I Googled "Pitton Wiltshire" and what a mine of information I found when your site came up! I am wondering if you could possibly help me by providing access to some of the documents in your Whitlock Family archive?

I am researching into family history as my family unit is the only continuation of both my husband's and my own family lines and we wanted to be able to provide our boys with some information on their ancestors before our parents all died. Now our parents (all in their late 70s) have become very interested as well! Particularly my father, who is Roderick Alan Whitlock Stevens, only son of Amy Eliza Whitlock (Salisbury) and Henry James Stevens (Wootton Bassett).

My grandmother Amy Eliza (subject, I believe, of a letter in your archive from Cousin Joan de Angeli 1059/1) was daughter of George Whitlock (of Salisbury) and Frances Sophia Hayter (of Whiteparish): George I believe to be the son of Thomas Whitlock (of Pitton) and Sarah Bradley (of Salisbury): this Thomas (I infer from the 1841 census) is the eldest son of another Thomas Whitlock (Pitton) and Lucy Hayden - beyond this I have not ventured.

I should very much like to be able to pin this last Thomas down and thereby put his line via George into the Whitlock framework (if they are not there already).
