This Indenture made this twenty-seventh of December in the year of our Lord One Thousand seven hundred and seventy seven Between Thomas Whitlock of Halifax County of the one part and Benj.<sup>m</sup> Jordan of Lunenburg County of the other part Witnesseth that the said Thomas Whitlock hath for and in consideration of the full and just Sum of Three Hundred pounds current money of Virginia to him in hand paid by the said Benj.<sup>m</sup> Jordan the receipt whereof he hath paid Thomas Whitlock DOTH hereby acknowledge hath given, granted, bargained and sold to the said Ben. Jordan one certain Tract or parcel of Land situate lying and being in the County of Halifax containing Two hundred and fifty three acres be the same more or less on both sides of Mirey Creek and bounded as follows Viz. beginning at a corner Gum with <sup>1777</sup> Colquit <sup>and William Hamblett</sup> and William Hamblett, thence along his line to a corner with Patrick Hightower, thence along his line to a corner with Tho.<sup>s</sup> Davenport, thence along his line to a corner gum at the beginning To Have and To Hold the above sold Lands and premises with all the appertenances thereunto belonging or in any wise appertaining unto him the said Benj. Jordan His Heirs & assigns forever against him the said Thomas Whitlock his Heirs & forever To Have hold use occupy possess and enjoy the same with every part and parcell thereof unto him the said Benj. Jordan his Heirs &c. against him the said Thomas Whitlock his heirs &c and against the claim and demand of any other person or persons shall and will by these presents warrant and forever defend In Witness whereof he the said Thomas Whitlock hath hereunto set his hand and affixed his seal the day and year above written.
