Peter, I'm putting the copy in the post to you. You may of course be right, but the details of the will do not appear to fit. This John Whitlock describes himself as a gentleman, seems to have had two daughters, leaves £10 to two grandchildren (surname Tribble) and nominates a son-in-law called John Narraway as executor. I suspect that he may be related to the family of Vicars of Langtree. He must have been important to have been placed on a map of local notables. I must see if the hotel will grant me a copy.

The road in Bideford is Honestone Road. It is still there and I have confirmed that my father's family, Tom and Bessie Whitlock, lived there at number 26, 1908-1914. Two brothers of my father were born there, Ernest in 1910 and Ronald in 1912-. At that time my great grandparents lived in a neighbouring street and my father's cousin, Charlie's daughter Barbara, who died only last Autumn, continued to live in an adjoining street, 25 Lime Grove. until her death. She was 98 and I understand that her death was the result of a hospital accident--I went to see her last August and took her some flowers.-
