ISAAC WHITELOCK was a Quaker. He was born on Nov.12,1712 and he appears to have come to Lancaster between 1743 and 1745. In 1757, he owned a lot on the southwest corner of Orange and Duke Streets, running southward to Grant Street, and containing on Orange Street 64 feet 4 inches, and in depth by Duke Street 252 feet. He also owned at least two other lots situated on the north side of Orange Street, and in addition a lot on South Price Street, on which he built a brewery and a tannery. The latter is where the Stevens House now stands. He was Chief Burgess of the Borough in 1752, and Assistant Burgess in 1759 and 1760 and in 1765 and 1766. He also served as Treasurer of the Borough. He was one of the original members of the Union Fire Company, and when in 1754 the Quakers built their meeting house in Lancaster he

was one of the trustees. He contributed thereto the largest subscription, namely £100. Leaving Lancaster he went to live with some of his children in or near Wilmington, and here he died about 1784 or 1785. He was succeeded in the tannery business by his son, DANIEL.
