I am very near the Old St. Mary's Presbyterian Churchyard Cemetery, where John Whitlock and Lydia ( Howell ) Whitlock are buried. Their daughter Elizabeth married Samuel McLean ( spelled McClain in your files).....Samuel's grave also in the aforementioned cemetery.He was a descendant of the Clan MacLean (Scottish).

I have a fair amount of info from this point, if you are interested. I can also provide some photos from the cemetery. I would be much obliged to have a Family Tree Maker file of the Whitlock 16 chart. Is there any special instruction that I will need to integrate it into my files?

I had found that lengthy file on your website, (the word file) . It was of course very difficult to glean the info that pertained to me. I was hoping that there was an easier way for me to extract it.

I was able to retrieve a marriage record from LDS today on the Marriage of Elizabeth Whitlock and Samuel McLean.....03 Mar 1831; Butler County ,Ohio.

I may be able to get an actual copy of it here in town. I will let you know if I do.

I recently had a chance to look at a couple of Brand Whitlock's books, "Forty Years of It" and "Letters and Journal".....I was more in search of info on my direct line, but I was very much in awe of the story of his life and felt a genuine sense of pride to be related to such a great individual.

There are a few tidbits of reference info on the McLean's and the Whitlock's in some local library books.....History of Hamilton County Ohio, and I would be happy to send a copy. I also did a couple of retake photos of the graves of John and Lydia Whitlock this morning if those would be of interest.

I had recently found a bit of info on the Whitlocks ( back to Thomas) in the Compendium of American Genealogy. There were also some articles of interest that I recall from a PERSI search, but at that time I wasn't sure of the connection to the Gravesend reference. There seems to be a lot out there , but not enough time to run down all the leads!! I just feel very fortunate to have found you and your website!

Thanks for sending that Whitlock file! I REALLY appreciate it! I went back to the Family Tree Maker tutorial to learn how to do the download.....The trick seems to be in the merging of the files. I have not yet done that. I will probably contact William before doing that just to be safe.

I got a chance to get to the Butler County Records and Archives today and I retrieved the marriage record for Samuel McLean and Elizabeth Whitlock.

< Butler County;Probate Court; Marriage Record; Book #1;page 297;

" Married on the third day of March, 1831 by the Reverend John Thompson,Samuel McLean to Elizabeth Whitlock".

I also was able to get about 18 other various marriage records of McLeans(with spelling variations) and Whitlocks. They probably all don't pertain to our family, but I can sort them out later.
