molly to my daughter MOLLY negro wench Nell; after the death of my daughter MOLLY, all of the above mentioned with their increase to be given to her three first children William, Nancy & Betsey; after the death of my wife Molly, the tract whereon I now live to my daughter SALLY, also a negro gorl Sarah; my wife Molly, sole extx., 26 Nov 1804. Wm Whitlock (LS), Wit: Robrt Bevil, Saul Mise (X), James Whitlock (X). Proved by Robert Bevil and James Whitlock, 23 May 1805.

So we now have a few more Whitlock children who could be candidates for Battle's wife. They are Nancy, Betsey, Molly, and Sally. Unfortunately, we do not know if they are married at this time except for Molly who has three children according to the will.

I'll see what more I can dig up.

Peter,

Thanks for the files that you have attached.

I am descended from Battle Mayfield(b. 1800; d. 1868). He is the nephew of the Battle Mayfield (b. 1778; d. after 1850) that Cathy Mayfield is descended from. Cathy's Battle Mayfield is the one that we suspect married a Whitlock as his first wife. This first marriage has intrigued both of us and we would love to get this mystery solved. Your help with this is greatly appreciated.

Interestingly, I am also descended from Salley Bentley who is the mother of the bastard children, William Bentley and Joel Bentley. Salley never married but apparently had a lover back in Amelia County, VA. Joel Bentley is actually my gggg-grandfather. Joel and William had numerous children who married into the Vaughans, Porters, Whitlocks, Brandons and other Browns Creek families. There was also one other Bentley named Jeremiah Bentley. He may have been Salley's brother, cousin or uncle. He is probably the father of any Bentley women that married prior to 1816 since he was older than the other Bentleys and I think he may have been a Revolutionary War veteran.

It's been a while since I have dug into these families and even then, I did not get too detailed. I'll start trying to sort these Bentleys out and figure out which ones may have married into the Whitlocks. And we need to determine which of the available Whitlock women may have married Battle Mayfield around 1803-1805 and moved with him to Jackson County, GA along Hurricane Creek.
