

THIS IS THE LAST WILL AND TESTAMENT OF ME SUSANNA SMALE of the Parish of Frith-
-elstock in the County of Devon Spinster who seriously considering the shortness
and uncertainty of human life do while in a sound state of mind memory and
understanding give and dispose of my worldly estate goods chattels and effects
as follows. I give and bequeath unto my niece Susanna Clark the daughter of my
late brother John Smale the sum of Eighty pounds sterling. To my niece Rebecca
Netherway daughter of the said John Smale the sum of Eighty pounds sterling
and the looking glass in the Kitchen Chamber; To Richard Smale son of the said
Rebecca Netherway the sum of Ten pounds sterling; To my niece Sarah Saunders
daughter of the said John Smale the sum of Eighty pounds sterling and my silver
Sugar tongs; To my niece Catherine Keill daughter of the said John Smale the
sum of Twenty pounds sterling also my large bible; To my niece Dorcas Smale
daughter of the said John Smale the sum of Eighty pounds sterling and my
Copper Tea Kettle; To my nephew Thomas Smale son of the said John Smale the
sum of Eighty pounds sterling and one Silver Table Spoon; I give and bequeath
unto my Brother William Smale of Frithelstock aforesaid Yeoman the sum of One
hundred Pounds sterling and my armed chair and a Silver Cream Jug, I also
give unto my said Brother William Smale All my term and interest in All my
Messuage and Tenement called Townsends situate in the Parish of Frithelstock
aforesaid; I also give and bequeath unto Susanna Smale the wife of the said
William Smale the sum of Sixty pounds sterling also my brown silk gown and
shawl; I also give and bequeath unto my niece Rebecca Copp the Daughter of the
said William Smale the sum of Eighty pounds sterling and my silver cream ladle;
To my niece Sarah Smale the Daughter of the said William Smale the sum of
Eighty pounds sterling and the Bed in the Parlour Chamber with the Bedframe
Furniture Bolsters Quilts and all other things thereunto belonging and also a
Bread basket; To my nephew Frederick Smale son of the said William Smale the
sum of Eighty pounds sterling and two brass Candlesticks; To my nephew Caleb
Smale Son of the said William Smale the sum of Eighty pounds sterling and also
the Pestle and Mortar and one Silver Table Spoon marked S.S.; To my nephew
William Smale son of the said William Smale the sum of Eighty pounds sterling
and also six silver tea spoons marked W.S.; To my nephew John Smale son of the
said William Smale the sum of Seventy pounds sterling also my Watch and Gun;
I give and bequeath unto my Sister Rebecca Fursman of Frithelstock aforesaid
Widow the sum of Two hundred pounds sterling to be paid to her at the expiration
of six calendar months next after my decease and if she should happen to die
in my lifetime the said legacy of Two hundred pounds to be equally divided
among all her children; I also give unto my said Sister Rebecca Fursman the
small table in the Kitchen and six silver Tea spoons; I also give and bequeath
unto my niece Catherine Fursman the Daughter of the said Rebecca Fursman the
sum of Ninety pounds sterling also a silver cream jug and two silver Tea spoons
that were my Mothers and a Coffee pot; To my niece Rebecca Fursman Daughter
of the said Rebecca Fursman I give the sum of One hundred and Eighty Pounds
sterling and also all the Furniture in the Back Kitchen and in the room above
also a metal Tea pot one silver Table spoon and two Tea Trays usually kept in
the Kitchen; To my niece Harriet Fursman the Daughter of the said Rebecca Furs-
-man the sum of Eighty pounds sterling and also a silver table spoon; To my
niece Charity Fursman the Daughter of the said Rebecca Fursman the sum of
Ninety pounds sterling and a set of small pattern china and a large wood tray;
To my nephew John Fursman son of the said Rebecca Fursman the sum of Eighty
pounds sterling also the Bed frame with the Bed tye and Bedclothes thereunto
belonging now being in the Slee Chamber and the Bureau in the room in which
I usually sleep; To my nephew Joseph Fursman son of the said Rebecca Fursman
the sum of Eighty ponds sterling also one Glothes Chest five Kitchen Chairs
and the small circular Table in the parlour; I give and bequeath unto my
Brotherinlaw George How Hackwell of Langtree in the said County of Devon Yeoman
the sum of Fifty pounds sterling and to George How Hackwell the younger the

son of the first named George How Hackwell I give the sum of Eighty pounds sterling and a Clock and Case; I give and bequeath unto my Brother in law Thomas Copp of Horwood in the said County Yeoman the sum of Eighty pounds sterling; I give and bequeath unto my niece Betsey Penheale the Daughter of the said Thomas Copp the sum of Eighty pounds sterling also the two bowed silver cup and the Tent bed bedstead bedclothes and all things thereunto belonging and also a plated stand; To my niece Mary Copp Daughter of the said Thomas Copp the sum of Eighty pounds sterling also my work table and the small tea chest; To my Niece Caroline Copp Daughter of the said Thomas Copp the sum of Eighty pounds sterling also my Marseills Quilt and the work Box that belonged to her Sister Susanna deceased; To my nephew George Copp son of the said Thomas Copp the sum of Eighty pounds sterling and the Dining Table in the Parlour; To my Nephew Thomas Copp son of my said Brother in law Thomas Copp the sum of Eighty pounds sterling also one silver table spoon and the six best chairs; To my Nephew Henry Copp son of my said Brother in law Thomas Copp the sum of Eighty pounds sterling and five hair bottomed chairs; To my Nephew William Copp son of my said Brother in law Thomas Copp the sum of Eighty pounds sterling also the Flour Hutch and Dresser; I give and bequeath unto my cousin Rebecca Bear of Frithelstock aforesaid Spinster the sum of Ten pounds sterling; I give and bequeath unto my two sisters Sarah Copp and Rebecca Fursman and to my Nieces Betsey Penheale and Rebecca Fursman all my Clothes of every Description (except what is herein given to my Sister in law Susanna Smale) to be equally divided between them each of them taking one fourth part; I give and bequeath unto Susanna Whitlock the Wife of John Whitlock of Langtree aforesaid the sum of Eighty pounds sterling also my best Quilt and the drop leaf tabl in the Kitchen; I also give and bequeath unto Sarah Norman of Frithelstock aforesaid Widow the sum of Ten pounds sterling and to George Peard also of Frithelstock aforesaid the like sum of Ten pounds sterling; And I hereby direct and declare my Will to be that all the Legacies above mentioned (except the Legacy given to my Sister Rebecca Fursman) shall be paid by my Executrix herein after named at the expiration of twelve calendar months next after my decease; I give and bequeath all my books equally among all my nephews and nieces; All the rest residue and remainder of my Estate Goods Chattels and Effects whatsoever and wheresoever of which I may be possessed or to which I may be entitled at the time of my decease subject to the payment of my just debts funeral expenses and the expense of proving this my Will I give and bequeath unto my said Sister Sarah Copp the Wife of the said Thomas Copp And I hereby appoint the said Sarah Copp sole EXECUTRIX and residuary devisee and legatee of this my Will And I hereby revoke all other Wills by me at any time hereto fore made and do declare that this and the three preceding sheets contain the whole of my Will; In Witness whereof I have to the First Second and Third sheets hereof set my hand and to the first sheet hereof at the place of annexation and also at the conclusion of this fourth and last sheet hereof set my hand and affixed my seal this twenty eighth day of March in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and fifty four SUSANNA SMALE.
