

(NO) **John Arnold Taylor Funeral at Wawota** (8)

The funeral service for Mr. John Arnold Taylor, aged 74 years, 10 months, who passed away after a brief illness in Redvers Union Hospital June 24th, was held in Wawota Free Methodist Church on Thursday, June 26th. Rev. M. Hammond, assisted by Rev. E. M. Childerhose, Weyburn officiated. Burial was in the Parkman Cemetery with Ruthven Funeral Home, Carlyle in charge.

Mr. Taylor was born September 2nd, 1894 at Richwood, Ont., and was known to his many friends as Jack. He was a long time resident of the Cannington, Service and Parkman districts, coming here with his parents from Ontario in 1911, he lived with them in the Historical 'Beckton Ranch' until his marriage to Miss Myrtle Cudmore, June 29th, 1921. They lived at Service and he bought grain for the Searle Grain Co. there for 29 years. He became interested in Bees, and until the day of his death he never lost that interest. He was a faithful member and supporter of his church. While at Service he served on the local Sturgeon School board for many years. He was respected and liked by all who knew him. He was interested and helped with all worthwhile community endeavors wherever he was.
