Fined £1.5.10 and costs. In default of payment to be imprisoned in the house of correction at Fisherton Anger for 6 weeks.

George Whitlock, Pitton and Farley, labourer, convicted of using a gun to kill game at Pitton and Farley on the 4th December, instant. Fined £5 and costs. In default to be imprisoned at the House of Correction at Fisherton Anger for 3 calendar months.
- 1851 ^{Misc} Tuesday, 20th May, 1851.
George Whitlock, of Pitton and Farley, labourer, convicted of knowingly having in his possession and control eight pheasants eggs at the parish of Pitton and Farley on the 18th day of May, instant. Fined 5/- for each egg, together 40/-. In default of payment to be imprisoned in the House of Correction at Fisherton Anger for one calendar month.
Received June 6th, 1851. One pound moiety of penalty imposed on the above named George Whitlock

- 1853 ^{WJA-10} Tuesday, December 6th, 1853.
James Whitlock of Pitton, labourer, convicted of being the driver but not the owner of a Waggon and two horses proceeding on the Turnpike Road at Milford on the first of December instant, and thereon having no other person to guide the horses. Fined £1 and costs. In default of payment to be imprisoned in the House of Correction at Fisherton Anger for 21 days. Paid.
