



Mrs Flynn, under blanket, and mother-in-law

Police move in as wife of shot bandit flies home

THE widow of one of the armed raiders shot dead by a police marksman in Thursday's abattoir ambush has been quizzed by detectives after returning to England.

Mrs Lesley Flynn, whose husband Michael was one of two men who died, was whisked away from Heathrow with a blanket over her head.

Her mother-in-law helped her into a police car after she touched down on a packed holiday flight from Cyprus.

Mrs Flynn flew to Cyprus on June 30. Last night she was reunited with three-year-old son Billy, who was being looked after by relatives.

Stunned

Neighbours in Bargery Road, Catford, South London, yesterday said they were stunned to find out that Flynn, 25, had been involved in the attempted raid.

The family of Nicholas Payne, also shot dead at the attempted wages

snatch at the south London slaughterhouse, are demanding a public inquiry into the killings.

Jobless Derek Whitelock, 24, of Samuel Street, Woolwich South-east London, will today appear in court charged with robbery and possessing firearms.

Whitelock, who has been undergoing emergency surgery after being shot in the spine during the ambush, is the second man to be charged.
