For Cornish artists
— Director of

AN IMPORTANT development of the activities of the Penwith Society of Arts is the establishment of printmaking studios above the main Back Road West Gallery in St. Ives. The studios are available to artists generally for the printing of etchings and silkscreen prints.

So far about 40 artists have made use of the modern facilities there, and their number is growing steadily. There are plans to increase the facilities, including photographic equipment for a new photography department. In Cornwall, only at Falmouth are similar facilities available to artists.

In charge of the studios is Mr. James F. Whitlock who has been lecturer in charge of fine print at Bradford College of Art and lecturer in art and education at Selly Oak College, Birmingham.

As they expand to take in adjoining studio space it is expected that the printmaking studios will be widely used by visiting artists. There is a membership subscription, and materials can be bought at the studios.

Christian influence

THE CURRENT one-man show of art at St. Ives Public Library is an exhibition of paintings, drawings and prints by James F. Whitlock, a member of the Penwith Society of Arts, who is directing the new print-making studios at the society's Back Road West Galleries in St. Ives.

Mr. Whitlock, a comparative newcomer to St. Ives, is 27. He has been lecturer-in-charge of fine print at Bradford College of Art and lecturer in art and education at Selly Oak College, Birmingham.

He holds the Diploma in Art and Design, with honours; and a distinction in the Art Teaching Diploma.

His faith as a Christian has a strong influence on his work.

He has just been accepted as a candidate for ordination in the Church of England and has been offered a place to read theology and religious studies at Christ's College, Cambridge. At present he is in charge of the Sunday school at St. John's-in-the-Fields Church, St. Ives.
