Peter, I will set up my Skype account again, as my son in Korea wants to communicate as well.

I was looking at the latest newsletter and was pleased to see the marriage certificate for William R. Whitlock, son of Matthews and Emma, brother of my great-grandfather Robert Stocks Whitlock. I put "R." because his middle name has always been a bit of a mystery - it is spelled in the birth indexes as "Risdale" but there after most often spelled Ridsdale. I haven't had the chance to order his birth certificate to confirm the spelling, but I guess I will have to soon. I think these names must have come from prominent people in the community. For example, the mother of Emma Whitlock was Jane Edwards, hence Jane Edwards Whitlock, their second daughter. I have come across a Robert Stocks, and I believe this might be the origin of my gr.grandfather's name.

I printed off the marriage certificate and wondered about the description in the newsletter. The certificate itself says the "Parish of St. Nicholas", whereas the description says St. Mary's. I don't know how important any of this is, but thought I would note the discrepancy (if there is one!!). As you know, John Whitlock the vicar is buried at St. Mary's, as is his son. St. Nic's, the local reference to St. Nicholas, is a quaint little church and seems to have been the church of favour for the Matthew and Emma Whitlock family before they moved to Sneinton. It's such fun to have visited all these places.

Another date to add to my Whitlock line, daughter Kristina Marie Whitlock married Adam Thomas Fournier, 29 February 2012, in Cancun, Mexico.
