Comment = Hello, I am descended from Sarah Ann Whitlock, daughter of Daniel Whitlock. This information is written in a published book. I have a copy of its page which I obtained from the Seymour, Ct. Library. The information was printed in the late 1800's by a Mr. W. C. Sharpe owner of the publishing company that printed it. He was a close friend of Titus Pearce/pierce of South Britain, Southbury, Ct. The book was published by record print, Seymour. Connecticut in 1898. Titus died before the book was printed.

Titus Pearce/Pierce was a keeper of records. Town Clerk of Southbury and also a Pearce Family Historian. Before he died he gave Mr. Sharpe the material he had and made Mr. Sharpe promise to write a book about the Pearce Family so they will know where they came from.

Hello Peter;

My name is Barbara A. Pierce Cypher. I have documents which I'd like to send to you if I may. One is from a published book which had been written and published in 1898. It was written by Mr. W. C. Sharpe owner of Record Print, Seymour, Connecticut. He was a close friend of Titus Pearce/Pierce who was a Town Clerk in Southbury, Ct. and a Pearce Family Historian. Titus never got to see the book in print as he died before it was finished but, he made Mr. Sharpe promise that he would print it. In the book on page 83 it says, Russell D. Pierce of South Britain, B. August 18, 1803; m. Sarah Ann Whitlock, dau. of Daniel Whitlock, b. April 1, 1811.

They also had another daughter Elizabeth who died very young.

Also:

In Genealogy.com there is information written on the Crofoot family. The descendents of Joseph Crofoot and they have listed Ephraim Whitlock m Ruth Crofoot. One of their children - Daniel C. Whitlock married Pollyann Crofoot and their children were: Sarah Ann b. April 1, 1811 and Huldah (Hildie). There are two sources that have said the same thing. I do not know the people that wrote this but, the information is the same name for Sarah and her father Daniel and the same birthdate for Sarah.

I also have a copy of where Daniel C. Whitlock sold land to Elisha Pearce on March 12, 1839. The land was located in Southbury, Ct. Sally Whitlock's name is also on the deed. This was witnessed by Adline Whitlock, Erastus Pearce for the signature of Sally Whitlock and Erastus Pearce and John G. Allen for the signing of Daniel C. Whitlock's signature.

Elisha then gave the land to Sarah and Russell's children on May 31, 1839. The land was located in Southbury, Ct. Marietta Hinman and David Hinman were witnesses to the transaction.

Like I said I do have these copies and I would be happy to send them to you. I spoke to the keeper of the Library in South Britain her name was Mary Perry. I don't know if she is still there or not but, I showed her the information which I had and she said that she believed that our Russell D. Pearce was indeed the second Russell Pearce born to Elisha Pearce and Rhoda Hinman.

In 1990 I worked as a CNA in Southbury, Ct. One of my cases was a Mr. Edwin Winship who'd had a CVA. In one of our conversations I told him my mother lived in Southbury when she was little. He asked me her name and I told him and he asked me her father's name and I said I didn't know as he died when she was very young. He asked me her mother's name and I told him. He said that his father was good friends with my gg grandfather Russell, and he also knew his father Elisha and Daniel and Sally Russell's wife's kin and my great Grandfather Henry Smith and he Mr. Winship knew my Grandfather David Smith and my Grandfather Daniel Russell Pierce and his father. I told him that I did not know any of them. He did say all of this but I wasn't interested at the time as I really didn't know my line until years later. Thank you for your time. Barbara.

I emailed (Moore) and told them this same information and I believe it was the 1860 Southbury Census two of the Whitlock children whom they were looking for were listed in the Census with Truman H. Pearce/Pierce listed as the head of the household and the two children and Sarah A. Pearce/Pierce and Eliza her daughter. This would make sense if Sarah A. Whitlock Pearce/Pierce were their half sister as they say these were the children of Daniel C. and Sally Whitlock. I believe the boy was Rusfort (?) not sure of the spelling and a girl who was his sister. That was a Census so again I had nothing to do with it.
