IN THE NAME OF GOD AMEN I JOHN WHITLOCK  
of the Parish of Langtree and County of Devon Yeoman do make and  
ordain this my last Will and Testament in the manner following  
namely I give and bequeath to my beloved wife Catherine the Higher  
Dwellinghouse of North Collacott with the Garden behind the same  
during her natural life and sufficient dung yearly to manure the  
same to be supplied by my hereinafter named Executor. I also give  
and bequeath unto my said Wife the run of a Pig One Bed performed  
and a thing of a sort of the domestic utensils (except the clock)  
I also give and bequeath to my said Wife One Hundred and fifty  
faggots of Wood and Furze to be delivered to her yearly and every  
year during her natural life out of my Estate of Lower Collacot.  
I also give and bequeath unto my said Wife all the Cash which may  
accrue on my death from the death club in the Church Village of  
this Parish and four shillings a week to be paid to her weekly  
and every week during her natural life by my hereinafter named  
Executor. I give and bequeath unto my Son John the Sum of Fifty  
Pounds to be paid by my hereinafter named Executor six months  
after my decease and the Sum of Seventy Pounds to be paid him by  
my said Executor three years after my decease. I give and bequeath  
unto my daughter Grace the above named Higher Dwelling House and  
Garden in North Collacott after the decease of my dear Wife during  
my said Daughter's natural life and no longer and after the decease  
of my dear Wife and Daughter the said house and garden shall revert  
to the Estate and to my Executor. I also give and bequeath to  
my Daughter Grace the Sum of Twenty Pounds to be paid to her by  
my Executor two years after my decease. I give and bequeath to  
my daughter Mary the Sum of Seventy Pounds to be paid to her by

my Executor one year after my decease and also one bed performed to be selected by my dear Wife. I give and bequeath to my Daughter Catherine the sum of One Hundred Pounds to be paid to her by my Executor One year after my decease and also one bed performed to be selected by my dear Wife. I give and bequeath to my Daughter Pricilla the Sum of Fifty Pounds to be paid to her by my Executor one year after my decease. I give and bequeath to my Son William the Sum of One Hundred and Fifty Pounds to be paid to him by my Executor One year after my decease. I give and bequeath unto my daughter Dorcas the Sum of Seventy Pounds to be paid to her by my Executor one year after my decease. I further ordain and appoint that the aforesaid Sums bequeathed shall be paid out of my Estates of North Collacott and Lower Collacott. Lastly I give and bequeath unto my Son George all my Freehold Estates of North Collacott and Lower Collacott in the above named Parish except what is above bequeathed and except the Chapel School room and burying ground usually called Siloam. I also give and bequeath to my Son George all my Goods, Chattels and Credits whatsoever and also appoint and ordain him the Sole Executor of this my last Will and Testament. In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my Hand and Seal this Fifteenth day of April in the year of our Lord One Thousand eight hundred and forty eight.

Signed sealed delivered and attested in the presence of us who in Testator's presence and in the presence of each other do set our names as Witnesses thereof.
